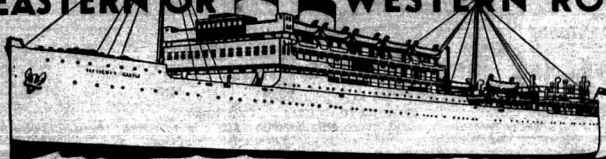

# Private Negotiations

(By WIRELESS)  
Rugby, September 13.  
The question of the entry of Russia into the League of Nations was raised in the public Assembly on September 12th. Mr. De Valera, after the vote of the League of Nations, expressed his regret that the Government of Soviet Russia, which he would support, was not in a position to take any steps to secure religious freedom. He would be happy however, if he could see the Government in this connection as well as to the United States on religious disabilities. The day had gone by when an Government could not continue to deny its people their religious freedom.

# Newspaper Comment

The newspapers, commenting on the speech, point out that owing to the wording of the Covenant, the Government need merely a two-thirds majority of the League members if the procedure adopted by Mr. De Valera were followed. It is pointed out that the United Kingdom delegation at Geneva is divided in a sentence that says "and that as the present procedure seemed best for the League, the introduction of Russia to the League Committee at this stage would be to the advantage of the League."—Official Wireless Service.

# The British Board of Film Censorship

## TWENTY-THREE FILMS REJECTED LAST YEAR

### And Five Hundred Amended

#### HEADINGS UNDER WHICH REJECTIONS ARE MADE BY THE PRESIDENT

In view of the interest aroused in East Africa during the past few months on the subject of Film Censorship, the following are given below from the annual Report of the British Board of Film Censors.

During the year under review the Board took exception to over five hundred films, the figure constituting a record, nevertheless the Board was able to show that this was not due to any falling off in the character of the film examined. In most cases slight alterations only were necessary.

Films rejected completely by the Board totaled twenty-three, comprising a footage of about 100,000, out of a total of nearly five and a half million feet examined. Though it was not possible in the Report to give fully the reasons for the rejection of these films, a rough idea may be gained by studying the various heads under which the rejections were made.

### Co-operation with Producers

The Report for the year ended December 31, 1925, of the British Board of Film Censors commences with a list of Producers who submitted films for censorship. Following these names the Report gives a list of films which were viewed and certified as suitable for exhibition in 1925, and a list of films which were not certified as suitable for exhibition in 1925, and a list of films which were amended before being certified as suitable for exhibition in 1925. As stated above, 23 films have been totally rejected by the President, being, in his opinion, inadvisable for exhibition in this country. Physiological arguments treated to, frankly for public exhibition, and offensive to the public mind and sensibilities, coupled with pronounced immorality. Bestiality. ### Exception

Exception has been taken by the Examiners, the Report contains a list of 504 films, which have been, however, satisfactory to the Examiners, but which as so many as 100 were not certified as suitable for exhibition in this country. 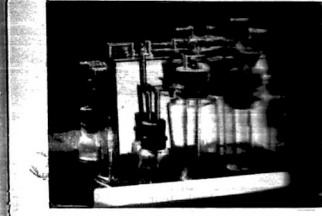

### Annual Report for 1953

#### RAPID INCREASE IN EXPORTS DURING PAST THREE YEARS

An interesting and comprehensive survey of the development of the Uganda gold industry is contained in the annual report for last year of the Geological Survey Department. The first discovery of gold as a consequence in the Protectorate territory to have been made in Bunyoro in 1919 by Mr. F. J. Wayland, Director of the Department.

From 1931 to 1951 no gold was exported from Uganda but that year 21 ounces were produced. In the following year the exports included 253 ounces and last year 1,261 ounces. This year is expected to show a big increase on these figures. The total value of gold exported from Uganda including 1951 to the end of 1953 was over £11,000.

#### Eighty Positive Assays Made

The first discovery of gold in the Protectorate territory was made in Bunyoro in 1919 by Mr. F. J. Wayland, Director of the Department. The gold was found in a small stream in the Bunyoro District. In 1921 the first export of gold from Uganda was made. The total value of gold exported from Uganda including 1951 to the end of 1953 was over £11,000.

#### RAPID INCREASE IN EXPORTS DURING PAST THREE YEARS

An interesting and comprehensive survey of the development of the Uganda gold industry is contained in the annual report for last year of the Uganda Geological Survey Department. The first discovery of gold of any consequence in the Protectorate appears to have been made in Bunyoro in 1919 by Mr. E. J. Wayland, Director of the Department.

Prior to 1931 no gold was exported from Uganda, but in that year 71 ounces were produced. In the following year the exports included 285 ounces, and last year 1,291 ounces. This year is expected to show a big increase on these figures. The total value of gold exported from and including 1931 to the end of 1933 was over \$11,000.

#### Eighty Positive Assays Made

The first discovery of gold in Uganda seeming to have been made in Bunyoro in 1919 by Mr. E. J. Wayland, Director of the Department. It did, however, disclose important factors in the distribution and derivation of the Rift gorges, which have been of value in kind when prospecting for alluvial in most parts of the Protectorate.

#### Annual Report

These facts are contained in the annual report and bulletin of the Uganda Geological Survey Department for 1933. Whatever may have been the rate of the Bunyoro veins, the report goes on, there could be no doubt that the finds which persuaded prospectors to search for gold in several parts of Uganda were those of Dr. Devies in Usukuma, Eastern Province, and Mr. Combe in Ankole, Western Province. Early in 1933, Mr. Combe found high values in an alluvial deposit in Kibwaha, north-west Ankole, and an area of about 47 square miles covered by the alluvial deposit was prospecting pending further examination of the 1933.

#### Positive Assays

Eighty positive gold assays, or estimations, and so on, were made by the Geological Survey in 1933, of these 40 were of samples collected by officers of the Department. 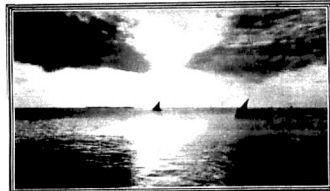

# THE FARMERS' TOOLS

## Wide Soil Variations

### PRODUCING A TILTH

The following article by Mr. R. N. Dowling appeared in a recent issue of the "Farmer and Stockbreeder."

Although the article deals primarily with conditions in Great Britain, the main principles involved are equally applicable to Kenya Colony.

In lean years it is of added importance that farmers should use their implements efficiently—the fruit of long experience, and cannot be learned by reading text books.

In fact, the efficient use of farm implements provides a wide field of discussion, and the Agricultural Editor would welcome any letters from farmers dealing with this and relevant subjects. "Pooled" knowledge is invaluable in

particular sugar-beet, is that of drilling seed to great a depth, as near 3 to 4 in. an ideal, consistent with the seed being properly covered. It is possible to sit at a desk and write a long article on the subject, but it is only by actual experience that the farmer can learn the value of a particular implement. There is a definite difference between the straight action of the drag and that of the curved fluted cultivator. The former has a pulverising action, the latter a tearing up way through the soil, moving quantities of soil downwards rather than in a lifting action, as with curved-tined implements. In the case of a breaking-down action, the straight tines tend to produce a consolidated condition below the surface.

In proportion to the degree of soil variation, the use of lifting power is increased, and the use of a wheel tractor with a lifting wheel inclined time works rubbish up to the surface and then the straight line. Where there is still a lot of work to do on light soil, the ploughing and lifting of the soil, and the use of a roller, are the best methods. The gathered weeds, in a valuable implement. Therefore, although general principles hold good, practical knowledge of local conditions is naturally a great help.

Cleaning operations after harvest are generally beneficial, and a lot of rubbish can be cleaned out before the deep winter ploughing. It is generally agreed that a deeper ploughing this year would be carried out in the spring during the rotation. The depth adopted, I think, is as much as soil conditions allow. I have mentioned that crop production through the market depends by this deep ploughing. It prevents the formation of a hard pan—especially where the plants abhor like poison—and brings a greater area into better soil conditions.

On the lighter soils it is often an advantage to plough in the winter. Care has to be exercised on the heavier types of soils, as a great deal of water is lost, and replaced by a noble supply of water when the land dries out, and the soil is so hard that the layers have been completed for next year, it should be ploughed through the soil, so that the soil is not so hard.

The deeper plough, with its narrow board, is an excellent implement when the soil can be broken up in a heavy, consistent manner, and particularly where a fair amount of labour is available. Another cause of partial or total failure among root crops, and in family flocks result in poor work.

# JAPANESE COMPETITION

## Study of Labour Conditions

### CURRENCY DEPRECIATION

There has recently been a considerable output in certain of the Dominions and Colonies, and more especially in Lancashire, against the intense competition created by the sale of cheap Japanese goods.

Few people realise that Japan imports more than she exports, and the following extract from an article which appeared in a recent issue of the "Japanese Sunday Times" is of interest. It is a study of the Japanese side light on one of the most vexed questions of the day.

The balance of trade between Australia and Japan continues to be heavily in favour of the former country, because during the first nine months of the 1933-34 financial year Australia exported to Japan valued at upwards of £10,000,000, and in exchange goods from Japan valued at less than £3,000,000. Japan exports more than she imports, and the official figures show that in the first half of the current year Japanese imports were valued at 1,158 million yen, while her exports were valued at 1,000 million yen.

An intense selling campaign abroad was very effectively organised, but the principal factor, which transformed the whole character of Japanese competition, was the depreciation of the yen, which reduced its purchasing power in relation to its principal competitors. Signs are not lacking, however, that the final result will be to the disadvantage of the Japanese.

According to Sir Harry M. Brown, chairman and managing director of Imperial Industries, Limited, who recently studied Japanese manufacturing conditions on the spot, there has been much loose talk that long hours and low wages in Japan are the cause of their success, that the Japanese work 16 hours a day, and that they are paid 100 per cent more than we are. 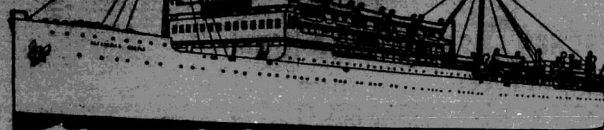

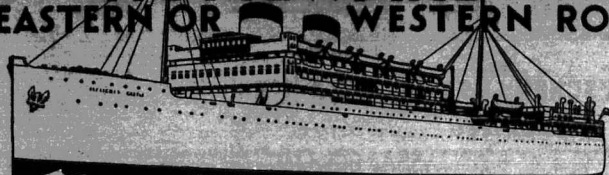

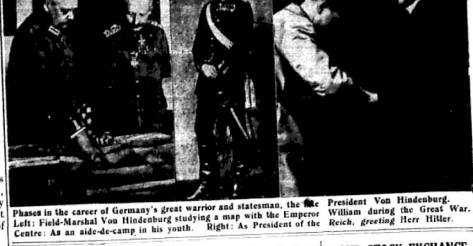

Alterations to the Rules

Question of Off-side

An Important Change Effected

(BULLY-OFF) According to the constitution of the local Association the rules of the game are as laid down by the Hockey Association in Great Britain, so it has been decided to publish the alterations with interpretations, together with rules which may cause trouble both to umpires and players to the following:—

Rule 50 Para (b). When striking at the ball, no part of the stick shall be raised above the shoulder, either at the beginning or at the end, of a stroke. This was as follows:—

Rule 12 (a) No player can in any circumstances be off-side when in his own half of the ground.

(b) Subject to para. (c), at the moment when the ball is hit or rolled in, any other player of the same side as the striker or roller, in, in an off-side position unless:—

(c) There be at least three other opponents nearer to their own goal line, or

(d) The striker or roller, be nearer to the opponents' goal-line.

(e) A player who is in an off-side position shall not be penalised for off-side unless, in the opinion of the umpire, he is, by his position, gaining some advantage on influencing the play of an opponent.

(f) A player who is in an off-side position shall not be put on-side by reason of the ball having touched or glanced off the stick of a person of an opponent.

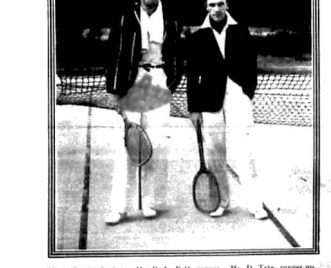

The duel was by far the most thrilling that has ever taken place in this race. Outstanding among the many fine performances was that of the privately owned 34-hp Bentley, entered and driven by E. R. Hall. As he led the race, as indeed he had from the very beginning, at the wonderful average speed of 83.64 m.p.h.

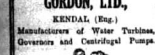

## LUBRICATION OF FARM

### MACHINERY

ESSENTIAL TO EFFICIENCY

SPEND CARE NOT MONEY

The ordinary Native farm labourer is not noted for his care of farm implements. In any difficulty of adjustment his method is, nine times out of ten, brute force! In consequence farm machinery is called upon to withstand a greater variety of strains and stresses in Africa, than in countries where farm labour possesses a higher degree of intelligence.

Therefore the proper lubrication of farm machinery assumes an added importance and the following article by Mr. J. H. M. Spencer, which originally appeared in the Johannesburg "Sunday Times" Farmer's Supplement is of particular interest to farmers in Kenya.

The lubrication of farm implements is a matter which often receives too little attention, not only from the user but from the mechanic. Except for high-speed machinery—tractors, engines, centrifugal pumps, disintegrators, etc.—the lubrication arrangements of most implements are primitive.

Even with high-speed machinery there is usually no special provision for the winter's drought, for when running hot water after it was purchased, there and more grease was put in the bearings because hot and hot water is generally a good idea. But the trouble was due to the artist, in his ignorance overlooking the bearings, with the result that the burning of the grease generated in the bearings was not frequent lubrication rather than a high-class grease is required, the oil which is used for such a purpose is not so good for the bearings.

### When In Breeding Days

A bull will of necessity be around five years old before his first lot of calves come into profit. The best part of another year must elapse before judgment can be passed on the milking capacity of the heifer. But, unfortunately, before such evidence is available most dairy bulls have come to the butcher. Only one of a very few valuable sires become diseased. Usually their value has been called because they became ill, and they are not available to breed. Another reason for not carrying a bull is that his daughters in the Register are not good enough, and many farmers prefer a change in the season.

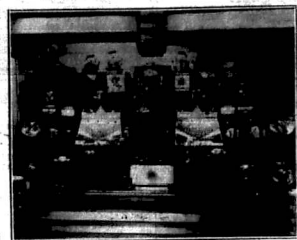

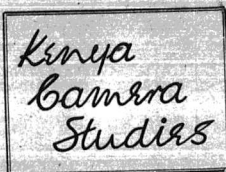
