Proposals on police may be omitted

MR. MAUDING has called the leaders of the Colonial Office today.

But Colonial Office observers do not rule out the possibility that the police proposal might be omitted by the time signatures are called for. No immediate response is expected at today's meeting with the leaders.

No one expects 10 per cent signatures. Two Members have already left London — Mr. R. C. Aldridge (Mombasa Trade) and Mr. Clive Satter (Nairobi West). Others have hinted that they will not sign.

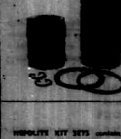

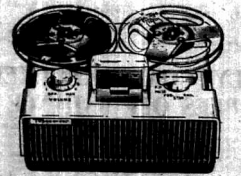

Radioes report air force strafing

DAMASCUS Radio last night quoted the Army's High Command as saying that law and order had been restored in Aleppo, Centre of a rebel movement in North Syria, and that conditions there had returned to normal.

The broadcast climaxed a day of confusion in which President Nasser of the United Arab Republic offered to mediate and Aleppo Radio alleged that the Syrian Air Force had strafed civilians and bombed rebel officers' strongholds in the Aleppo region.

The Damascus Radio, based in London, said in an Arabic broadcast which was relayed to get news back to the barracks and that the Army High Command had banned the movement of persons in 15 miles between cities and towns from three until further notice.

President Nasser was variously described by London as having been invited to get involved in Syrian affairs, Syria officials had been invited to the United Arab Republic as a mediator in the Syrian civil war.

Some reports indicated that the Syrian Air Force had strafed civilians and bombed rebel officers' strongholds in the Aleppo region.

Ten killed in O.A.S. raid on clinic

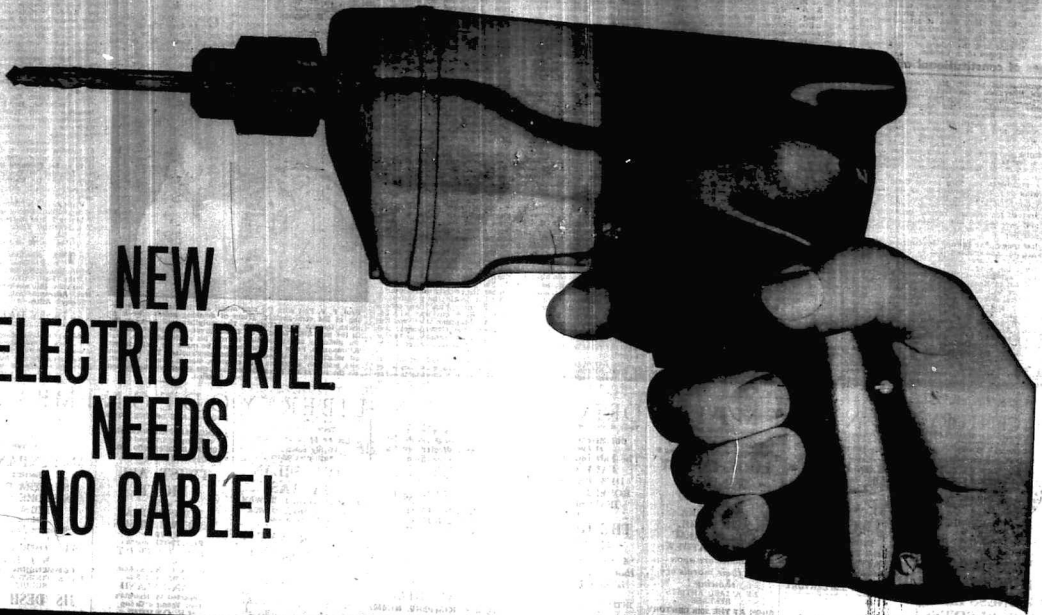

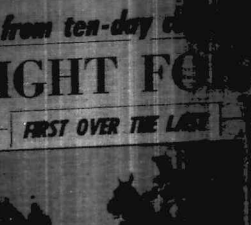

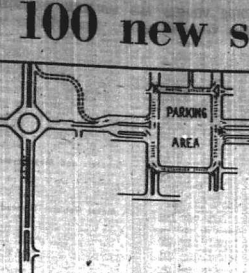

HIMES NOT EMPTY

MEMBERS TOLD

THE Postmaster-General, Mr. H. O. Ellis, has refuted union charges that European and Asiatic-type houses belonging to his administration had remained locked and vacant for a number of years.

He was addressing the final session at the weekend of the seventh annual conference of the Posts and Telecommunications African Workers' Union (Kenya) in Nairobi. The union's president, Mr. J. Ngunjiri, in his speech, suggested the administration was keeping these houses vacant until the leases expired or 'maybe until the last expatriate officer's exodus'.

He alleged that in many cases subtenant employees were not considered at all for allocation of office houses.

Mr. Ellis said there were no vacancies of houses for the African-type houses apart from those occupied by subtenants as people went on leave. He said he accepted that certain European-type houses were empty at present, but he said a number of them would be occupied by expatriate officers being recruited in British colonies where the area of the individual and not the employer.

Kenya's work force falls by 5 p.c. in a year

Between June, 1960 and June, 1961 the total labour force in Kenya fell by five per cent from 225,000 to 213,000, according to a 1961 enumeration of employees released by the Economics and Statistics Division of the Treasury.

In the private sector the fall was as much as eight per cent, for in the public sector employment rose three per cent from 161,000 to over 164,000.

The rise was apparent in all branches of the public service except East African Railways and Harbours.

Employment in agriculture and fisheries fell by seven per cent to 232,000 in 1961 from 250,000 in 1960. In the manufacturing sector, employment fell by 10 per cent to 22,000 in 1961 from 24,000 in 1960.

The estimated total wage bill for 1961 was £23,000,000 higher than in the previous year. This increase occurred in the public service and in largely unskilled and semi-skilled work.

The recorded decrease in this latter industry group is however overstated by the revaluation of some small firms, particularly those in the rubber, tin and tobacco and retail trade.

Employment in wholesale and retail trade rose by 12 per cent but these two sectors taken together showed a fall of seven per cent.

The fall of 13 per cent in the building and construction industry was perhaps smaller than might have been expected in view of the virtual cessation of private building but at least under 18,000 employees in this industry was still at work at the end of 1961.

The position in the transport industry changed little between 1960 and 1961, small falls in road and water transport being offset by a rise in air transport. Within the railway services group, employment fell by 10 per cent to 22,000 in 1961 from 24,000 in 1960.
