## NO CHANGE 'Majority of five seats for Coalition'

**Standard Staff Reporter Dar es Salaam.**  
**ZANZIBAR'S** present Government will remain in office. The results of the election in the protectorate are 18 for the alliance which is formed by the Zanibar Nationalist Party and the Zanibar and Pemba People's Party, and 13 for the Afro-Shirazi Party. The Zanibar Nationalist Party won 12 constituencies and the Zanibar and Pemba People's Party six.  
The final results of the election were received quietly by the people. A few hundreds gathered at Raha Leo, the civic centre where the broadcasting studios were making the announcement, but the majority of the islanders stayed at home and listened to the radio.  
After the results were known, groups of people gathered and talked quietly together. Sheikh Mohamed and the Prime Minister and leader of the Z.P.P., who was in Pemba yesterday, will return to Zanzibar today and it is to be asked by the British Resident, Sir George Manning to form a Government.

### At same time as Kenya

Sheikh Ali Muhaimin, leader of the Z.N.P., said the policy of the Government would be to ensure that the immediate task was to set a date for the Constitutional conference. He said that Zanzibar would attain independence at the same time as Kenya.  
Sheikh Ali said he was "thankful to God" that the election had been so peaceful and went so well. He said the mood of the alliance was not so much one of jubilation but one of thanksgiving. His own personal task would be to bring unity to the people of Zanzibar, and to make all people co-operate in the perspective of parties.  
He said that since by the provisions had been below normal during the elections, security had been adequate and the election would go down in history as a day to all those who had worked for the party's victory and to those who had worked towards a peaceful election.

## NUCLEAR TEST BAN TALKS

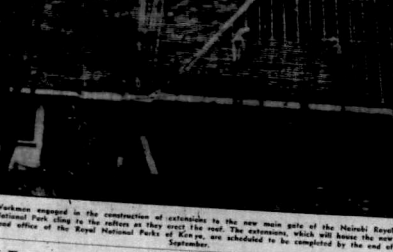

## Kenya is among the 'top eight' Commonwealth countries for the number of students at British universities

Mr. Krushchev said those who were bitten by bug of war were notified by the Chinese. The Chinese warning against the test ban treaty said that only a total ban on nuclear weapons could be effective. An editorial in the People's Daily, official organ of the Chinese Communist Party, said that to fall into a Western trap at the Three Power nuclear test ban talks being held in Moscow.

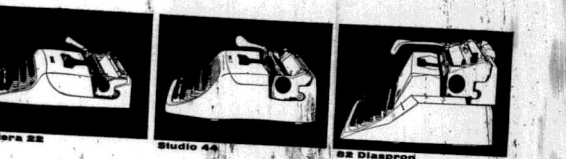
