Israel is condemned by U.N.

The United Nations Security Council has condemned Israel for violating the U.N. charter and the Middle East ceasefire by its attack on Jordan last Thursday.

While condemning Israel, however, the Council makes clear that it deplores the events which Israel put forward to justify its operations against Jordan.

Israel and nearly all the Western powers on the Council interpret this as meaning that it condemns the U.N. Force commands and sabotage raids launched from Israel in Jordan against Israel.

The condemnation, which came after long and difficult negotiations between Council members, includes a threat of great sternness against Israel, should the report be accepted. The Council's resolution, said that it was "the best that could be expected in the circumstances".

It also confirmed that Israel deprived the rights to act in Jordan continued "aiding terrorism".

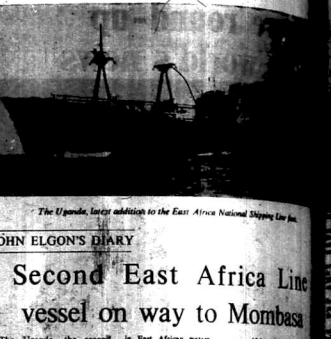

The Vice-President and Minister for Health Affairs, Mr. Mwa, has asked the Minister for Foreign Affairs to request for suitable diplomatic protection with the Chinese Government about the conduct of the crew of the Chinese ship which killed last month.

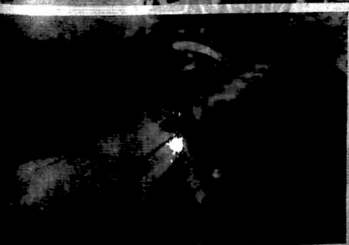
