BRITAIN RELEASES PRISONERS

British-India unlikely to cut service

By tribes and by regime

Britain has announced the release of prominent prisoners. Among those freed were two of the country's leading politicians, Chief Obafemi Awolowo and Chief Awolowo, who have been in jail since 1962 on charges of plotting against the Government.

The régime also denied that it was planning to partition the country into separate tribal communities. It said that rival Hausa and Yoruba peoples were being repatriated to their own parts of the country and that foreign troops from another African country had arrived in the north and were marching on the south.

The weekend rally brought to a head the distrust between Nigeria's two biggest tribal groups—the Muslim Hausas of the North and the flow of the Yoruba. There was still no news yesterday of the fate of the head of State, Mr. Gen. Aguiyi-Ironsi, an Ibo, who was kidnapped on Friday by the mutineers.

No mass movement planned

Yesterday's moves and statements were seen as an attempt by the Government, now headed by Lt. Col. Yakubu Gowon, to damp down tribal feelings and remove the fears that they were now at the mercy of the Hausa.

A second statement said Col. Gowon's attention had been drawn to a report of a purported broadcast on Monday night by Lt. Col. Yakubu Gowon, a military officer in the Ibo Eastern Province.

KILLERS STILL AT LARGE

THE search continued yesterday in the district north-east of Aden for the suspected killers of Lt. Col. J. W. Gray, commander of the British Legion in the Hadramaut area of South Arabia, who was killed on Thursday.

A reward has been offered for the capture dead or alive of four suspect gunmen. Lt. Gray's wife was arrested at Mahala, the legion's headquarters. She was held at the Royal Air Force hospital at Sana'a. Lt. Gray's body was buried in the city. His widow has been told of her husband's death.

City Hall to be enlarged at a cost of £250,000

Construction of a 12-storey office block extension to the Nairobi City Council will start early in 1968 subject to the approval of the whole Council.

A preliminary plan of the extension estimated at £250,000 has been submitted to the General Purpose Committee of the Council by the City Engineer.

The extension will be built on the car park on the Queenway side of the City Hall and the plan includes basement parking. The aim of £250,000 for the construction of the first stage of the block is expected to be approved by the Council's Finance Committee in the 1967 draft Capital Estimates.

ACCOMMODATION SHORTAGE

A spokesman for the Council said that the number of staff had increased considerably in all departments over the last few years and an acute problem of accommodation had arisen.

With the introduction of PAYE, the National Social Security Fund and the National Hospital Fund further recruitment of staff had become necessary and it was considered that by the time the proposed new block was completed in two to three years' time, the six floor towers would be required for City Hall activities.

It had also been suggested that initially the six upper floors should be leased to Government or outside organisations.

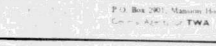

BRITAIN STALES ON RHODESIA Cabinet meeting fails to decide talks issue

The talk did not resume last week, as had been expected. Observers in London said they still expected the discussions to resume at some point, but that the British Prime Minister, Mr. Wilson, was likely to have another meeting with his top Ministers before making a scheduled statement to Parliament, either this week or next. Britain's special envoy to East and Central Africa, Mr. Malcolm Fraser, was called to yesterday's meeting. Mr. Malcolm Fraser, the Foreign Secretary, Mr. Stewart, the Defence Secretary, Mr. Healey, the Minister for Commonwealth Affairs, Mr. Judith Hart, who is widely believed in political quarters in London that the discussions between British and Rhodesian officials about whether a basis exists for a negotiated settlement of the Rhodesia problem, have failed to make any headway.

Scope may be enlarged

There is doubt about whether the talks can be resumed in their present form or whether they will have to take the form of a wider, possibly involving Commonwealth, participation. They have been made for Sir Roy Welensky, Mr. Fraser, Prime Minister of the now-defunct Central Africa Federation, to see Mr. Wilson in London, but British officials said they might meet the Commonwealth Secretary, Mr. Stewart, tomorrow.

The only way, says rebel leader

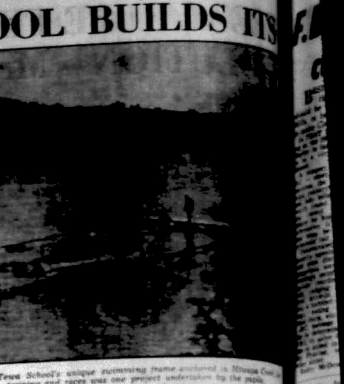
