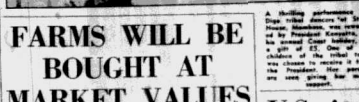

## Pay award for distributive trade employees

**SALARY** awards to members of the Union of Commercial, Food and Allied Workers were announced yesterday by the Kenya Industrial Court. The awards follow a dispute between the union and the Distributive and Allied Traders Association.

The Court President, Mr. S. S. Ochieng, said the award had been made after a long and difficult process. He said the award was based on the principle of parity with other employees in the same industry. The award was for a 10% increase in the basic rate of pay, with a corresponding increase in allowances and benefits.

The Court awarded an increase of 10% for all grades on all 111 of the 100 per cent scale. For the other 100 per cent scale, the award was 8% for the lower grades and 10% for the higher grades. The award was effective from August 1, 1965.

At least 100 employees of the Distributive and Allied Traders Association were on strike in Nairobi when the award was announced. The strike was called in protest against the award, which the union felt was inadequate.

The award was a landmark decision for the union, as it was the first time that the Court had awarded a 10% increase in the basic rate of pay to a large number of employees in the same industry.

## President and Prime Minister in dispute

Yemen's troops are mounting a massive security operation in Sana'a and Taiz, facing that an open rift between supporters of President Sallal and the Prime Minister, Gen. Hassan al Amri.

Information reaching Aden from Republics Yemen confirmed suspicion of a dispute between the leaders. Observers pointed out that President Sallal has not met Gen. Amri since his arrival on Friday morning after an absence of nearly a year in Egypt.

Two Yemeni Republican Army units directed personally by Gen. Amri, tried unsuccessfully to take over Sana'a Airport on Thursday, according to Yemeni sources.

The sources said the attempt was foiled by the Egyptian Ambassador, Mr. Shikany, who arrived on the airport with superior Egyptian forces and persuaded Gen. Amri's men to leave.

The Egyptian-Yemeni border in Taiz and Sana'a has been closed for the last few days reports of separate meetings of the leaders and various Yemeni personalities.

Reports from Sana'a and Taiz said both airports were under heavy Egyptian guard. President Sallal's house was under heavy Egyptian guard. Gen. Amri had moved out of his residence and was living in the headquarters of the Egyptian command. Heavy reinforcements of Egyptian troops were reported in both cities.

# CYPRUS UNRECONCILED AS MANDATE NEARS EXPIRY

## PROTEST BY KLANSMEN AT BEATLES' U.S. CONCERT

**FIVE** members of the Ku Klux Klan protested against The Beatles in Washington last night, but could not complete with the enthusiastic response of 20,000 listeners.

The select members of the anti-Negro racial organization marched up and down the stadium entrance to stress their disapproval of the Beatles. John Lennon's comment that the British pop group were more popular than Jesus Christ, the audience screamed their wrath. The Beatles' manager, Brian Epstein, said that the Beatles were not in America to offend anyone, but to entertain.

## Special message

Hundreds of gifts were delivered at the stadium, including color telecasts of the Beatles performing in Las Vegas. The messages from Virginia were in Latin because they were made in honor of a Pope who was in town for which they attracted 1,000 spectators.

Earlier John Lennon, who had mentioned his remarks about Christianity were also misunderstood, told a Phoenix reporter he hardly thought about being a Beatle, was surprised to find what you have said.

Asked what The Beatles thought of Prime Minister Harold Wilson's programme to send Britain's troops to Malaya, I don't think much of it, but I will think back to it.

**YESTERDAY** was the sixth anniversary of Cyprus independence - but neither Greek nor Turkish-Cypriots had any plans for celebration.

The two communities have been in armed confrontation since bitter inter-communal fighting broke out just before Christmas 1963 and there are few signs of a reconciliation despite the efforts of United Nations mediators.

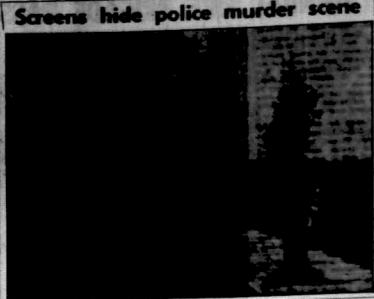
The 1963 clashes were short-lived but were followed up by proposals to amend the Constitution which would have favored the Greek-Cypriots. The amendments were rejected by a referendum. A separate fighting commission was set up to investigate the causes of the violence. The UN has proposed a 100,000-man force to be sent to Cyprus to oversee a Security Council resolution in the event of a breakdown of the present Government.

## More incidents

These incidents, with British troops sent to Cyprus in 1964 to guard the independence, security and constitution of Cyprus.

The UN peacekeeping force consists of 4,000 troops from Canada, Sweden, Denmark and Greece. It is headquartered in Nicosia, Cyprus, and has a detachment in British bases in Cyprus. The UN force has been criticized for its inactivity in the face of the violence.

The original dispute over the 1960 constitution, which gave equal rights to both Greek and Turkish-Cypriots, has not been resolved. The UN has been unable to mediate between the two communities.

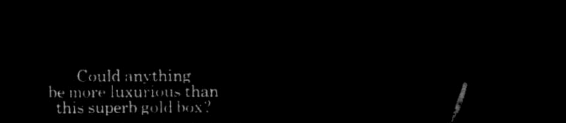

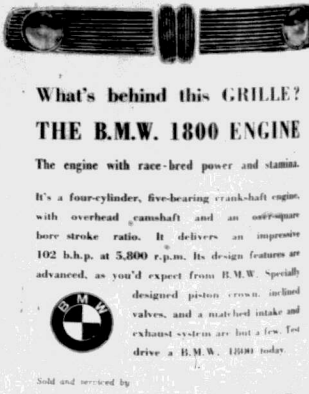

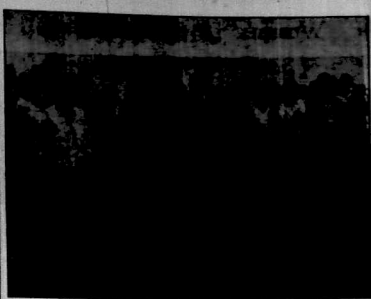

Loans have been allocated in the following municipalities: Nakuru, £100,000; a government townships, £100,000; and 11 counties, giving a total to £250,000.

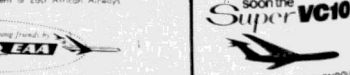
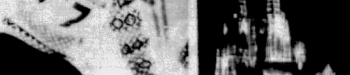

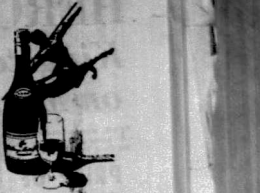
