Resolution of Support Passed

A meeting of Kenya V.A.D.s was held at the Theatre Royal on Friday evening under the Chairmanship of the President, the British Red Cross Society (Kenya Branch), Mrs. A. A. Leitch.

The Director of the Red Cross Kenya, Dr. P. B. Gregory, and the Director of the St. John's Organization, Mr. A. C. Carruthers, attended the meeting which, in its conclusion, passed them on the following resolutions:

The Chairman, in opening the meetings and stating the objects for which it was called, emphasized that only V.A.D.s could take part in the subsequent discussions.

How They Are Working

Out of 200 V.A.D.s enrolled, some of whom were not yet trained, 117 were actually being employed on some form of service in Kenya, of whom 20 were full-time V.A.D.s. The military authorities, 88 on A.R.P. service and six in a hospital capacity, and considered that this figure in proportion to the Colony's population indicated a state of affairs that called for congratulation. By comparison with more largely populated areas the figure was a particularly good one, he indicated.

As to the fact that V.A.D.s could not be usually employed, he said that, if anything the difficulty was to get sufficient trained V.A.D.s for the jobs in which they could be employed.

Light Air Attacks on Britain

MAINLY ON THE LONDON AREA

December 1. German air attacks on Britain on Friday night were mainly on the London area, but a few scattered raids for some time. After an early 'light' raid, many of the frequent intervals and many intense incendiary and high-explosive attacks dealt with in incendiary raids were reported from many districts.

The raiders had to contend with a heavy barrage and many of them were driven off before they could reach the target areas. Some planes were also reported during the night, but they did not reach the target areas.

The Official Communique

The Air Ministry has issued a communique in connection with the raids which states that the enemy attacks were mainly directed against the London area. Many fires were caused, but most of them were soon put out and were under control.

Damage was done to a number of houses and some other buildings. A few people were killed and others injured.

Light Activity

There are only few reports of German activity over Britain last night.

London had two 'alarms' and a few bombs. Reports so far say that the damage was negligible. In the early part of the night German raiders attempted to attack a town in Southern England, but were driven away by anti-aircraft fire.

There were no reports of German activity over Britain on Saturday. We had two 'alarms' but both nights are quiet.

U.S.-SOVIET TALKS

December 1. Considerable interest is being taken in London by news of reports from Washington of conversations between the Soviet Ambassador and Mr. Bernard Baruch.

Mr. Baruch had expressed the hope that these diplomatic talks will continue and said that so far they had been friendly and constructive. (Reuter.)

The Problem of the V.A.D.

For the time being, this is the last word which has been put on the subject of the East African V.A.D. As last week's meeting agreed, this is no time for argument on whether Every V.A.D. is anxious only to get on with her job and if she finds within the next few weeks that as a result of the criticism steps have been taken to enable her to give more freely of her services to the war effort she will be content.

couaged to believe that they are of some use, and if they are extremely lucky they may be shown practical work. But in many cases they have not been so fortunate and in consequence they have been discouraged.

The fact of the matter seems to be that the mere possession of a certificate of the kind which has been issued in the past two years does not fit the average V.A.D. for really useful hospital work and the hospital authorities have consequently to train volunteer personnel. Consequently it appears to us to be necessary for the Red Cross and other authorities to examine at once the question of how to provide more efficient and more practical training for training for women who are applying to work in hospitals. If that can be done in co-operation with the military hospital authorities, all the better. If not, then some means must be found to overcome the difficulty on which Every V.A.D. is sent to a military hospital who is not only able to undertake tasks which will interest and encourage her but it also accords with the hospital authorities as a person sufficiently trained to be given an instructive work.

In that connection it is also important to review the question of part-time service. The present system of an odd afternoon or a day a month is of no use either to the V.A.D. or to the hospitals. The aim should be to ascertain approximately what number of well-qualified V.A.D.s will be required and set about training for an adequate and dependable number who will be reasonably certain of obtaining employment. We have practically wasted five months in this way, while conditions were static, many of our V.A.D.s could have been given a valuable experience in military hospitals and they would have been ready for the tasks that will face the women in months to come. Instead of following a practical policy we have been involved in a haphazard system of partially training hundreds of women, leading them to believe there was work for them, then allowing them to find out that many were not really wanted and at irregular intervals for the most ordinary jobs only reluctantly accepted with what was expected to be allowed to do.

Frankly we are not interested in the arguments put forward by the South African and Rhodesian medical authorities. The women of East Africa are willing and anxious to do their share and should not be allowed aside as newcomers can apparently pick and choose their jobs. The Lady Moore Hospital is surely a case in point. There is no reason why it should not have been entirely staffed by East African women. It is we are told that two V.A.D.s have been placed there. So far we are concerned with the East Africa only military V.A.D.s and whether the patients are white or black (South African) does not matter. They are all as deserving of our attention we can give them and the chance to serve should be shared by all. 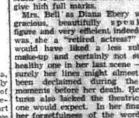

"Legs" stated the trained ladies with dressings and attended minor operations in the wards and took their turn in the operating theatres with the Theatre Sisters, attended lectures, etc.

It is most unfair that the V.A.D.s having done their training and worked in the Hospitals voluntarily since the outbreak of war, after 18 months of their work, they are told they are no longer required and are to be replaced by returned servicemen from both home and abroad. I feel sure that many of these V.A.D.s would have been glad to continue their work in the Hospitals and in the wards, but the fact that they are to be replaced by returned servicemen is a pity. Now COAST MEMBER ON POST-WAR PROBLEMS

Some interesting suggestions on the tackling of post-war problems were advanced in a paper read by the Nairobi Rotary Club on Friday by Mr. S. Y. Cooke, Member of the East Africa Coast on Kenya Legislative Council, at a meeting of the Executive of the Club on this occasion.

Mr. Cooke, who presided, expressed the hope that the recently announced Executive Committee would be the forerunner of other bodies set up to deal now with post-war problems in Kenya.

Mr. Cooke began by answering the question that we must consider all our energies on winning the war, because if we lose, any time spent on post-war problems would be spent in vain. He stated that we should be re-armed with the fruits of victory if at all possible. Mr. Cooke found little fault with unskilled and difficult problems. While there were many people who could not be spared from their work, they might have the time and inclination to devote themselves to post-war problems. Moreover, if the British Cabinet had time to appoint a post-war reconstruction committee, a comparable body would be the Empire Council.

Labour Matters
Mr. Cooke stated that we should be re-armed with the fruits of victory if at all possible. He found little fault with unskilled and difficult problems. While there were many people who could not be spared from their work, they might have the time and inclination to devote themselves to post-war problems. Moreover, if the British Cabinet had time to appoint a post-war reconstruction committee, a comparable body would be the Empire Council.

Mr. Cooke mentioned that one often heard it said that the African was not ready for higher education. That one could not have elementary education with qualified teachers, and then there were secondary schools, and one could not have secondary schools for Africans without intermediate schools for Africans. There was a large number of Africans in medical, veterinary and other professions, and their employment was desirable not only to certain sections of the African community, but because the African was the best teacher of Africans. The speaker charged that he was fully alive to the necessity of hastening the settlement of the post-war problems. 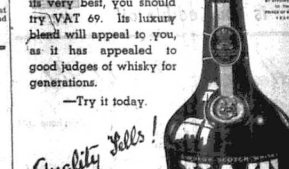



BRITAIN'S BIGGEST WAR PROBLEMS

What Public Think

December 4. Mr. Edward Montgomery in a broadcast today said that the New Chronicle had published the interesting results of a Gallup poll of public opinion taken in Britain on the question of what people thought the most important war problem for the British Government to solve this winter. Mr. Montgomery said that the report and was a synopsis. He pointed out to the American listeners that the Gallup surveys taken in Britain were carried out by the same organization under the direction of Dr. George Gallup, of the same manner as such surveys are taken in the United States, where they have established themselves securely in the past few years as a reliable indication of public opinion on all sorts of questions.

He said it was remarkable that the Government should have such faith in the precision of the results of the poll to be taken and that the people themselves feel at free to give their opinions without any reserve.

He said that the poll questions asked each month is: In general, do you approve or disapprove of the way Mr. Churchill is in charge of the war? Mr. Churchill is Prime Minister? "Oh, you imagine," said Mr. Montgomery, "that would be the question in Germany if the question were asked of the public there, you approve or disapprove of Hitler as leader of the nation?" He said that the results of the poll were that the people themselves feel at free to give their opinions without any reserve.

Biggest Problem—What do you think is the most important war problem for the British Government to solve this winter? The people were given a list of 12 war problems from which to choose their own individual reply.

The answers showed that the biggest part of the people who answered stopped it or giving the people's protection from it. (2) The war marine was on merchant shipping and the effect on the transportation of British supplies.

Like the night bombing, the technical side of dealing with the U boat and surface raider must be left to the Admiralty, but there were other ways of helping the merchant ships by further rationing and the securing of the use of other ports and bases, both for merchant shipping and for the building of more ships, both in British yards and overseas.

These figures showed almost a large number of the people of Britain of all classes and ages and of both sexes were quite fully aware of the gravity of the most dangerous peril which they felt was most overcome if it was to fight its way out of the war.

Secret Plans—What was being done in active defence must remain the secret of the Air Force staff, the anti-aircraft gunners, the balloon barrage men and scientific working with them. That they were working 24 hours a day no one doubted for a moment.

On the other side—passive defence—steps on the ground taken near one of the rivers and towns had been taken to guard against the night attacks could not see and judge for himself how high for the men and women (I will defend workers, women, fire fighters, ambulance drivers and rescue squads, all of whom were doing their job manfully. But much remained to be done in improving other accommodations, so much that one wondered at the magnitude of the task involved. It was somewhat on the same scale as the turning of the steam over the New York City of build-

SIR ALI BIN SALIM: A GREAT ARAB LEADER

Tributes in Legislature and Supreme Court

LONG PUBLIC SERVICE

OBITUARY:

THE East African Standard regrets to announce the death of Sir Ali bin Salim bin Khalid bin Salim, K.B.E., C.M.G., F.R.S., a member of the Kenya Legislative Council, who died at his home in Nairobi at four o'clock yesterday morning. The funeral took place in the afternoon with full Military and Naval honours and was attended by members of all communities. The Provincial Council and the District Commissioner and the District Commissioner represented the Chief Secretary.

When Kenya Legislative Council resumed its session in the Assembly Hall yesterday His Excellency Sir Henry Mores made reference to the death of Sir Ali bin Salim and to the deep regret and sense of personal loss which would be shared by all Members.

"This melancholy event," he said, "marks the passing of a figure in the public life of the Colony the like of whom we shall not see again. While always a champion of Arab interests as the Coast, his sympathy and generosity knew no communal boundary and he was devoted to the furtherance of the prosperity of this Colony as a whole. I feel sure that you will wish that we should have a resolution in token of our sympathy with his relatives."

Standing orders were accordingly suggested and the Chief Secretary, Mr. G. M. Renise, moved the following:

That this Council has learned with the greatest regret of the death of Sir Ali bin Salim at a stroke this morning, and desires to put on record its appreciation of the distinguished public services rendered by Sir Ali during his long career and to convey to his relatives his deep sympathy in the passing of one whose memory will long be cherished by all communities. For his loyalty to the Crown and his unflinching integrity in the fur-

therance of every good cause. Mr. Renise declared that while his own acquaintance with Sir Ali had been a very short one, he was impressed by a former Kenya official of the outstanding personality of Sir Ali bin Salim in this Colony. Sir Ali, then the Chief Secretary had been struck by his generosity and the great regard in which he had been held by all sections of the community.

A Great Patriot—

Lord Francis Scott, seconding the motion and submitting that he could justly speak for the whole unofficial community in the Colony, said he had the privilege and honour of the friendship of Sir Ali bin Salim for 20 years.

"I think we all know the magnificent part he played in East Africa, his patriotism and magnificent generosity in all purposes of benefit to the territories, as well as for his great generosity as a personal friend to his countrymen, Sir Ali bin Salim had a great patriot and a man of unbounded energy."

Mr. A. P. Patel associated himself with the sentiment expressed on behalf of Indian Exalted Members. Sir Ali's charities had become well-known at the Coast, and knew no bounds of religion or religion.

Mr. H. R. Montgomery, representing Native interests, said he had always found Sir Ali bin Salim a most useful adviser in the course of administration.

Mr. A. J. de Groot (Mombasa) and Mr. G. Nies (Mombasa) declared that all communities had a close friend and wise counsellor in Sir Ali bin Salim.

The motion was passed by the House standing in silence.

Among his many public benefactions may be mentioned his presentation of a ship to the Navy as headquarters, his provision of a holiday camp for children from the Highlands, generous gifts of money to funds for war purposes including the purchase of aircraft, the restoration of his historic palace built in Mombasa, and a gift of money to the Admiralty to buy Christmas presents for the families of officers and men killed in the present war.

Public Administrator

He was also the organizer of the first effort made by the Arab community in Mombasa on behalf of the Kenya War Welfare Fund. A benevolent fund was raised in Mombasa in 1939 to demonstrate the public appreciation of his services and over ten years earlier the community immediately agreed for him by raising his portrait in one of the Mombasa buildings. The ceremony being performed by the then Governor of the Colony, Sir Edward Grigg. Sir Ali had given the community the fund on which the portrait was built.

During the last 40 years Sir Ali had a very deep personal interest in education and particularly in the education of the young Arab. Indeed as long ago as 1906 he was the first to provide for the education of Arab children and he founded and endowed the Arab College at Mombasa. He was also another one at Mombasa. It is recorded of him that in the early days when fees had to be paid he often provided them out of his own pocket.

The late Llewellyn recorded that when he was Lt. Colonel at Mombasa he followed the custom of his people, was a slave dealer, but when the British Government came he decided to throw in his lot with it and in turn joined those whose business it was to suppress Arab slave dealers.

A Priest of Loyalty

A tragedy gave the young Llewellyn one of his earliest opportunities of proving his loyalty to the British Empire. The Company's Commissioner at Mombasa was absent while sitting on his own verandah and his murderer appeared unbidden. The Llewellyn's intimate knowledge of the priest led him to the authorities. His fair for criminal investigation, resulted in the arrest of the murderer. In 1902 Sir Ali was appointed Lt. Colonel of the post he gave great assistance to the authorities in bringing to an end the rebellion in Mombasa. During the campaign an officer, Captain Lawrence was killed and the ship took over the command and great personal risk involved in bringing back the body of Captain Lawrence to the Christian burial. For his action Sir Ali bin Salim was highly commended by the civil and military authorities and Captain Lawrence's family presented him with a sword.

In 1904 he visited England and was there presented to the Prince of Wales, later King Edward VII, and in referring to East Africa was appointed Assistant Lt. Colonel of Mombasa under his father. In 1907 there occurred at Mombasa a murder which became a case of note. A ship's engineer named London went ashore at Port Bell, and down to get by a spring and was murdered. For several days his death stood as a mystery. Eventually Sir Ali bin Salim's personal investigation and brought to justice three men who were locally regarded as

witneds. They had engaged on a case of white murder starting with a white girl and ending with a white man.

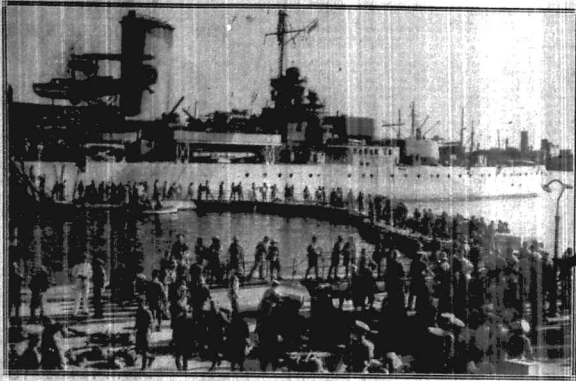

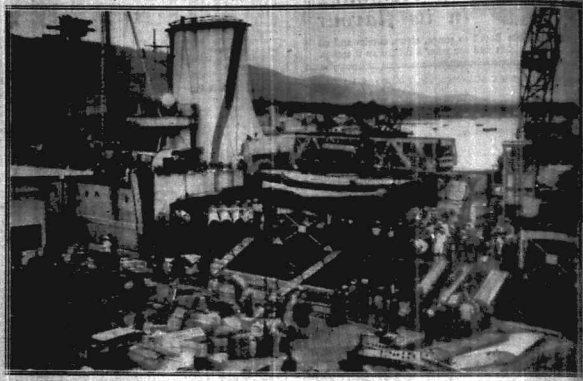

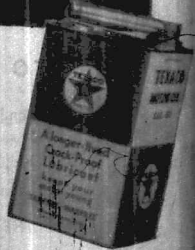

THE DEEP-RENT

The long suppressed exasperation caused by the antics of the Ossewa Brandweg burst out when the Transvaal United Party Congress met in Pretoria last month. An insistent demand was made for strong action by the Government and delegates from all parts of the Transvaal related instances of the subversive activities of the movement.



They were reassured somewhat by Mr. J. H. Hofmeyr, the Minister of Finance, who spoke on subversive propaganda in the schools and hinted that if this did not cease the provinces must complain if education were taken out of their hands by the Government. There was an answer to a delegate who alleged that German propaganda was freely being made in the schools and that children were being induced to take subversive notes. Another delegate told of school children on the Rand who were being asked to pay donations of a shilling to the Ossewa Brandweg, and she said that she knew of a certain school which hissed and booed films of the King and General Smuts.

A vast body of evidence of a new kind was brought forward at the Congress and Ministers have obviously considered it, even if only a fraction of it. It is not surprising that the Government has been over-riding its own policy of non-interference in the internal affairs of the provinces since the three action groups have been formed. This policy was abandoned by very well by an action group of the latter to the Minister of the Interior to the effect that they were to be allowed to do what they wished. That what steps are being taken to suppress this movement is being reported in the papers.

The Government's attitude towards the existing National Emergency Regulations were too narrow and too rigid, but the new regulations, which would be published in the next few days, considerably lighten up the situation. It would be a mistake to consider this a subversive statement in public terms. The definition of subversive statement would be very wide. At present the Minister of the Interior has required at least twenty copies of a statement before a conviction could be obtained. Under the new regulations it would be sufficient if such a statement were made to one person.

The Congress is still in session and it is certain that a great deal will be heard of the Ossewa Brandweg and similar movements before the delegates are satisfied that the Government has pledged itself to do its duty.

The Ossewa Brandweg's claim to be a purely cultural organization has been completely refuted by the revelation that the police have discovered a list of names of secret hiding places of the "cultural" division of a force of about eight hundred members to camp on a farm between Krugersdorp and the Hekkerbos Dam. From an interview at night with one of the members it is learned that military drill and manoeuvres, including the use of machine-guns in the high noonlight and the use of gas, were practised by military commands. Besides these there were regular camps for secret "cultural" activities. Subversive activities had been carried out by some of those members who, in the darkness of the night, were the alarm. GREEK FORCES REACH THE ALBANIAN COAST

ENVELOPING MOVEMENT

THE GREEKS have announced the capture of the town of Koriza, 20 miles North of Koriza. It is an official spokesman in Athens who said that the battle was a stiff one because the Italians had fortified the town. At one point the Greek forces had to storm a mountain nearly 6,000 feet high and they took it at the point of the bayonet.

THE AIR RAIDS.

NAZIS STILL STRIKING AT CIVILIANS

Liverpool and Manchester were heavily bombed by German raiders last night. The Air Ministry communique issued this morning denounces the attacks as a continuation of the policy of terror. First reports state that the number killed and injured is not great, but it might have been expected considering the number of enemy aircraft, which were seen in the sky.

Bombs were also dropped at isolated points in Northern England. During daylight an Air Ministry communique stated that German bombers were shot down. British fighters were in the air at all stages.

Heavy Bomber Bombs A heavy communique from the widespread nature of last night's attack on Britain. It says that the towns of the North-West suffered to a greater extent than was at first thought, but the casualties were not heavy.

Most of the bombs were incendiary, which experienced one of its biggest raids of the war. The first raiders dropped their bombs in the industrial areas, which were put out in record time. Subsequent raiders had to operate in Northern England.

Public Health Hit In Liverpool, the first raid was caused mainly when a railway station was hit by a single incendiary bomb. This was not so serious as it might have been. Arrangements for housing the homeless victims of the raid were made in new quarters and food was distributed to the homeless.

Everywhere in the country casualties were very small. From all parts there are reports of heavy anti-aircraft fire and the raiders were driven off. The raiders were shot down and the 'valiant patrol' sighted. (Hester).

There are few reports of German activity over Britain during the night. There was some gunfire and bombs were seen to fall. In the early part of the night a raid was made on a British coast town and incendiary and high explosive bombs were dropped. One area was machine gunned by the raiders.

Eight German planes were destroyed during the day and we lost five fighters, but all the pilots are safe. Southampton Attack Southampton had its worst air raid of the war starting Saturday night. The centre of the town was deliberately bombed and much damage was done to shops and houses. All the fires were soon better controlled and the raiders were driven off.
