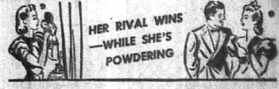

BLAST EFFECTS Not So Bad As Expected

STANDARD CORRESPONDENT

Through eye and ear we have all learnt much about bombs and their effects during the past weeks, and the following has been particularly efficacious in providing knowledge to the assistance of the Civil Defence Research Committee.

Experimental work on blast and other effects, carried out with the aid of defences experts, has shown many pronounced ideas.

Blast is not so terribly destructive as was generally held, but that is only because it is so very quick. It is in the immediate vicinity of the explosion a violent and noisy as violent as the bomb itself, and in a few minutes it is over. It is not so long as it is so noisy, but the noise, which is really the gas that is burning explosively, is very short-lived.

4,000 FT. A SECOND

By way of a distinct idea, from the burst of an ordinary bomb of say, 500 lbs. weight, the blast travels rapidly, and at 4 ft. is almost inaudible in an open space. On buildings in contact, however, the velocity of 4,000 ft. per second, but nearly four times the speed of sound.

Within a radius of 10 yards the blast exerts its full force from the point of view of effect anywhere in that circle except a direct hit. Outside, however, is not believed to be lethal, except on very close range.

It might kill through shock to the heart or lesions of the lungs owing to the amount having been closed, but not through the mere velocity of the gas.

Immediately behind the gas there follows a pulsating air wave and the first pulsation appears to be always inwards towards the bursting point. Noble fronts which will have the edge of a bomb crater generally fall, for rubble or particles are blown up.

It used to be held that up to a certain distance blast blew windows in and beyond that distance it blew them out. This is not true. There is no such thing as a blast wave. Many of the fresh effects of which we are all so weary are due to this.

In one case, as narrated by the researchers, the blast blew in the windows of a room. The door immediately opposite was pulled open by the following action: palm and the glass from the window fell down the street through into the passage beyond.

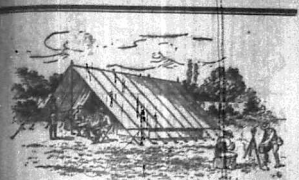
But here, also, as in the case of the blast wave in the air, the effects rapidly grow less far away from the bursting point. The musical notes vary with the nature of the soil and of course with the size of the bomb. But with a heavy bomb it does not extend much beyond that point.

Windows are shattered easily by blast, but much less easily if they are slightly open or free to rattle.

One of the most curious blast effects was seen when a bomb struck a low building in London some days ago. It cut the building in two, with the result that a people in the street could see half of the beds, with the beds underneath, but perilously near the edge.

Escaped Airman's Story

A young Norwegian, Olaf Hanson, who with two companions, escaped from Oslo at the end of September, has written a story of his escape from the Nazis, and how he has now gone to Canada to complete training as a wireless pilot. Here, then, is his story of how his companions live with the German Army of Occupation, what they are thinking, how they divert their minds and how they work for vengeance.

STANDARD CORRESPONDENT

Through the loud-speakers a voice calls from London. It is the news in Norwegian. Hitler's hordes have occupied Norway. They laid in public places. Black-clad German soldiers ready to pounce on any indigenous citizen who may show his disapproval of Germans with word or deed.

Oslo has now been occupied. You can never be sure that the stranger beside you in the train or at your table in a cafe is not a Quiling. Yet, in spite of all these repressive activities, the free, independent spirit of Norway is still alive. It is manifested in various ways. One of them is that almost constant switching-on of the radio at the hour of the news in Norwegian from London.

The Germans have tried to stop it, but they have failed. So far Dr. Getzoff's hand has been held. One said, the impression that Hitler is reluctant to apply to Norway the terrorist treatment he has inflicted on some of the countries he has occupied. For instance the Norwegian national anthem is still played in the Nazi-controlled radio programme and at public meetings, but after the Hordt West song—the Brown-shirt marching song—and Deutschland, ihre Allee.

Leathed by All Under orders to make orders he goes to the address to the Norwegian in public places and, in various ways, he tries to convince the Norwegians that their role is good for them. He says he does not need to add that they are entirely false. No words of their order can convey the feeling in which these Nazis are held by every Norwegian. Quiling represented less than one per cent of Norwegians when the Nazis marched in, but the

Not more than a month ago I was sitting in a cinema in Oslo, watching the Great Pyrenees film. Usually in Norwegian cinemas the German news reels, but on this occasion it happened to follow the big film.

In the dark as the news reel had started a man stood up somewhere in the room and started to sing the German National Anthem. Soon every man and woman in that cinema was standing and singing fervently. They were all flushed they stropped out quickly, leaving the news reel to run its course in an empty theatre.

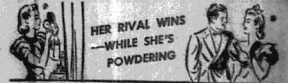
I know the music-halls in Oslo where comedians crack anti-Nazi jokes. The abolition of such matters as the invasion of Britain are so easily and manfully contrived that while the Norwegian audience roar with laughter, German comedians actually fall along the point and wonder what the socially-minded Norwegians are laughing at. "Gave 't'rouse!"

In Oslo you might see here and there a young woman with her hair cut short right up to the poll—very rare sight in Norway, where short-cut fashions have never been popular. These girls who have been seen associating with German soldiers. Their hair has been cut off by the street.

That is I suppose, a practice you would not expect of Norwegians, but it shows the force behind that which is a naturally orderly people by the sight of Norwegian girls walking out with the loaded Nazis. Recently it was announced that Norwegian women, and all Norwegians were ordered to listen to it. The speech was devoted entirely to threats of dire punishment to any Norwegian who attempted to prevent a Norwegian girl from associating with a German soldier.

Although, as I have indicated, Norwegian requests to Berlin if they are denied because Hitler appears to have a high regard for every expression of national sentiment. Everywhere, and frequently they strike.

A friend in Bergen printed and circulated a certain report of King Haakon's reply to the Nazi demand for his abdication, which only a coloured summary appeared in our German-Gad newspaper. A Quiling friend told me that he had not been seen since the German news book, but saw it. Shortly before I escaped I was

WIDER POWERS FOR DISTRICT COUNCILS

The Bill to amend the Local Government (District Councils) Ordinance, 1938, passed its second reading at Wednesday's session of the Legislative Council. It was introduced by Mr. C. E. Mortimer, in his capacity of Commissioner for Local Government.

Mr. Mortimer explained that the measure was designed to effect a wide range of amendments in the local government machinery. Taking the various clauses, he explained that the Bill was introduced with the object of allowing a vacancy on a district council to remain unfilled. Except in the case of Indian members, the Government was obliged, as the law presently stood, to fill a vacancy by nomination if no candidate offered himself for election. Under the law as previously applied, a district council which had filed a district council was empowered to nominate and elect a member to fill the vacancy.
