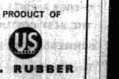

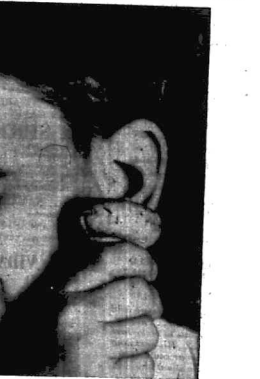

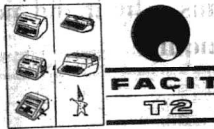

U.N. SPENDING RECORD £4m. ON AFRICA

More projects launched in new African States

THE United Nations spent a record \$12,100,000 (about £4,033,000) on technical assistance to the developing countries during 1961, 20 per cent more than in the previous year—will most likely increase going to newly-independent African States.

According to an annual report published in United Nations, New York yesterday, the total included \$3,500,000 (about £1,160,000) spent under the regular U.N. budget, plus programme financed from the 1961 and 36,500,000 regional \$2,200,000 (£710,000) technical assistance financed by voluntary contributions.

OIL COMPANY PLANS MOTEL NETWORK

AGIP Ltd, the Italian oil firm which is a member of the ENI Group, plans to set up a network of motels, restaurants with petrol stations, stretching from Mozambique to the Congo and under the leadership of Agostino M. di Pulia. The plan for the construction of 20 motels and Agip petrol stations will be carried out in West Africa.

The work started in Kampala by the local oil company. The first motel and petrol station were opened in Gambia in West Africa.

The firm is organising special courses in Italy for African petroleum engineers. Courses in commercial and technical subjects are being held in Italy—right from Uganda and the rest of the continent.

Agip had secured a grant from the United Nations for the study of this work.

Asked about suggestions that

AGIP would be selling kerosene in West Africa, he said the ENI Group had entered into an agreement to import 12,200,000 tons of crude oil from these areas over a period of five years. The total value of the agreement would be \$400 million.

At the time of Agip's announcement, the ENI Group had no shares in West Africa.

He stated that Agip would be "financing" a number of projects in West Africa, including the construction of roads, bridges, and other infrastructure.

The Government is considering measures to curb private transport in order to improve public services and reduce congestion.

Proposed measures include increased taxation on private vehicles and incentives for public transport users.

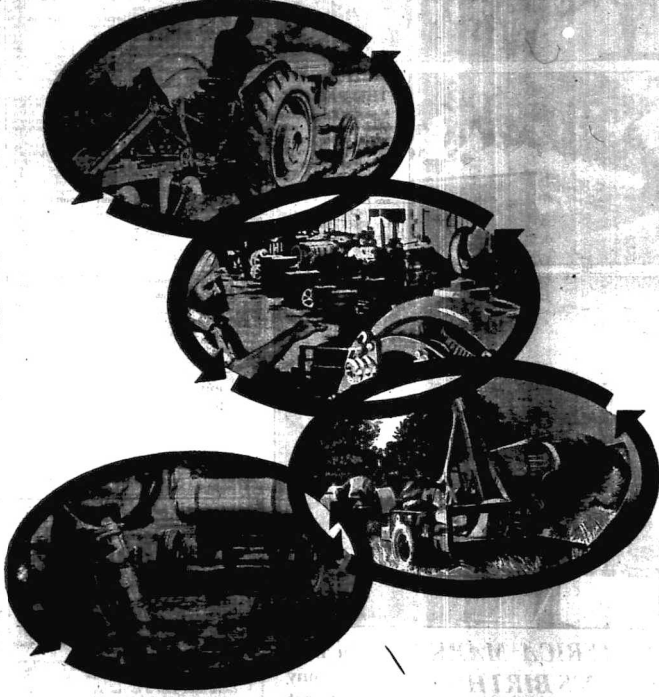

THE U.S. yesterday failed in its first attempt to explode a high altitude nuclear device over Johnston Island in the Pacific.

The rocket was launched from the Vandenberg Air Force Base, Calif., at 11:30 a.m. on May 17.

The mission was to test the Thor rocket's ability to carry a nuclear warhead to an altitude of 100,000 feet.

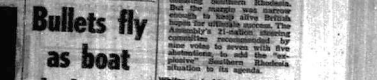

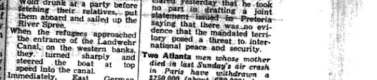

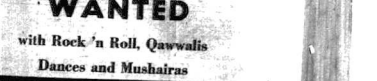
