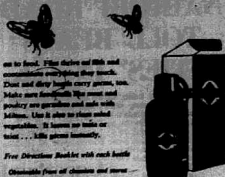

2,000,000 Budget

Estimates presented to Council

KENYA'S 1960-61 estimates of expenditure, which were laid in the Legislative Council yesterday by the Temporary Minister for Finance, Mr. J. H. Baiter, provide for expenditure of £32,614,675.

This compares with £32,225,520 for 1959-60 and actual expenditure of £29,750,201 in 1959-59.

The net reduction of about £31,000 has been achieved only because the British Government has agreed to relieve the East African Governments of responsibility for the recurrent cost of the Land Forces from July 1, 1960, and because of the reduction in expenditure previously charged to the Emergency Fund.

More on passages

The two figures are £11,229,000 and £1,086,000. But for these savings the net increase in expenditure would have been £1,503,000. Major increases in expenditure, including passages and former Emergency expenditure, are:

Education—£351,500; public debt—£346,717; local government contributions—£1,815,500; Ministry of Health and Welfare—£1,122,027; Police—£121,285; Prisons—£114,846; office of the Chief Secretary—£109,178.

For the first time since 1963 there is no provision for a contribution to the Emergency Fund, but about £514,000 in services previously financed from that fund being included in ten different votes. Kenya release: Position restated

There is no intention of releasing James Kenyatta or any other nationalist as detained so long in the Kenya Government believes they are a danger to security or to their fellow citizens in Kenya.

Annual report shows rising exports but fewer passengers

A 10 per cent increase in freight traffic and a decrease in passenger traffic were the main features of the annual report for the year of the East African Airways Corporation.

Increased freight traffic was the result mainly of a 10 per cent increase in commodities exported from East Africa, and a smaller growth in internal movements. Freight tonnage was carried than 1956, but passenger traffic for this was a decrease in third-class seats on the Kenya and Tanganyika lines.

The report says that operators have been successful in increasing road transport facilities in recent years.

Numbers of passengers carried decreased from 121,000 in 1956 to 114,000 in 1957. There were 12,100,000 passenger miles covered—9,100,000 on the Kenya line and 3,000,000 on the Tanganyika line.

The total gross air freight revenue for 1957 was £1,200,000, an increase of 18 per cent.

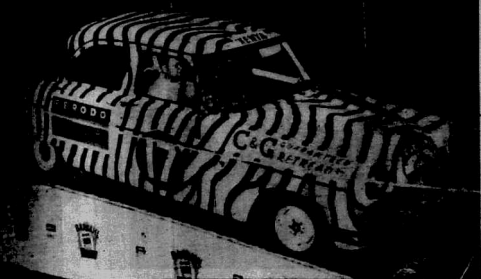

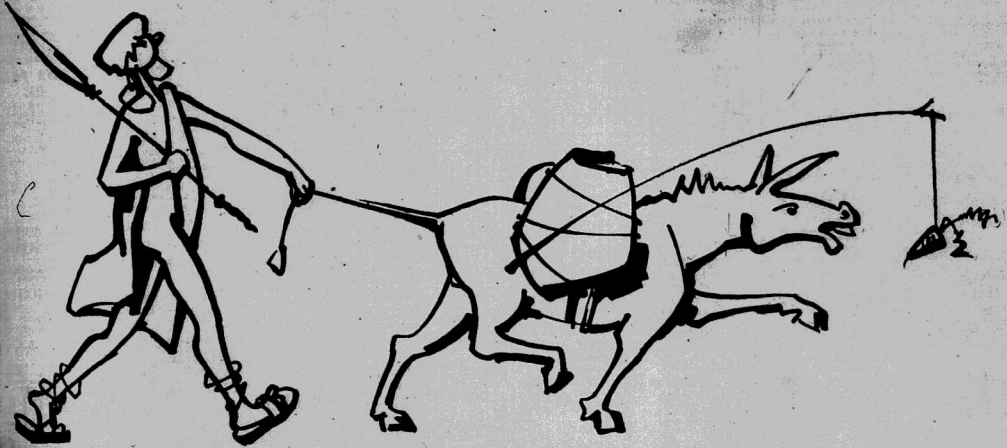

Considerable anxiety for Richard had existed if Mr Macleod was aware there was considerable anxiety in Kenya owing to the number of fatal African deaths which had been assumed recently and if he was aware that this anxiety was increasing to the belief that their assailants were in some cases former veterans.

He added: "Are you satisfied that everything possible is being done to prevent further deaths?"

Mr Macleod said: "I am sorry there is anxiety and I agree there are a number of African deaths which have occurred — which it what has been the case for some time — it would not be surprising if there is a certain increase in the crime statistics."

Further enquiries at all that Government servants have been made a special view mentioned, but it is a situation which will keep arising.

ITALY RECALLS FORMER PREMIER

President Gronchi of Italy has asked Prof. Fanfani, aged 60, to return to office as minister and leader of a left-wing group in the Christian Democrat Party to try to form a government among the country's warring political crisis.

Mr. Macleod told the questioner, Mr. Stephen Sterling (Labour): "The Kenya Government recently appointed a commissioner to carry out a survey of unemployment in the Colony to obtain information on which to base recruitment and to be reported to the Central Provinces and Eastern Districts Commissioner and others."

He added: "It is in a recent debate in the House of Commons that the Labour Government showed some concern about the effect of unemployment among those recently released from detention who bring themselves completely frustrated."

He asked if in view of this the Colonial Secretary would take any urgent action to provide greater economic opportunity for Kenya.

Mr. Macleod replied: "I am very conscious of that point and it is by no means forgotten. I am sure the Kenya Government know the problem and I believe it is trying to deal with it in the commission which the report of which I have also in dealing with the matter."

All-Africa trade union discussed

The setting up of an all-African trade union has been discussed among representatives of the African Union of Ghana, led by Mr. Kwame Nkrumah, and Mr. T. J. Mboya when they met in Accra.

Mr. Mboya agreed with and gave his support for the need to establish such a federation independent of the International Confederation of Free Trade Unions or the World Federation of Trade Unions.

Referring to Mr. Mboya's attempt to dual affiliations, Dr. Nkrumah said these should not prevent countries like Kenya from joining the new federation.

"Every African nationalist who understands the situation in Pan-Africa will have to lend his support to an organisation devoted to Pan-Africanism," he added.

Different policy in territories urged

A LABOUR M.P. Mr. Peter Brockway has urged the British Government to embark on a different policy in the British High Commission territories in South Africa.

This policy, he said, would be "changing the whole philosophy of apartheid" and would make these territories of racial equality and African advance.

Mr. Brockway, who was speaking in a House of Commons debate, said the Protectorates should not be assimilated into the apartheid system of South Africa or they could influence South Africa towards an inter-racial human society.

Already penetrated by the Protectorates, even to be saved from assimilation into the apartheid system there must be a considerable change in British "colonial" policy towards them.

There should be an end to the apartheid system, which has already penetrated the territories.

Mr. Oliver Tambo, secretary-general of the African National Congress (who has once been held in a concentration camp) had been forbidden to stay at an hotel in Johannesburg.

There was also racial segregation in education in all three Protectorates. This should be ended.

Mr. Brockway said that recently the South African Government had not hidden the fact that it was preparing to demand that the Protectorates should be transferred to that Government.

Assurance sought

He went on: "I am asking the Minister to give us his assurance today — that not only will the inhabitants of the Protectorates be consulted about their future, but that if there is any proposal to transfer them to the Union, that it will be necessary for them to keep their own views."

Mr. Brockway said it was surprising to find that these people must go to South Africa to seek a dispensation.

He urged the Minister to grant asylum in the Protectorates for all refugees from the present administration of the Union, to make provision for them to facilitate their going to Britain and if they desired, to the United Nations give evidence.

FIVE-DAY DRAMA ON CRIPPLED TANKER

THE 11,328-ton tanker Clyde Gibraltar, bound for Bombay, drifted helplessly, but "died on cover" for five days while a cracked cylinder "leak" was changed.

The tanker left Abadan in Mesopotamia with a cargo of both oil and wheat 20 miles of Mogadishu when the cylinder cracked.

This weight about six tons in a matter of hours about three days to replace — on shore. The tanker was carrying a cargo of wheat.

The cracked cylinder leak was being lifted with the vessel's derrick craned on to the bow deck and caused extensive structural damage to plates, handrails and platforms. But it was not until the vessel was being replaced that the master, Capt. W. C. Little, said the weather was not very good.

"I believe it was about 20 miles a day towards the destination while drifting. Yesterday the salt water to Abadan."

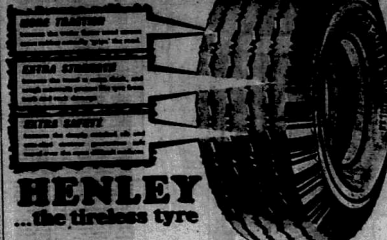
Indonesia bans Dutch ships

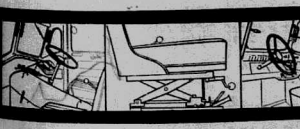
