Nyasaland secession principle accepted

MR. A. H. BUTLER, Minister responsible for Central African affairs, announced in Parliament yesterday that the Government accepts in principle that Nyasaland shall be allowed to withdraw from the Rhodesia and Nyasaland Federation.

Mr. Butler said that withdrawal by Nyasaland did not mean that the traditional constitutional relationship between Northern and Southern Rhodesia was thereby broken. He said that now that new administrations were being set up in Northern and Southern Rhodesia, the British Government proposed to engage in early consultations.

Mr. Butler said he proposed to visit Central Africa to initiate these consultations and to seek ways and means of achieving a practical and durable solution.

Serious economic consequences

He added: "Financial and economic consequences for Nyasaland will be serious and substantial. Detailed negotiations between the British Government and the Nyasaland Government will be required before effect can be given to the decision that Nyasaland should be allowed to withdraw from the Federation. Last month the British Government granted Nyasaland the right to inter-convert the pound sterling with the Rhodesian dollar.

Mr. Butler said that serious reasons why this decision would be of great importance to the strength of the rest of the area. "In order to avoid the political problems of Central Africa, the British Government will be anxious to co-operate with the Government of Nyasaland in maintaining confidence especially in the financial sector."

Live in harmony

The Minister added: "The Government is anxious to ensure that the conditions in which a stable and harmonious relationship can be maintained between the two countries. LITTLE INCENTIVE AGAIN FOR CITY BUYERS

With incentives again almost completely lacking and a number of adverse factors affecting London Stock Exchanges presented a very complicated picture.

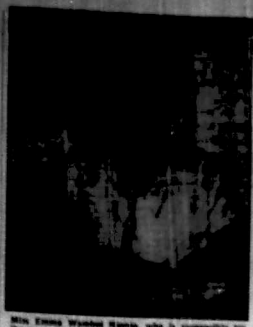



U.S. cancels plans for Skybolt

PRESIDENT KENNEDY and Mr. Macmillan announced yesterday that the United States would make available Polaris missiles without warheads for British submarines on a continuing basis.

The British Government will build the submarines and will provide the nuclear warheads for the Polaris missiles. A statement by the two leaders said Mr. Kennedy told Mr. Macmillan he had decided to cancel plans for the production of the Skybolt missile for use by the United States.

The President expressed his readiness to continue developing Skybolt missiles as a joint Anglo-American enterprise, but the British Prime Minister decided not to enter into it for the reason of doubts expressed about its progress and because of uncertainty regarding the completion date and final costs.

Major contribution

The joint communique said the United States would study the feasibility of making available "British support facilities" for British submarines using the Polaris missile. The President and Mr. Macmillan agreed that a decision on Polaris must be considered in the widest context. "Both sides to the future of the Atlantic Alliance and of the safety of the whole free world".

The two concluded that this issue created an opportunity for the development of new arrangements between the organization and control of strategic Western defense and that such arrangements be taken to have a major contribution to political cohesion, to the nations of the Atlantic.

Civil servants will not stand in way

SUGGESTIONS that senior civil servants were out of sympathy with the changing scene in Kenya were refuted in the House of Representatives by the Minister for Legal Affairs, Mr. G. W. Waiguro.

"I do not think there is a Kenya civil servant in the country who would stand in the way of any law which would be enacted to give effect to the new constitution," he said.

The Minister, who was speaking on a motion put forward by Mr. W. W. 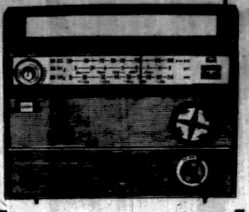

NATIONALISATION OF East Africa's port industry is under consideration as the result of a report by Mr. Amos Landman, port manager of Haifa, Israel, who investigated the docks system for the Tanganyika Government. In his report he is understood to have recommended nationalisation of the entire stevedoring industry at all East African ports.

The general manager of East African Railways and Harbours, Mr. G. Mackay, is reported to have held meetings with interested parties in Dar es Salaam on Thursday and in Mombasa on Friday, and told them that the stevedoring contracts would be granted a licence to operate in 1963 but not in 1962.

Yesterday, Mr. Mackay said the reports were genuine and the E.A.R. and H. management would prefer not to comment. "The matter is still under consideration in the E.A.R. and H. and the other various interested parties."

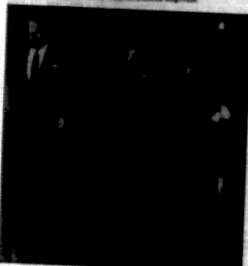
