NEWS FROM THE GOLD COAST
Fund For The Greeks

Acrea, November 22
The following news has been received by cable from the Information Office, Acre, in connection with the Gold Coast troops in East Africa.
His Excellency the Governor of the Gold Coast is sending his personal congratulations to the Gold Coast Greek War Veterans, The Greek Consul, Mr. Levantis, has telegraphed the most loyal messages to General Metaxas. 62 Greeks and four Armenians subscribed between them £2,860 in three days. Subscriptions are now coming in from every quarter. A broadcast by a Greek resident in London was widely acclaimed by the press and the whole community of the Gold Coast.

The Gold Coast Sports Fund totalled £30,000 an Armistice Day and 4000 from the Government. The funds were sent by the Secretary of State in London. By November 22 the fund had reached £23,000. The second year charities committee from the Gold Coast to the Red Cross and St. John's in London was officially acknowledged by Lord Hastings on behalf of the Duke of Gloucester.

To date the contributions from the Gold Coast War Funds total £23,500 and include over £600 from the Department. Most of the residues having been made up by the Government. The number of charities for the relief of funds for the purchase of clothing and war charities is increasing throughout the Colony. A Pan Fair at Kitale, for the Government, another annual-walk competition organised by the Post Government Printer (Local Secretary, Overseas League) produced £64, in addition to the £78 resulting from the previous competition. The total proceeds will be used for the purchase of tobacco for the troops in East Africa.

Ramallah celebrations took place at Nairobi and elsewhere for the observance of the new moon on the last day of October by the various Gold Coast Mohammedan communities. Festive prayers were offered for Empire victory and the welfare of the Gold Coast.

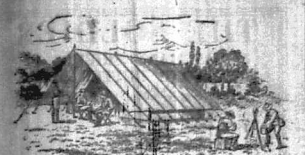

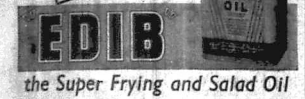

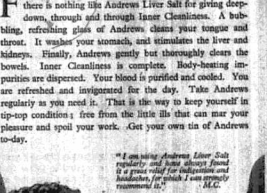

On the amendment being accepted by the proposer and seconded, Mr. Bernard Spence, in proposing this resolution, I may say that I have not yet experienced any difficulty in getting labour, but I feel sure that in expressing the opinion of most farmers, in saying that it is quite obvious that production is bound to suffer in the near future through a shortage of labour, unless drastic steps are taken to ensure an adequate supply. The superior attraction of the Army Labour Corps, and P.W.D. do not need stressing. I have not had firsthand experience of it, but I have seen in the Press that D.C. have actually taken steps to labour on to enable them to finish the Labour Corps. I think that I have not first-hand experience of it, but I have on my own part a number of boys who have over-stayed their leave so long that it appeared to be unable to return them, so I can only assume that they have found their way into a remunerative occupation.

Proof of Good Faith
"Since I sent in my resignation, I have had a visit from a Nyeri Chief, who addressed my labour and putting encouraging notes about getting boys in their place when they were sent leave. He was also good enough to tell me that my boys said I 'got handsome money'. This, of course, is a step in the right direction but, in my mind, it is only scratching the meaty part of the problem. If Government really wants to encourage me, and I suppose we have all done so, they would prefer to remove us all in the Army or in the A.S.V., and import all foodstuffs from abroad—it is up to them to do that we are not forced to decrease production through shortage of labour."

"I wish me, that, in the face of superior attractions, good pay, excellent ration, and beautiful surroundings, we may have to pay higher wages. In this case, we must ask Government to ensure that we can dispose of our produce, and dispose of it at a price which will give us a fair margin of profit. Otherwise, the only people who will be able to continue production, will be those estate holders with wealthy attentive landowners."

PLANTING OF WHEAT

How to Increase The Yield

The Settlement and Production Board and the Director of Agriculture will be advising farmers in full reports regarding the planting of wheat. It is estimated that at least 25,000 acres of wheat over and above the areas planted in 1942 will be required to provide for the total requirements of the Colony. Unless the coming season is exceptional it will not be anticipated that it will be possible to produce the whole of the wheat required, but it is hoped that every endeavour will be made for all those who have land suitable for wheat growing to plant as large an area as they can that is particularly desirable that in those areas where wheat and maize can both be grown, the area under maize should be reduced and the area under wheat increased at the expense of maize. It is appreciated that the position with regard to such machinery may be difficult under such conditions and life machinery will have to be transferred to places where it is required, and it is anticipated that by this means a sufficient quantity of machinery will be planted up to be planted will be provided.

NOTE THE YIELD
Farmers will appreciate that in order to secure maximum production it is more desirable to raise the yield per acre than to plant extensive areas which may only give poor yields and it is therefore advisable to plant at the correct time, to cultivate thoroughly and to use fertilizer. While superphosphate is the fertilizer generally used for this purpose, owing to its rapid action, this is in short supply, and the price has advanced. Wheat growers are advised to use bone meal. Scythes and other tools should be kept in addition to a smaller quantity of the article in the subject by the Senior Agricultural Chemist published in the East African Standard of August 28. In any case of doubt as to which is the best variety of wheat to plant under particular circumstances, consult the advice of the Senior Plant Breeder, Nairobi, should be sought, and will be freely given. There is no reason to anticipate that this year's price will fall below the year's price.



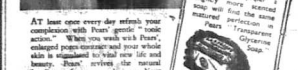

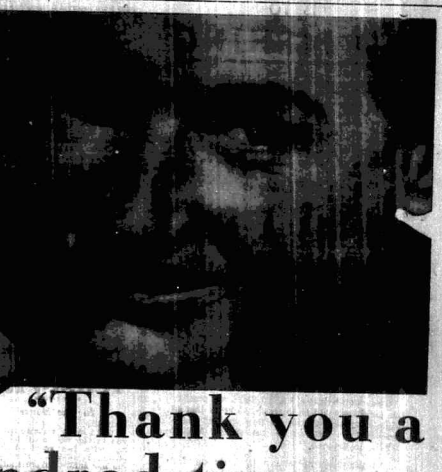

craft but without suffering casualties. On July 12 the Brigade with- drew to Buna and while the troops were in the jungle there, during the limited shelter of the only bit of forest for miles, they were bombed on nearly every day and machine-gunned on several occasions.

160 Bombs in a Day

On one day Buna was subjected to four attacks which well over a hundred bombs were dropped. Despite the constant attention by enemy aircraft only one man in the Brigade was hit and his injuries were slight. The experience of the K. A. R. in Buna is a remarkable example of the ineffectiveness of indiscriminate attacks when troops are well dug in and well pre-arranged protection is given to them as to their support, but after the withdrawal from Buna the Brigade had been forward, the Cold Coast came up to Buna and the King's African Rifles, the Engineers and the East Africa Reconnaissance Squadron, held Buna and the Cold Coast returned to Wajir. About this time the 6th K. A. R. went back to relief.

Two operations of local importance were carried out from Buna. One was the destruction of the well at Bulaji Ago on the Takaka-Mandara road. There was no fighting, and no casualties, but the undertaking was typical of the type of work done in the early months. The way had in fact been cleared by a lively series of operations in the "Bokkos" and the Italian front in the neighbourhood of Bulaji Ago on the Takaka-Mandara road. 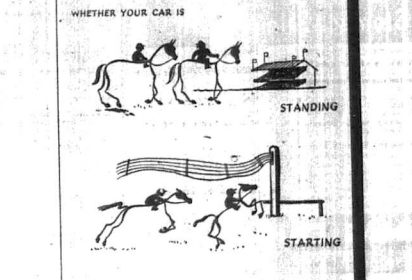

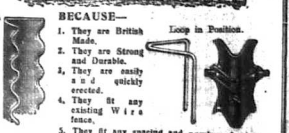

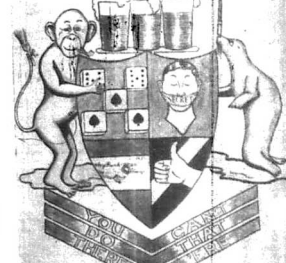

ITALIAN DILEMMA

ROME, DECEMBER 12, 1940. Mussolini and the Italian propaganda machine will find it very difficult indeed to explain away or to minimize the role of Marshal Badoglio, Chief of Staff. That it is the direct outcome of the series of military disasters which have not to be doubted. As Chief of Staff, Marshal Badoglio has been made intimately responsible for the military setbacks of the Italian army and for the organization and planning behind the Greek campaign.

But that role is that the campaign was forced upon him by an impetuous, ill-balanced and wild Marshal who over-estimated the military might of his country's forces and, as a tool of Hitler, set out on a campaign of conquest which he thought would have the same quick and overwhelming results as the Nazi conquest of the rest of Europe.

But whether Marshal Badoglio was hustled into a winter campaign in Greece as part of the Axis plan against the Soviet Union, or whether he was driven to do so by the fact that the plan has failed so completely that Italy is on the eve of a major defeat which will affect the whole course of the war both from a military and political point of view.

As Chief of Staff, Duke of Addis Ababa, was the right hand military advisor of Mussolini. As Chief of the Combined Staff he was earlier concerned with the defense of the Italian Colonies. He took over the command in Abyssinia from Marshal de Bono and arrived to face a serious situation which had been created by the implacable obstinacy of his predecessor.

He disappeared of the project to advance on Makalle and warned Mussolini that Italy should be prepared for the consequences of the campaign and the energetic measures which Marshal Badoglio took to stem the tide and avert the Italian defeat. He showed himself a great commander in Abyssinia and took daring and really immense military risks which were justified by the results, one he had gained the measure of the Abyssinians and understood their weaknesses.

Mussolini did not bustle him as he did de Bono and throughout the campaign he was Marshal Badoglio's fullest support. But for the combination of the driving power of Mussolini and the high military qualities of Marshal Badoglio the Abyssinian campaign might have foundered in the rains.

KENYA WAR LOAN

MONDAY, DECEMBER 9, 1940. The Kenya Government has announced that it is launching a savings campaign in connection with the War Loan. At least that is what we presume from the announcement.
