Greek Pressure in Albania

ITALIANS IN RETREAT AT MANY POINTS

December 29.—The Greek Ministry of Information has said a tribute to the British Army of the Nile. It said those credits had caused great joy among the Greeks and would have a considerable influence on the first issue of the year.

A message from Athens states that the Royal Air Force has bombed warehouses, buildings and railway lines at Elbasan, South of Valona.

bars and hotels and if they have not got sufficient public spirit to ensure that there is respect for the Regulations on the part of their staff and their customers then it is time that steps were taken to help them to do so. If those who place their cases would approach the whole problem from the broader point of view of public interest and would time themselves to do so, less of the difficulties of the hotel-keeper.

The fact of the matter is that the ultimate power and an ultimate responsibility rest with the State. If money is being wasted in directions which are not helping the war effort, if social problems are arising from the fact, if East Africa is using an unnecessary amount of shipping space to bring luxuries to this country while the British people who are bearing the brunt for us are facing the prospect of still starker rationing and the submarine menace is overcome, the Government of these Territories have ample powers to see that these young countries make of their proper contribution.

We shall have no hesitation in urging the Government of Kenya to take steps to reduce the importation of luxury goods, including alcoholic liquor, if the community are not sufficiently sane minded and public spirited to discipline themselves and respect the law. The matter is in the hands of the Government, one hotel or bar is called to account for slackness the whole trade will be affected. It is a good thing that the Government will protect itself and its servants, and all the difficulties we fear so much about today from advocates who should know better will very quickly disappear.

NOT PLAYING THE GAME
No Treating

When the No Treating Regulations were introduced the East African Standard made it quite clear that unless the population, civil and military, were prepared to stand up to the country the law would be frustrated. We regret to say that though the Regulations have been in force for a very short time there is plenty of evidence to suggest that some people are not playing the game.

There is nothing easier than to devise methods of flouting and ignoring the No Treating Order. That is neither difficult nor clever. But it is not to the credit of the people of this Colony that they should be party to a conspiracy to defy a war-time law, devised to try to ensure the general war effort. One popular method is for the person standing in place the money for his round of drinks in front of each glass so that when the African or Asian bar steward comes along there need be no questions asked. There are some people who do not even bother to employ that simple method of deception. They just blatantly and openly defy the law and order their drinks boasting that nobody will call them to account. It is nobody's business and that the whole thing is nonsense anyway.

We find members of our Legislative Council, though they have a duty to do so for commercial interests, and normally sensible members of the Chamber of Commerce, trying to shield proprietors and managers of hotels and bars from the consequences of the law. It is a possibility which rests on the whole community to make the law operative. We have no objection to the argument that because Africans and Asians are employed in the liquor business their employers should not be responsible for their acts. The law is being flagrantly broken in public places in the eyes of law, and respective places on the morning of Saturday, January 1, 1944.

Raid On Britain Resumed

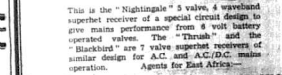

Memorandum On Insurance Scheme

THE East African Standard publishes here the full text of the memorandum submitted to the Board on the proposed scheme for commodities insurance, to be operated by the Board set up under the War Risks Insurance Act, 1941. It is emphasized that before applying to the Board for a War Risks Insurance Certificate, the applicant should refer to the memorandum and to the appendix thereto.

SCOPE OF SCHEME.
(1) Any applicant of goods as defined in Section 4 of the War Risks Insurance Ordinance, who is carrying on business in Kenya or Uganda or both is required, consistently with the provisions of the said Ordinance and any rules made thereunder, to obtain a War Risks Insurance Certificate from the Board in connection with the insurance of such goods as defined in the said Ordinance and any rules made thereunder, and to pay the premium thereon.

(2) Where the total aggregate value of such goods does not exceed £1,000, the policy or policies may be issued on a non-reciprocal basis.

POLICIES.
(3) The following types of policies will be available:
(a) **Fixed Term Policy.**
(b) **Declaration Policy.**

FIXED TERM POLICY.
(4) This policy will be available for goods as defined in the said Ordinance and any rules made thereunder, and the applicant shall warrant not to be less than the total value of all goods insurable or to be insured under the said Ordinance.

(5) Where an insured wishes, as required by law, to take out a policy which is not a non-reciprocal policy, it will be issued for a term not to exceed three months, and the applicant shall warrant not to be less than the total value of all goods insurable or to be insured under the said Ordinance.

discussed in the ability of the Italian to draw great numbers of military forces into the Middle East where, if success had smiled upon Mussolini, Germany might have been prepared to join in an attempt to smash the British Empire's communications at the hinge, the Suez Canal and Egypt. The success has not come and more clearly we see our task in its two principal parts—the elimination of Italy and then the main attack on Germany entrenched and economically strong amid her spoils in Europe.

It is useful in facing this new year to try to see the task in its true proportions. It will not be an easy task. The night bomber still leaves Great Britain vulnerable and the strain on the Empire makes it impossible quickly to deal with the submarine menace. But as the months go by we are increasingly on our side. The long winter nights will pass, the problem of the bomber which will be mainly our job in 1941 to meet him, to clear the sea and clear the interior, as our contribution, gladly made to the Empire's objective. But we shall not do it unless we are girded and ready mentally as well as physically.
