Now Russians put woman into orbit

EIGHTEEN MILES FROM THE EQUATOR

THE first woman cosmonaut — **Lieutenant Valentina Tereshkova**, a 26-year-old Russian — yesterday took the first space "dash" in a joint flight programme with the cosmonaut **Lieut. Col. Valery Bykovsky**.

At their speeches they linked close together in attempts to rendezvous close together in the four miles of Russia's previous cosmonaut, **Andrian Nikolayev** and **Pavel Popov**, who flew last week.

"Good!" — Valentina's call-sign was broadcast at 12:30 p.m. to join "Hawk", the call-sign of her husband, family man **Igor**, who had last night spent a night in the Red Square where three days ago, **Happy** cosmonaut in the Red Square cheered this Soviet first, while Valentina smiled happily from her spacetuit in telecasts from the cosmos.

Only seconds difference

According to official figures, the space pair are orbiting the earth with only 12 seconds difference in their timing — with Valentina taking the longer, 884 minutes, while her husband, Valery, is 872 minutes.

They went a space tour in the Soviet Communist Party and a message to the cosmonauts. This said, "Have started carrying out joint space flight and established communication lines established between them."

Private investors major role in the new Kenya

Private investment, both from overseas and domestic sources, has a major role to play in the development of Kenya, the Kenya Government announced in a Seasonal Paper tabled in the House of Representatives yesterday afternoon. The paper bears the title "Observations on the Development of an Economic Survey Mission from the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development".

The Government considers that one of its main tasks during the next five-year period lies in creating conditions which will encourage investment designed to encourage private investment. As the Minister stated, the time was not ripe, nor were resources available, for a Government to invest in the private sector in order to encourage and agricultural development.

General agreement with the approach, so far as the long-term development programme is concerned, but the Seasonal Paper makes it clear that financing of £50,000,000 programme presented formidable difficulties.

About £25,000,000 would have to be raised from overseas sources and indications are that this would be the greater difficulty in raising that amount.

IMMEDIATE PROBLEM

The Government emphasizes the view that the main emphasis should be placed on measures to improve production rather than on welfare projects. Unproductive relief projects are considered to be undesirable.

Sound development projects in themselves will create a demand for more room within a development programme of those things which the Government regards as essential contributions both to the immediate production of employment and to the long-term development of the country.

A recurring theme in the paper is the importance of continued agricultural production. The paper states that the Government recognizes this and agrees that rapid investment in agriculture is essential to the expansion to come.

The Government endorses the Minister's strategy on industrialization, which will be to encourage the development of small-scale industries which are dependent on local raw materials and which are dependent on local markets.

Expansion of manufacturing production is a favourable climate for investment in Kenya. The Government's policy is to encourage investment in all types of manufacturing industry.

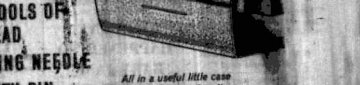

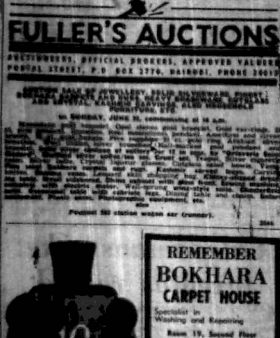

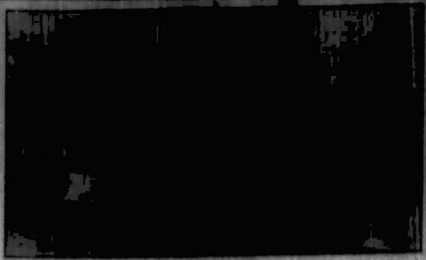
