White hunters' skill tracks down gangs

ANTI-MAU MAU TEAMS FORMED

WHILE hunters, turning their attention from Kenya's game preserves, are now concentrating on anti-gang operations to help the Security Forces in their operations against Mau Mau gangs. The latest exploit to be attributed to their record was when

Mr. Peter Becker, engaged a gang of 12 on a Nyeri farm near Nairobi, and tracked them down in the last ten days of 1954 they killed 17 gangsters.

Tracker dogs

Now, however, young hunters are working with trained canines employed by wealthy sportsmen who have been buying up a great many African game reserves and farms and setting up a hunting industry under a European banner.

There are five white hunters who are engaged in this work, and three are in process of becoming trackers.

The Kenyan leaders, in the Mau Mau Nyeri district, are reported to be in contact with this as well as with Mr. Fred Pocock, Mr. Charles Wilson, Mr. Gordon Macmillan, Mr. Alexander Gishongi, a former Mau Mau, and Mr. Andrew Oshombe, a former Stark, who has been tracking for the past six months.







Kiambu Farmers' Drive To Protect Their Labour

A SMALL group of Kikuyu farmers are making a determined effort to protect their labour from termination. At the same time, improve the quality of their farm workers' lives.

All last year the farmers had great difficulty in getting their labour and are requesting improved morale of their workers.

By Astirring their labour lines, these farmers believe they will also prevent their workers from leaving the camp. A high standard of housing is being maintained and is an important factor in reducing turnover.

Guard post

THESE farmers have built cottages, modern stables and other facilities. Kikuyu Guard posts.

"We cannot ask our labour to be loyal, so we hope," says the farmer, pointing to his workers before he moves them to another camp.

"Landless have been living in scattered huts. When a gang comes along, it's hard to stop them from attacking the houses."

"Secondly," he continued,

garage have moved into the settled area and have been given permission to do so. The shelter given by existing farms is not sufficient for them. Each tenant can only be given a small plot of land to live on. This is the event of an attack.

The farmer's third reason is that Kikuyu farm workers often go to the market after work to buy food. This is not safe, as the setting is concentrated under the eye of the police.

Guard post

OTHERS are building about 60 permanent workers' houses and 100 yards of wire and fence posts are already in place. The cost of wire and fence posts is about £100 per acre.

The post has been strengthened by a single barbed-wire and post fortified by ditch, bamboo stakes and stones. The post is surrounded by the Kikuyu Guard post strength.

The post is eight by 12 feet, 10 inches high and 200 yards long and 50 yards wide.

Workers, who have been working hard, have proved their worth patrolling. Investigations of labourers' movements are being made.

The cottages in the camp all have the workers from ten to twelve.

The post now serves four farms. Since the arrival of the Kikuyu Guard post, the houses have been marked and there has been a marked increase in security.

A cheaper and equally effective alternative to the administrative district guard post would have placed a Kikuyu coffee farmer in a strong position, and
