Report to Mr. Kenyatta comes first

Simultaneous announcements were made in London and Nairobi on the report of a London talks on Kenya's independence conference and the timing of independence. [From London that night it was announced that the intention is to report on Tuesday in the Commons and on Wednesday in Parliament.]

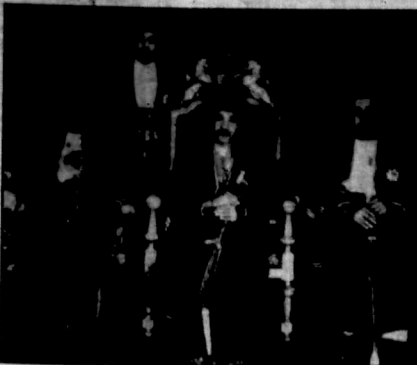

Troops will be out in a year from then

KENYA IS TO BECOME INDEPENDENT ON DECEMBER 12.

The Prime Minister, Mr. Kenyatta, gave the date to a crowded House of Representatives last night. He also said that a conference is to be convened in London towards the end of September to settle the final form of the Constitution, after preliminary talks in Nairobi.

British troops will leave the country within a year of independence and there will be discussion on possible future defence facilities between Britain and Kenya.

Mr. Kenyatta said it was hoped the East African Federation would be formed by the end of the year. He quoted from the White Paper on the recent London talks that British troops would not be sent to Kenya if U.N. membership is not applied for by the third week in December.

RUSSIA has rebuffed a bid by the small countries for greater representation in the U.N. Security Council and Economic and Social Council, asserting that no change was possible until Communist China received U.N. recognition.

The Soviet statement came after Mr. Alex Quaison-Sackey of Ghana had blamed both Russia and the United States for the situation in which there has been no amendment of the U.N. charter in 17 years despite a doubling of membership.

SUPPORT FOR CHARTER REVIEW

All who favoured an improvement in the activities and structure of the U.N. should work to that end, said Mr. Francis Plamondon, the U.S. rep. who said this argument was irrelevant. America strongly supported those who favoured Charter "most careful consideration" to the African case.

An expansion of membership of the two main committees of the U.N. Security Council members at 11 and 10 respectively, announced the Council members at 11. Mr. Quaison-Sackey proposed that a nine-member working group be set up to make contact with the permanent members of the Security Council and Mr. Plamondon said of his own accord he viewed the proposal sympathetically.

Mr. Quaison-Sackey urged the Soviet Union and the United States to "rethink their position." He was "not very happy" that Soviet "demands" should raise the issue of China in connection with the question of African representation, he said.

CHINA PROBLEM

It was not proposed that the United States and other countries proceed in willing to agree that a proper understanding should be reached on the China matter.

It urged the great Powers to understand the aspirations of the African people for proper representation of the main organs.

The Charter's delegate considered the time was inappropriate for a general review of the Charter, and suggested there could be a specific amendment to allow increased representation on the Security and Economic and Social Council.

Mr. Quaison-Sackey said there was nothing binding in the last gentlemen's agreement which arranged the present composition of seats on the two agencies.

Mr. Davis Tull of Ghana said that for African nations the question was one of "equality" — there had to be parity with white men. African states had been rebuffed to the U.N. they were not accepted.

'EXPEL PORTUGAL' CALL AT TALKS

AFRICAN nations have called for the withdrawal of Portugal from the International Conference of Education which opened in Geneva.

Mr. Aja Nwachuku and Mr. Abdoulaya Sangare, Education Ministers of Nigeria and Mali respectively, objected to the presence of Portugal because of her colonialist policy.

As well as the conference opened the two Ministers, who said they were speaking in the name of African countries, said to state that they could not sit at a meeting together with Portuguese.

South Africa was not invited to the 82-nation conference, which is discussing world educational problems.

The conference is jointly organized by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization and the International Office of Education in Geneva.

The chairman, Professor Beddoe Turpin of Turin, asked the Nigerian and Mali Ministers to present their demand for the Portuguese withdrawal in a written form.

The African and Arab delegates met privately to draft the text of a resolution, asking for the expulsion of Portugal.

U.S. expels Soviet attache

THE State Department has announced the expulsion of a Soviet diplomat from the United States and charged him with "highly improper" activities.

He was identified as General K. Savitskiy, an attache at the Soviet Embassy in Washington. The Department acted in a Note to exchange for the "nomadic" diplomat of Mr. Sevast'yanov.

The U.S. Note charged that he had attempted to recruit for espionage by threatening reprisals to members of his family living in the Soviet Union if he was expelled.

The U.S. official also said that the Soviet diplomat had attempted to recruit a Soviet agent, who would be used to carry out espionage activities.

The Russian diplomat was approached by the American Security Service, which arranged the present composition of seats on the two agencies.

POPE SALUTES AFRICA'S NEW STATES

POPE PAUL paid a special tribute to the newly-independent nations of Africa when he addressed special delegates from some 90 countries which attended his convocation. Speaking in the Vatican's Sixtine Chapel where he was elected Pope, the Pontiff recalled his visit to Africa last year.

He said: "When Providence took us some months ago to the shores of the immense African continent, shrouded in mystery for centuries, we seemed to feel the stirrings and calls of those new countries, so sensitive to spiritual values and so happy in seeing their young energies admitted into the comity of nations."

"We returned in spirit to the times of the first apostolic conquests and came back to our mind the words of Saint Peter, when the first pagans entered into the Church."

"I see clearly enough that God makes no distinction between man and man. He welcomes anybody, whatever his race, who fears Him and loves what He demands."

"We then felt our hearts invaded by the same joy and the same hope which stirred the heart of the first Pope."

Language of trust The Pope said the delegates before him represented "the world in miniature, with its five continents, its races, its peoples, its various cultures."

He declared that he would have liked to have greeted them all in their own languages and in their own cultures.

The Pope said the Church does not consider him the possessor of anything, but only a servant of God, for the sake of the language of friendship and trust.
