GRIM STRUGGLE IS ON

Smash at Embu puts Manuissis out

WHAT had looked like being a dull East African Safari developed into something exciting over the weekend, with the Kenya driver John Manuissis and his partner, W. H. B. Parkison, smashing into a television car just outside Embu, three cars overturning and only 25 of the original 84 starters still in the event.

CAPSULE IN ORBIT

AFRO-ASIAN 'SUMMIT' TALKS WANTED

THE second Afro-Asian solidarity conference has ended in Conakry, Guinea, with a recommendation for a 'summit meeting' of Heads of State and Government from the two continents.

The five-day conference was attended by about 300 delegates from 70 organizations in about 50 Afro-Asian countries.

The newly formed 27-nation executive committee of the organization has a list to prepare the ground for such a conference and to decide on a date.

Basees attack

The meeting called for a social and economic boycott on South Africa for its apartheid policy and against France for Algeria and its Sahara settler colonies.

It also adopted resolutions supporting the Arab cause in Palestine and the struggle for independence in British, Portuguese and French territories in Africa. It condemned racialism in East Africa.

The resolution called on Britain to 'recognise the independence of the Protectorates of Basutoland, Bechuanaland and Swaziland'.

The conference called for closer economic cooperation between Asia and Africa and decided to establish a permanent economic committee to study common problems.

Passer home

Nasser Home of the United Arab Republic is to leave Cairo after a 24-hour tour of India and Pakistan.

ONE of the few remaining European monarchs in the world, is also the unique in still maintaining the traditional, formal ceremonies of presentation at court for young girls and married women of high society.

This year a total of 81 debutantes and a total of 81 matrons made their ceremonial curtsies to Queen Elizabeth.

But many people in progressive, democratic Sweden are asking how long these ceremonies will be continued although presentation is open to the wives and daughters of Swedish citizens with a rank corresponding to that of army colonel or higher.

Included, too, are those holding the rank of commander, first class of a Swedish order. The wives and unmarried daughters of officers below the rank of colonel but who belong to the royal staff.

LAST PRIVILEGE

The wives and daughters of Swedish noblemen, that is those whose families are registered in the records of the House of Nobility, may also be presented to the Queen.

This is about the last of the rites of the nobility which up to the middle of last century were a privileged position in Swedish aristocratic and society.

Presentation at the Swedish Court takes place in the afternoon.

Eleven-thirty, debuts for the day are dressed in the most glamorous full-length evening dresses.

In the old days they were required to wear a special dress which was introduced by King Gustaf III in 1778.

Details of style of this dress varied somewhat through the centuries, but the colours were always either black or white.

NURSE RETURNS FROM ISLAND

AFTER five weeks in Mauritius helping with relief measures for the cyclone-torn island, Miss B. Colquhoun, one of the four Red Cross field officers who were sent to the island, is back in Kenya. Working with her were Miss Thelma Brigstocke, field officers from London, Miss E. Jordan and Mr. D. Dawson, with Mrs. Joyce Coldham, special staff officer for the St. John Ambulance Brigade, from Nairobi.

Throughout the time they were together in the island, the two organizations, the Red Cross and St. John, worked as a team.

Miss Colquhoun said that the devastated island looked as if it had undergone a wholesale pillage. 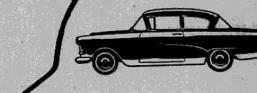

Her Finance Minister, Mr. M. S. Montagu, said this when he arrived in London with a delegation of 15 for constitutional talks which begin today.

"We expect the talks will be conducted in a harmonious atmosphere and we believe that a complete agreement will be reached," he said.

Mr. Montagu arrived in London on the Saturday of last week. He is the first of a group of 15 ministers who will be in Sierra Leone in the next few days. The group will be headed by the Prime Minister, Sir Milton Margai, who is expected to arrive in London on December 17.

Mr. Montagu said that Sierra Leone has a population of about 2,000,000. It has a large number of people who are of European descent.

The marchers began to sing hymns and prayers as they walked down the square.

Power French Cabinet reinforced

FRANCE has taken measures to reinforce its powers at a moment's notice by declaring a "state of emergency" without reference to Parliament, should circumstances appear to call for such measures.

An Ordinance, signed by President Charles de Gaulle, gave the Prime Minister, Guy Mollet, and other Cabinet Ministers the right to declare a "state of emergency" in the event of a crisis.

The Ordinance also provides for the extension of the state of emergency to other parts of the country which require a vote of both Houses of Parliament before a state of emergency can be declared.

A state of emergency is defined as "an imminent danger resulting from serious infringements of public order or security, or from the nature and gravity of the character of a public calamity."

Once declared by the Government, the state of emergency would last 15 days, after which it could be renewed only by a vote of Parliament.

Press curfew

Under it, the civil authorities could prohibit public meetings, close public places of entertainment, impose curfew hours, and restrict the movement of vehicles before a meeting is held. It would also give the authorities the right to require persons to live in places designated by the authorities.

On the face of it, this is a major step towards giving the Government in case of trouble the powers of a military dictatorship.

The Ordinance also gives the Government the right to suspend the press, to limit the circulation of newspapers, and to restrict the movement of vehicles before a meeting is held.

Bomb hurled from car damages Negro's home

AN explosion, believed to have been caused by a dynamite thrown from a moving car, partly wrecked the home of a Negro member of the Nashville, Tennessee, City Council who has defended many Negro college students after recent lynchings and assassinations.

He is Dr. G. A. Ledy, 42, and he and his wife were asleep in a rear bedroom at the time. Neither was injured.

The explosion, which tore a hole in a front corner of the brick house, demolished a house next door.

Dr. Ledy, a lawyer and a member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, said he would continue to fight for integration.

The chief of police in Nashville said the bomb was apparently thrown "if it had hit the window it would have affected everybody in the neighborhood. We are looking for a suspect."

Dr. Ledy was one of the 1,000 Negroes who were fined \$5 dollars for reckless driving. He had been arrested on Sunday after a motorcycle in support of the Negro bus-counter demonstration.

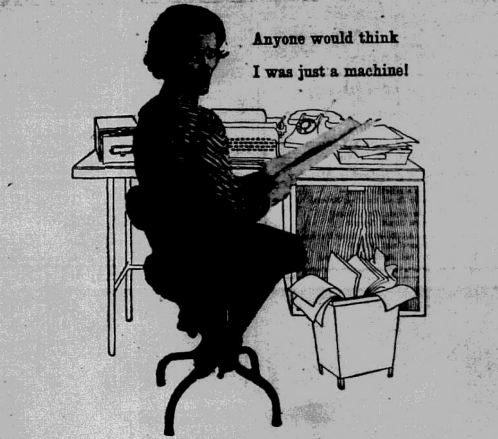

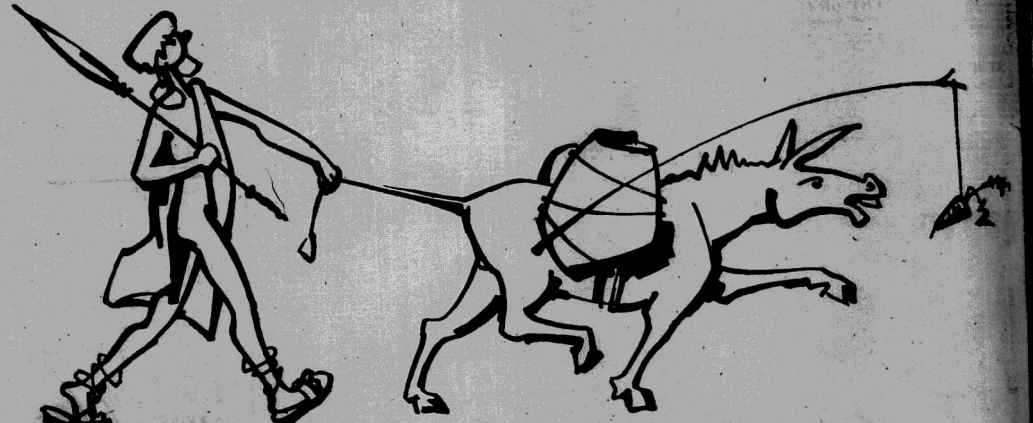

£1m. PLANT

Standard Corporation

TEST drilling for a £1,000,000 sheet piling mill at Changavue, Mombasa, are now being carried out by African (East Africa) Ltd., an aluminium company whose plans include the largest scale of general sheet piling in East Africa and export to the Persian Gulf, Mauritius and neighbouring areas.

The building company in Aluminium Ltd. of Canada, is the Aluminium Co. of Canada which is being owned by African (East Africa) Ltd. and Canadian Aluminium Products, New Brunswick.

The managing director of the Aluminium Co. of Canada, Mr. W. G. Murphy, Associate Director of the Mombasa sheet piling mill, said that a £120,000 consulting mill at the site of the mill, which will be on a new site at Changavue, bought from East African Railway and Harbours for more than £5,000, is expected to be well under way.

The mill should be in full production in about a year to 18 months, long and it is expected to employ between 300 and 400 people. Most of the equipment will be ordered from Britain. The Aluminium Co. of Canada is a subsidiary of the Standard Corporation, which is a public limited company, and its shares are listed on the London Stock Exchange.

Mr. Murphy said that the £1,000,000 sheet piling mill will be a four-roller mill on the type used on steel which was privately owned. This mill will also include a 300 shop. Local labour employed will be about 40.
