London's
"Earliest"
"Alert"
BUT NO LARGE
SCALE RAIDS

London's air raid alert last night was the earliest since the intensive anti-bombing training, known as "Operation Blackout", was started in the city at a great height and speed and were greeted with heavy gunfire. At one time four raiders approached London from different directions, but were turned away by the barrage.

Many planes were also over the North-West and South-West England and East Scotland. The West Midlands had three raids during the night and some damage was done to houses in one town. Bombs also fell on an East Anglian town.

During daylight yesterday the enemy made three attempts to raid London, but were driven off each time by our fighters and anti-aircraft guns.

Some enemy planes were destroyed during the day, six of our fighters were hit, but three of the pilots are safe.

Major Hopper states that at Birmingham in Kent a Messerschmitt tried to "roof-ramp" his way to safety, but the pilot was forced to bale out and would have been killed, but for the fact that he fell in the branches of a tree.

A meteorological report that London's "alert" last night began earlier and ended later than any they have yet had. The air Ministry says the attack began at dusk and was aimed on East-Scotland and East-London, but it did not do any harm, except on a large scale, until the bombs subsided and only intermittent bombs were dropped during this morning when the activity increased.

The number of casualties so far reported is large though it is difficult to give exact figures. In East-Scotland and the Midlands, and central premises were damaged in East-Scotland and the Midlands, but there are few reports of damage in London.

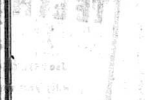

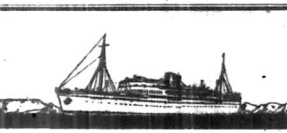

N. KENYA FARMING PROBLEMS

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT].
TANA.
A number of farmers from the Nairobi and North Kenya districts gathered at the Nairobi Sports Club to meet Capt. F. O.B. Wilson on Thursday last. An informal discussion on farm production problems was held.
Farmers were glad to receive a definite statement as to what crops will be required—principally wheat and vegetables—and were satisfied with the probable price that will be paid for a definite quantity. However, they would be happier were Government to purchase, so has been done in the case of fish, from the producer at the farm.
Labour problems were discussed, and it is hoped that the important part of production, and the vital part that Nairobi plays in this essential part of the country, will be established for farm labour. Everyone realizes how loyal the natives are as witness their rush to enlist for military employment, and the various subscriptions in cash and kind that have been made from the Nairobi area. However, the native has not yet been brought to realize that some machines are at his disposal, and that, as a consequence, they engaged in farming activities are essential to his welfare and to his relations and friends in the Reserve.
Crops and Game
Considering the crop of wheat and vegetables in addition to the already important maize industry, could it be possible to diversify the industry, but it was pointed out, crops can never reach the production stage when year loads of paper are up every green thing.
A hope was expressed as has been, to see before that now that the Government remain on the land and those who have been in the past, the Government should make an effort to bring about the milk-borne industry might undertake to realize the same machine as a practical proposition. Also, it was suggested, the meat and hides might be considered, which most makes excellent toilet tissue. So far as the above are concerned, there is any amount of fat running round on the food that might well be converted into glycerine for the manufacture of explosives. It would give some satisfaction to think that the above were serving a useful purpose at last.
These crops will be to feed the troops but, unless the game is kept within reasonable limits, there will be little food. That military hotels, returning empty through the various districts, might reflect farm produce at reduced prices to the troops, and give and carry this to the nearest military centre, was another suggestion.
This show interesting and instructive meeting closed with a 1947 report of the results in Capt. F. O. B. Wilson.

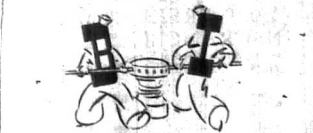
KENYA GOLD PRODUCTION

Problem of Maintenance for Soldiers' Dependents

LEIPZIG FAIR A FAILURE Upset By R.A.F.

FROM OUR SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT (LONDON)

One of the most encouraging signs of the South African public's heart and soul in support of the Government's policy is provided by the astonishing response to the £250,000 South African War Loan. This loan of £100,000,000 was opened in London on the 1st of August, and the Minister of Finance, Mr. H. H. Hodson, was able to announce that applications had already been received for £15,000,000.

Mr. Hodson expects that the small gap that is left will be closed long before the due date, December 1st. This response is regarded as a magnificent piece of evidence of confidence on the part of the public in the Government.

The Government's request for £15,000,000 in public financial support shows that there is an abundance of money in the Union for war purposes.

The Government-General's Fund

It also however, rather tends to deepen the mystery of the public's comparative apathy towards the Government-General's Fund, which for some reason or other, does not seem to have caught the imagination of most people in this part of the world.

It is now generally admitted in many sections of the press that the Government-General's Fund is not doing as well as it should, and that far greater interest will have to be taken in it if it is to fulfil its proper function of providing for the dependents of service-men and meeting all the postwar demands which will be made on it in addition to the heavy current out-goings.

Some people blame lack of proper publicity while others explain the short-fall by the fact that so many other demands have been made on the public. It is true that there has been a multiplicity of funds launched for various specific purposes—a large one which has only just closed, being the London Relief Fund, to which the public, especially in Durban, has responded very generously.

Other funds which have made heavy demands on the pockets of the public have been the "Spiced Flamingo" Fund and the Home Comforts Fund, both of which have taken large sums of money which it is contended would otherwise have gone to the Government-General's Fund.

Government's Concern

Another explanation is that many people are of the opinion that the Government-General's Fund is being used for a purpose which should properly be a matter for Government expenditure under a Treasury Vote.

The argument is often heard that the Government will maintain to wives, mothers and sisters and other relatives who have lost the financial support contributed by a member of the family who has joined up, should come from a general tax on the community and not, as is now the case, from a grant from the Government-General's Fund.

There have been protests about this from the United Party branch meetings and the matter has often been raised in letters to the press. It is possible that the Government will have to revise its whole system of paying maintenance to soldiers' dependents in default of this, a very much greater effort will have to be made to raise subscription on behalf of the Government-General's Fund.

BIG SUPPORT FOR S. A. WAR LOAN
Problem Of Maintenance For Soldiers' Dependents

(FROM OUR SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT) Johannesburg.

One of the most encouraging signs that the South African public is heart and soul in support of the war is the subscription to the S. A. War Loan. The lists for the 10th and 11th issues were published on October 27th and four days later the Minister of Finance, Mr. J. H. Hofmeyr, was able to announce that applications had already been received for £15,000,000.

Mr. Hofmeyr expects that the small gap that is left will be closed long before the due date, December 11. This response is regarded as a magnificent testimonial to the part of the public in the Government. This swift answer to the Government's request for aid is a credit to the public, and there is no lack of money in the Union for war purposes.

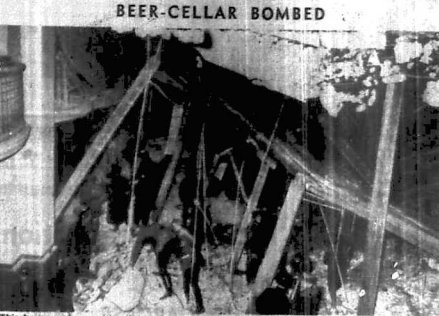

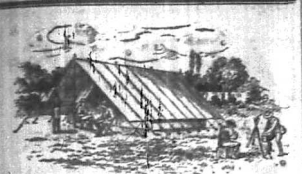
