ATTEMPT TO INCREASE INVESTMENTS ABROAD

PRESIDENT EISENHOWER last night renewed
his appeal to the United States Congress for a
more liberal American international trade policy,
to give him authority to build up the economic defences of
under-developed allies. Part of the bill was

DICKINSON CUP SAILING RACE

New scoring at Naivasha

FOR the Dickinson Cup race last Sunday, the sailing committee of the Naivasha Yacht Club introduced a new method of scoring points, and the same method is to drop their scores of the day. The first event under the modified system resulted in a tie, and the second was won by Doreen (Bremen) and Dorset (Dinghy) by a 1/4-point margin.

FARMERS' UNION 'CAN BE LEADING POWER'

Drive for membership urged
at Mau branch meeting

WAYS in which he feels the Kenya National Farmers' Union can be a leading power in the country were outlined by Mr. W. E. Crosskill, M.P., for a well-attended meeting of the Union's Mau branch at Molo.

Mr. Crosskill stressed that he was not suggesting that the K.N.F.U. should enter the field of politics. Too many subjects were now considered to be political. The first aim of the Union, he said, should be to extend its members' knowledge of agriculture. Much had been achieved much, but it could be far greater if more people became interested in the whole of the farming community.

In Southern Rhodesia, the farmers had won the battle for the basic power in the land and now they were winning the war against poverty. They had done the same in Kenya. Although Mau had made considerable progress, the farmer had joined voluntary associations and started a "farmers' union" it was important to begin discussions.

The K.N.F.U. conference had started the proposal for combining the two unions. Mr. Crosskill said he felt that it should be done.

He suggested that the Union should stimulate the East Africa Agricultural Research Institute which has over 4,000 members comprising 80% of the membership of just over 1,000—indeed, the largest in the country.

Mr. Crosskill said the Union could well take some part in the discussion of local government and could take an active part in working out more effective ways of developing the developing industry, take more interest in the railways, communications, the cost of living, the price of meat, and in the Emergency with particular care for famine defence.

Agriculture Bill
It was vital that it played its part in the development of the country. We are going to be attacked on all sides if we do not fulfil our responsibilities if it failed to work out a programme of action.

Mr. Crosskill said that the Union should take an active part in the campaign to stop the P.E.A.T. If our case were to stand up in his speech, Mr. Crosskill said, the new Agriculture Bill would assist in the development of agriculture. D. H. Peil Smith said he thought this was a wrong assumption.

A NEW anti-anthrax vaccine based on the discoveries of a South African scientist may result in huge savings in world dairy and meat production.

MARRIAGE SCHOOL TO COMBAT DIVORCE

A PSYCHOLOGIST, Dr Guido Groeger, who believes that marriage is a "natural" state, has founded West Germany's first marriage school to combat divorce.

"Love cannot be taught, but we can help people to make it very easy for it," Dr Groeger says. "Couples should expand their horizons and widen their views of married life before signing the marriage certificate."

Divorce rate

The divorce rate in West Germany is still, with 50,833 in 1957, one of the highest in Europe. A gradual decline from the peak of 53,000 in 1954, if similar schools could be set up elsewhere, could be expected.

His school, started last May, has attracted a flood of applicants, mostly between the ages of 20 and 30. Three students are run for the course, which includes visits to the newly-married respectively in Berlin, Hamburg, Frankfurt (46-47) and lasts ten weeks.

Once a week for discussions, Dr Groeger says that the course is designed to bring together people who are interested in marriage and a couple of meetings, particularly with a psychologist, follow later. Most have found a companion.

'Ideal couple'

STUDENTS are asked to explain why they are interested in marriage. They are given a "homework" type of assignment.

"We want to have their special views about marriage and then we will share them with the rest of the class," he said.

They are the ones who have been married, married pre-arranged, with some money, or who have not carried too far.

For subjects for lectures, delivered by Dr Groeger, there are psychology, sex psychology, and of discussion groups on love, marriage, maturity, and marriage.

The basic physical examination of the body and meeting of the parents of each couple is selected at the end of each course.

Dr Groeger says that his students are mostly middle-class.

He adds: "The average age of my students is 25 years old and they are all married."

Some come to the course because they are unhappy in their marriages all the time. They want to learn how to live happily ever after.

Others come because they are inexperienced and the world is new to them.

Dr Groeger advises his students to go to the Christian churches, schools and clubs, and to go to the movies.

He also suggests that they go to the garden, where they can meet other gardeners.

He thinks that the fundamental problem is that the man should definitely be the head of the family.

Only sheer determination, as they will be told, can achieve results.

The main points for discussion are diet, exercise, food, sleep, and recreation.

AMERICA FLIES AIR WING TO BASES IN FORMOSA

7th Fleet gathers off the Tachens

FEARS OF WEAKENING ANGLO-U.S. ACCORD

The United States Air Force yesterday began flying an entire wing of Sabre jets into Formosa from Manila and Okinawa to augment American carrier-based planes which will provide an "umbrella" for the Chinese Nationalist evacuation of the Tachen Islands. The evacuation is expected to begin this weekend.

Reports were landing there were growing reports that the Nationalist President, Gen. Chiang Kai-shek, had agreed to President Eisenhower's suggestion that he leave Formosa.

Reports from both sides said that the United States Seventh Fleet was completing its annual Nationalist training exercise in the Tachen Islands.

The New China News Agency said U.S. fighter aircraft carriers, two more than off Formosa,

had joined the Tachen fleet.

In diplomatic circles, there was wide concern over the situation between the president and the British Foreign Secretary, Sir Anthony Eden. The President strongly supported the military measures into Communist hands by the Chinese Communists.

Mr. Wilson said yesterday in the House of Commons that the military expenditures of the Chinese Communists were at record levels. He said: "Any attempt to invade Formosa would be a violation of the Anglo-American Solidarity."

Mr. Wilson said: "The new Prime Minister, Mr. Macmillan, has been asked to take action in the dispute between the Chinese Communists and the Chinese Nationalists." He said: "It is probable that he will make a formal notice asking the Chinese Communists to withdraw their forces from Formosa."

There were three other British naval ships in Hong Kong yesterday.

They are the frigate Eider, which was in the port of which was Chinese; the frigate Javelin, which was against an innocent British merchant ship; and the frigate Hesperus, which was with the British flag.

U.S. ACTION EXPECTED

Discussions have been going on for some time between the United States and Britain about a request for the United States to intervene in the dispute. It is probable that a formal notice asking the Chinese Communists to withdraw their forces from Formosa will take place early next week.

EDUCATION PREPARATIONS

The movement of the 18th Fighter-Bomber Wing in Formosa was announced to the House of Commons yesterday. The statement said the planes had been moved to Formosa to meet American air power at any given moment. The 18th is another Far East Air Force unit deployed to forward bases.

This was followed by the Prime Minister, Mr. Attlee, in his speech to the House of Commons, in which he called for the creation of a Nationalist trooper force.

Gen. John D. Miller, United States Ambassador to Formosa, today told a conference in Tokyo to confer with him. It was learned, that he had been invited to meet with him.

He will go on to visit the United States immediately after his arrival.

WINGS OF WOMBOS

Chinese Nationalist military sources estimated Communists had 120,000 men opposite the Tachen at 12,000. The Chinese Communists had built planes.

The Chinese Air Force meanwhile has been sending out waves of raids against the recently captured islands to have inflicted heavy damage to their garrisons.

PASSPORT OF AMERICAN IN K.P.R. WITHHELD

Because Mr. William Wright Baldwin, an American citizen, was denied a passport, he was unable to leave the United States Consulate General in Nairobi.

Mr. Baldwin, aged 40, is now in Nairobi, where he has been serving as a member of the Kenya Police Reserve since November 1954. He had expected to leave the K.P.R. and return to the United States, but was held by the Kenyan authorities regarding his return to America.



Getting Homes

TUESDAY JANUARY 22 1952
Sir.—I am grateful to your Editor for his letter of yesterday. I would like to add my views on this matter.
A good standard of living for those who have been employed by the Electors' Union more closely with the Elected Members and their wives or to launch it as a political organisation which would support selected candidates at the next election. The fact is that, if the party system is introduced into the European Union, the Electors' Union will be on the way out.

Much will depend, of course, on the outcome of the political "truce" which comes to an end in a fortnight. It has so far been generally relieved of its responsibilities, but from strafe at public meetings which it was allowed to hold, it had to be short-lived. The dispute about the sureties has caused a great deal of friction and there is more dispute to come.

NUCLEAR WEAPONS BASTION OF THE WEST Defence review by Sir Winston

BRITAIN PLANNING AIR BASES IN AFRICA

SIR WINSTON CHURCHILL told the Commonwealth Prime Ministers' conference in London that Britain's possession of the hydrogen bomb and nuclear weapons prevented the world from being over-run.

In a review of the rapid development of hydrogen and atomic bombs, Sir Winston said he believed that Russia was Western strength. The United States, with her greater industrial power, still held the balance of power.

But, he continued, Russia could be expected to catch up with America in a few years and he predicted that eventually in atomic power between Russia and the West there would be a stand-off.

PHASING PERIOD EXTENSION

"This is because of an inevitable extension of the time required for the U.K. registers. At the moment, a minimum of 14 days is a normal period of time.

Offer rejected

Mr. C. Small, chairman of Mombasa Phasing Company, said that his firm had been offered a reduction of \$750 a day, but refused.

Approximately three-quarters of the goods brought into the port by the company, he said, were destined for Kigali, and the remainder for Kampala, goods yard, quayside.

There was no room for any more goods in Kigali, and a goods train had to be stopped at Kampala, because of lack of space.

The District Traffic Surveyor, Mr. R. Morris, announced yesterday that no train from Kampala to Mombasa could start on Saturday.

Appeal to firms

The embargo will apply to all traffic leaving from part of East Africa.

Surgical training in East Africa needed

PLAN FOR SPECIALISED WORK

A VIEW was expressed last week for the provision within East Africa of facilities for higher surgical training which was expressed by Prof. H. J. Crook, when he gave his presidential address at the recent meeting of the Association of Surgeons in East Africa. Prof. Crook, Professor of Surgery at Makere University College, pointed out that the Association's new president, Dr. K. A. House, wanted to see a surgical unit, which would consist of one large theatre, a lecture room, an operating theatre, a dispensary, an X-ray room, a laboratory, a post-operative ward and a staff of six or seven surgeons.

Prof. Crook said the association's council had the problem of arranging for other surgical training in East Africa.

Larger range

The situation is regarded, however, as being most unsatisfactory, and no longer performed any real service. That is why a period of training there has been recognised as essential for the local surgeon to be able to practise operations. This is far beyond the scope of the recently established medical practical unit controlled by the Board of Education.

While the general practitioners' colleges have done their best, the numbers of surgeons have been increasing rapidly for the number of years to come. The question of specialist training entry into the system.

Theory point

They are, in these matters, provided with services insofar as possible.

Prof. Crook made a reference to the Association of Surgeons of East Africa Bill to amend section 12 of the Education Act, 1960, in the development of the educational system.


