



Sen. KENNEDY FIGHTS FOR LIFE

Brain surgery after shooting

Senator Robert Kennedy was fighting for his life in Los Angeles last night after an operation lasting three hours in which surgeons removed a bullet from his brain. His condition was stated to be "extremely critical".

Minutes after celebrating his victory in the California primary election before cheering supporters in a Los Angeles hotel, a young man sprang right behind him from a 222 pipe at Sen. Kennedy. One bullet struck and another struck him in the shoulder. Five people were wounded.

Police seized a suspect and later changed him with arrested suspect. The Federal Bureau of Investigation was called in and Frank Johnson (underground round-neck) provided for all Presidential candidates and their families.

Senator Kennedy's aide, Mr. Frank Manweiler, said later that the next 12 to 36 hours would be a very critical period and on fragments of the bullet was still Mr. Kennedy's head. A further operation was likely.

World leaders sent messages to his Kennedy's family expressing their shock at the assassination attempt and Pope Paul called for prayer for the Senator's recovery.

India to let in Kenya Asians

The Indian Government has decided to grant temporary entry visas to about 1,400 Asians who have to leave Kenya this month, officials said yesterday.

It is also working on a long-term plan to allow Asians who hold Indian passports but were in India after being turned out of Kenya to return to their homes in India.

The new policy, reported to go into force in about a week, will continue to operate under the visa system established in 1952 when the British brought in controls on entry of Asians with British passports.

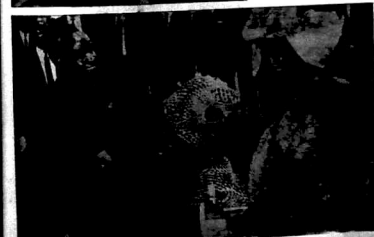

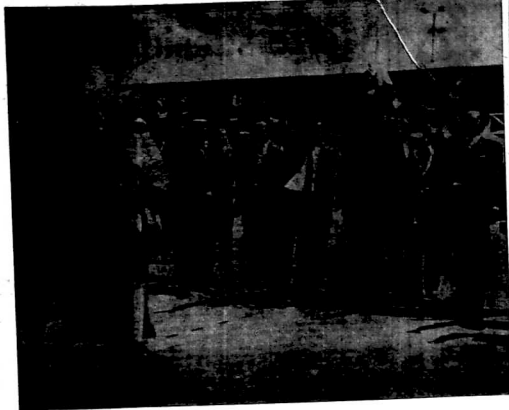

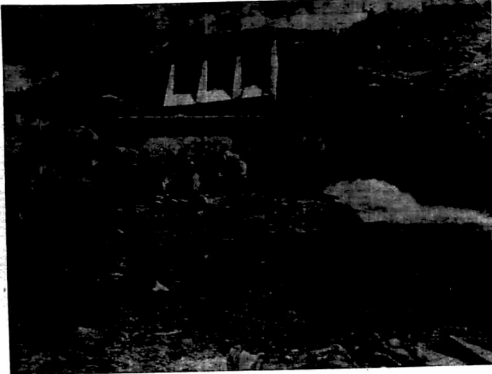

30 Vietcong survivors surrender in Saigon

A group of 30 survivors of two Vietcong battalions, which held out in the past ten days in the Cholon Channel Quarter of Saigon, surrendered to South Vietnamese Government.

NEW POLICE CHIEF

Gen Nguyen Ngoc Loan, who is still in hospital after being injured during the Vietnam's abortive offensive against Saigon in the beginning of May, was today designated as South Vietnam's police chief.

Mr. Loan, who was present in the world press conference which was held during the Viet offensive in Saigon last week, was reportedly replaced by Rangers' commander Col. Tran Van Hiep. The general, who was promoted to his new post on June 4, had been an adviser to the South Vietnamese government in the United States and South Vietnam during the past few years.

The government affirmed that 14 soldiers reported to be Communist strikers during incidents caused by U.S. and South Vietnamese forces on May 1, May 3 and May 4.

Vietnamese Government Rangers yesterday morning.

The Vietcong force of whom were aged 12 and 18, were members of the 20th and 30th battalions of the 27th Vietcong Regiment, from Tay Dinh Province, 20 miles south of Saigon.

They reached Cholon on May 29, the second day of their march. They were told to stay in the "camp" and "wait for five Saigon" but they were not to leave the camp until the "babalunas of Saigon" are taken to the city.

A young woman was among the prisoners. The fifth Vietcong woman, who was the youngest, was 14 years old. She refused to be taken to Saigon. She was left by her eyes fixed on the ground.

The other prisoners, their eyes bound, looked tired. A young Vietcong officer, who had been captured on Friday night, but had had nothing to do since.

Roll of the farmers

Kenya's farmers have some show signs of being in a recent few years, with difficulties experienced over transport, rising production costs, thefts and security and with concern over such disputes as the sale of Engosura Farm. During the weekend two leading Government Ministers have thought and things to say which should allay some of these fears, at least, of the farmers of African and European descent.

The Attorney-General, Mr. Njiragu, has re-emphasised the Government's determination to stamp out stock thefting and to ensure security of livestock property. The prescription of the maximum sentence of 14 years' jail and 24 strokes of the whip has been a harsh stock thieves may see a harsh one, especially among tribes where stock-raiding has been a tradition, but the harsh fact is to be established that we live in a new age where such exploits are serious crime, not high jinks. He referred to plans to review and keep up-to-date the nation's agricultural research services, to meet the challenges of the next decade, and to move to improve efficiency at the M.C.C. and Uplands Branches. He also expressed optimism that East Africa's association with the European Common Market would mean instant entry into Europe for many farm products.

Again Mr. McKenzie, in pungent phrases, voiced his fears that the unchecked growth of synthetics could put the world's farmers out of business. Products such as steel and petroleum have already been badly hit by cost-tube competition. Synthetics are allowed to move further into traditional fields of food pro-

duction, not only will the economies of the developing countries be affected — so will the world's food supply. It is in a matter which needs urgent international investigation and control.

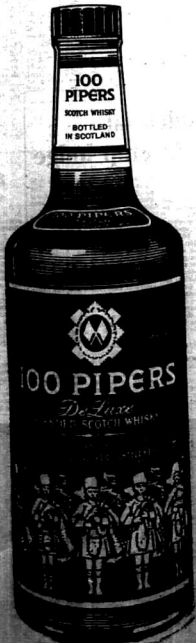

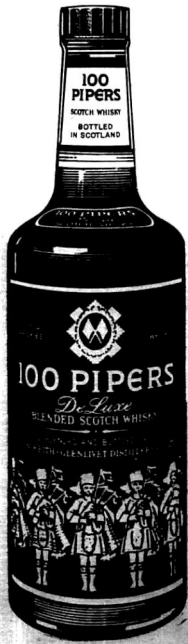

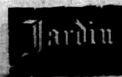

Court cordoned for King suspect

A massive security screen was thrown around a London magistrate's court yesterday when a man hunted as a suspect in the killing of Dr. Martin Luther King made a brief appearance.

Ramon George Sneyd alias James Earl Ray, alias Eric Starvo Galt, was held at London Airport on Saturday and charged with carrying a false passport and an illegal firearm. After two minutes of formal evidence he was remanded in custody until June 15.

Sneyd was charged under the name on the passport he was carrying with illegally possessing a .38 revolver and five rounds of ammunition, and with holding a forged passport. He made no reply when asked by the magistrate Dr. Martin Luther King made a brief appearance.

Reporters and spectators scrambled widely to get into the court house opposite the Royal Opera House in Covent Garden fruit market. Once inside, all had to submit to a thorough search of police looking for arms. Scotland Yard could not remember a previous occasion when this had happened.

A heavy squad of uniformed policemen was on duty. Watching in the courtroom was the U.S. Attorney-General, Mr. F. Vincent, who hopes to extradite Sneyd to America for trial for the murder of the Negro leader. Dr. Martin Luther King. However, it was suggested in London that extradition question could pose a legal headache.

Britain cuts last Rhodesia trade JAPAN FOLLOWS

The British Government yesterday ordered tighter restrictions against Rhodesia in a move that will cut almost all its remaining links with the Rhodesian régime.

Under the new Order-in-Council, the United Kingdom will be required to suspend all trade with Rhodesia, except for essential goods and services.

Welcome to Dr. Banda

President Banda, of Malawi, the controversial African statesman who opened last week's Nairobi Afro-Asian Conference, Shrove, arrives today for a visit to Kenya. He and his entourage are particularly welcome at this time, not because he is the head of state to a neighbouring and friendly country, but having been a personal friend of President Kenyatta for many years.

After many early visits, Dr. Banda qualified in medicine at Merhary College, in Tennessee in 1937. Immediately afterwards, he left the U.S. for the U.K. to take further medical degrees at Edinburgh. During this time, he was made an officer of the Order of St. Michael of the Kingdom of Scotland. He then became a medical practitioner, first in Liverpool and then in London.

Throughout the war years of 1939-45.

Then he moved to London, where he met Mr. Kenyatta and other Africans who were banding together in the campaign for independence from British colonial rule. He maintained contacts with Kenyatta and it was then Kenyatta who suggested that Banda should be the first prime mover behind the formation of the Nyasaland African Congress.

When the Central African Federation was mooted, linking his country with Northern Rhodesia and Southern Rhodesia, he was an active opponent. After the formation of the Federation, in 1953, he left the U.K. for Ghana, where he was set up in practice as a doctor. Five years passed and the man who was destined to become President returned to Nyasaland to become leader of the Congress Party.

He campaigned for independence and the end of the Central African Federation, sharing the fate of other African nationalists who were being detained during the State of Emergency. After a year in detention, he was liberated during a visit to his country by the then Colonial Secretary, Mr. Madhubhai who also took up a leading role in Kenya's pre-independence arrangement.

As leader of the Malawi Congress Party, Dr. Banda attended the two constitutional conferences in London and successfully negotiated the constitutional arrangement. So that, at the subsequent General Conference, his party swept to power and, in September 1961, he took his seat for the first time as a Member of the Legislative Council, Minister for Natural Resources and Local Government, and Leader of the majority party.

From this, it was an assured step to become his country's first Prime Minister, and the first African Prime Minister in

Central and Southern Africa, on the onset of direct internal self government. After the 1964 General Election, when the Malawi Congress Party won 50 seats, Nyasaland became Malawi.

The year later, and now almost two years ago, Malawi became a republic within the Commonwealth, with Dr. Banda as first President. He has met, and especially confided in, his colleagues inside Malawi and forcefully expressed individualism and respect for foreign affairs, notably relations with South Africa and Rhodesia and the relations of the region. While Malawi has remained a firm member of the African Independent States group, Dr. Banda signed to establish relations with South Africa. To be realistic, he had little option.

Dr. Banda's economic policies are the result of Malawi's economic situation. He has approached Kenya and South Africa. There is no doubt that he has had a complex of ideas on the subject. However, as U.S.A. has been to the aid of Kenya and South Africa, there have been hints that Malawi may enter this complex for more military aid. The explanation is that the country has a long history of one reason for Soviet reluctance to supply Malawi with arms.

According to Prime reports derived from an African source, the U.S. is not strong enough to take a very active against the two "rebels" African countries.

Though making a strong appeal to them to end racial prejudice and tension in Africa, Banda explained why he was not felt able to follow the general line of other African leaders against South Africa and Rhodesia. He considered O.A.U. members on these matters to be unrealistic, because they are all "black" and "African".

When Dr. Banda visited Kenya, he was to attend the 10th annual conference of the 18th African States which was held in Nairobi, Kenya, by a number of African states. 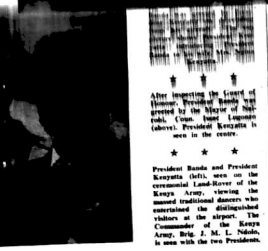

Five-nation defence talks end on high note

The five-nation defence talks which have just ended in Kuala Lumpur have left a note of confidence among the participating nations about the future defence arrangements for the area.

Chiefly the most encouraging feature was the declaration of the Singapore and Malaya representatives, as confirmed in the conference communiqué, that the defence of the area is a joint undertaking and requires their close and continuous cooperation.

Thus there was established the nucleus of a future defence co-operation in the area, and from the conference was able to make important progress in several practical areas. The Singapore and Malaya representatives agreed to meet in Singapore Government talks documents in the area of each of the most important and most important was that of the future defence of the two countries, and the Singaporean defence advisory working group can now study the form of integrated control and management that such system will require.

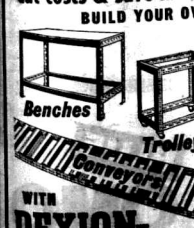
