

## Ghana pledges loyalty to U.K. ties

MR. MACMILLAN said at a State dinner in Accra that the Commonwealth had an outstanding part to play in the advance of Africa along the road of co-operation and peaceful development.

"Ghana and Britain do not always see eye to eye about every aspect of African affairs," the Prime Minister said. He hoped, however, that they would reach acceptable solutions to their problems.

Referring to his visit last month to the Commonwealth African Federation, Mr. Macmillan said: "Our efforts to find a solution we shall hope to meet with sympathy and constructive help from our friends in other parts of Africa and the Commonwealth at large."

### Talks useful and fruitful

Dr. Nkrumah, the Prime Minister of Ghana, assured Mr. Macmillan that Ghana became a republic later this year it would "in no way affect Ghana's active participation in affairs of the Commonwealth or affect the warmth of our affection for the Queen."

Dr. Nkrumah spoke warmly of the value of his "useful and fruitful" talks with the British Prime Minister, and added: "We sincerely hope Mr. Macmillan's visit will enable him to have a better understanding of our problems."

Declaring Ghana's belief that "co-operation is the only way forward" and should "grow" he said he hoped Ghana and the Commonwealth would co-operate within the Commonwealth in the interests of the people of Africa, in full realization of the fact that the Commonwealth have been united since time immemorial.

## E. Africa needs schools of law

There is a pressing need for schools of law in the East African territories. This was stated at the end of the two-week London conference on African law, attended by legal authorities from Africa and Britain.

The conference suggested that recent of the customary laws of the peoples of Africa, which are based on local tradition, should be compiled.

It was agreed that there should be "an attempt to improve uniformity in African law for marriage, divorce, wills and succession" which were too local.

This was reported in an official statement which said the conference of judges, lawyers and administrators, under the chairmanship of the British Lord of Appeal, Lord Denning, was the first of its kind in the history of the Commonwealth.

General principles of agreement were that there should be a uniform law of contracts and tort which should follow the general principles of English law; the law of land tenure should be devised to meet the rapidly changing conditions of the territory; and which the general criminal law should be uniformly applicable to all Commonwealth areas, and create a territory local administration which should be necessary in some areas.

The conclusions of the conference are not binding on any Government.
