# GOODBYE TO ALL THIS...

## NEW CHANCE FOR BURUNDI

EVENTS IN AFRICA's third smallest independent State, Burundi, are once more causing concern to those who profess to preserve and foster the image of responsible government in Africa.

Since the Belgian-occupied trust territory became independent in 1962, it has given one blow after another to this image. There have been assassinations, expulsions, allegations of brutality against workers and students, the 18-year-old Crown Prince deposed his father, King Mwambutsa IV, and assumed all powers.

It is difficult to judge events in a country which has no Press and where international correspondents are barred. But however little is known in this regard of political events in Burundi, it is difficult to feel any great sympathy for the deposed King. For months he appears to have failed to live up to his responsibilities.

Instead of trying to unite the different factions in his tribalistic Kingdom and promote the unbroken independence of his country, he has been seen to make attempts at subversion by the means of a royalist movement, a royalist of European holiday makers, in contravention of the terms of his country's independence agreement. One of his few low points was his conferred special powers on the Crown Prince in 1964, and set up a Royal Commission to draft a Constitution.

Prince Charles has given an apparently acceptable answer to the demands of the King, but it is not clear from a report in Europe only a month ago and is said to have brought him a great deal of popularity. He has won a swift rise in his countrymen's wages and an end to corruption.

It is obviously his progressive ideas which is most young men of 19 and, for the good of his country, it is to be hoped that he has the courage and power to implement them. For reforms are long overdue in Burundi.

Apart from the meddling by foreign Powers, particularly by China, most of the country's troubles have stemmed from the special antagonism between the giant Urvu, the traditional overlords of the former Ruanda-Urundi, and the Hutu who far exceed them in number.

## Catastrophe of catastrophe

The Hutus have made some progress since Burundi's independence but violence has invariably blocked the long road to democracy. Consider the following record—just before Ruanda and Burundi became independent there was civil war, hundreds were killed and thousands died of neighbouring epidemics. Soon afterwards King Louis Rwagasore, the Prime Minister, was murdered outside the hospital where he was to be treated. His newborn child, the next to be born was nine months later when Hutu soldiers mistreated and yet another Prime Minister, Mr. Leopold Ndaya, was shot, though not fatally.

The mutiny brought more violence in its wake and there was a series of elections between last October and December in which nearly fifty people, including Ministers and public leaders died. The elections were postponed in January when 18 people were eliminated. Those included almost all of the country's elected Parliamentarians.

The Prince has a heavy burden on his young shoulders and while the method of his exercise of power is not known it is to be hoped that he will be able to bring some kind of stability to the country. The Hutu problem is far from being like a ship without a government but for months been like a ship without a rudder. Perhaps now it will get a more purposeful government but for months been like a ship without a rudder. They are by no means unopposed. He still holds the advantage that the majority of the people are Hutu and that the majority asset is in conditions in the capital are quiet as was confirmed by passengers arriving in Nairobi on the plane from there on Saturday.

It is possible that the Prince has been persuaded, or even forced, to assume power by elements tired of the law of leadership shown by the King. This remains to be seen. I feel the situation is clarified the most that can be hoped for is that the country's new ruler will put aside the swammy's shadow and be left to try to put his country back on its feet, without interference from interested outside countries.

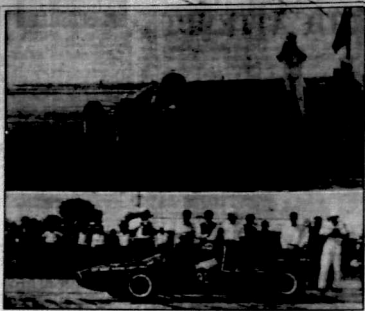

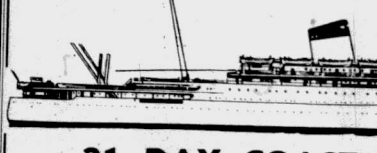

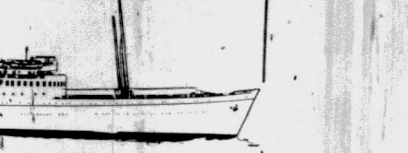

ADMINISTRATIVE AND C.P.T. REPORTS

**SOME FORWARD-LOOKING** ideas have been presented by the Siririka County Council to the Commission of Enquiry into Local Government in Kenya. Two central propositions, that the Provincial Administration has evolved its purposes as a unit of the public service and the abolition of Grant-in-Aid, merit careful consideration.

In some ways, the Provincial Administration is a legacy of the methods used in colonial times. Siririka's case is that it should be abandoned progressively in order to strengthen the administration of public services at the county and local levels. This is because the Provincial Administration is firmly established and working well in the departments of the Provincial Administration and government authorities — so what is the use of it? Do the functions of the Provincial Administration, such as the administration of land, roads, water supply, and other developmental matters, and the division into areas of responsibility, would therefore rationalise the country's administrative structure, as it seems unwise to consider replacing the P.C. or D.C. with representative bodies of electoral groups, as in the common system, even though Siririka adds the provision that these representatives should be for purely county purposes.

**G.P.T.** were established as some alternative form of raising revenue would have to be devised. Siririka makes the reasonable suggestion of corresponding increase from income tax. Again, this would lead to rationalisation, because one authority would be charged with collecting all the direct taxation.

Moreover, two abuses would be removed. One is the inequity that interposed in certain circumstances have to pay G.P.T. and, second, that G.P.T. payments are not deducted from wages. Siririka also suggests that a local government should be empowered to raise income tax, but that taxpayers pay, one through G.P.T. itself and another through levied on their earnings.

**Local government saved from disaster**

G.P.T. was introduced parallel with repatriation, not to bolster the Provincial Assemblies financially but to raise funds for the local authorities. It was that privilege that county and municipal councils would finance their local government projects. The Government and the people would be able to identify what was happening to their money by seeing improvements in their own areas. This has happened to some extent. Provincial, from which the proceeds went to the Central Government and Poll Rate, raised to benefit the former African District Council, newly county councils.

At first, local authorities were responsible for G.P.T. collection but soon fell into such serious arrears that many were in danger of collapse. The two Ministers successively responsible for local government, Mr. Ayob and Mr. Sindi, performed wonders of reorganisation by travelling up and down the country warning subscribers which were late and making allowances and general drastic tightening-up in financial affairs, to save local government from disaster.

Because of the difficulties experienced by local authorities in collecting G.P.T. just over a year ago, Mr. Sindi initiated a new method, resting collection in the hands of Central Government agents, including C.D.s, clerks and tribal police. 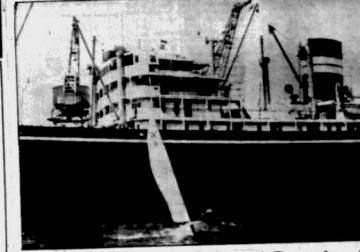

## IMMEDIATE RELEASE FOR EX-MINISTERS Uganda Government move overruled

Immediate release of five former Uganda Ministers was ordered yesterday by the Justice Panel in the High Court of Uganda in Kampala. The ex-ministers had been held in detention in Eastern Africa against detention under the Deportation Ordinance.

Earlier, a submission by the Deputy Director of Public Prosecutions, Mr. Masika, that the five should be produced in court in Kampala to be released, was strongly objected to by the ex-ministers' counsel, Mr. P. J. Wilkinson, Q.C., who said he considered this proposal was made with ulterior motives.

Mr. Masika had said since the court's judgment had been received, the authorities in whose custody the men were had taken action to make them available in Kampala. He did not know where they were at that time but he understood they were taken to Kampala early yesterday. They could be before the court by 3 p.m.

### 'Not lawfully in custody'

In reply to this Mr. Wilkinson said: "They are being brought illegally into Buganda, and I would ask your lordship if my learned friend is trying to do that, to issue a prohibition order that these people have to be released from custody forthwith, wherever they may be, and that any action to bring them into Buganda is illegal. They are not lawfully in the custody of anyone, no one has the authority to move them from their homes, or to take them to any other than themselves."

Mr. Wilkinson asked authorities in English law which would allow that they may be released from custody immediately. It was sufficient for the Registrar of the High Court of Uganda to inform the Minister of Internal Affairs of the fact that:

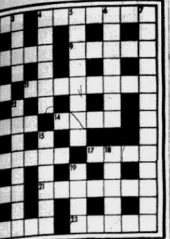
