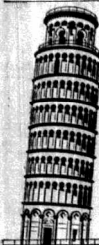

## Maize Seed Growing Competitions.

### SUGGESTIONS ON OBTAINING THE BEST RESULTS.

#### Preparation for Export.

#### BREEDING OF STRAINS RESISTANT TO THE VARIOUS DISEASES.

(By Mr. G. J. L. Burton, Senior Plant Breeder and Experimentalist.)

Maize farmers another matter: success will start in two months (the best of all) and save the seed sown by your own selection. Make profits a matter of fact and not a matter of chance. You may grow a crop that is a better quality and by increasing yields per acre.

With regard to the first until the year 1926 inclusive, only two crops were exported. The following year from the Colony was graded K 2 but in 1927 seven per cent of the 1926 crop and one per cent of the 1927 crop was graded K 2, as against the 70 per cent or 80 per cent of previous years. These figures show that there has been a distinct improvement in the quality of maize grown and exported. This falling off is explained by the fact that buyers have in recent years complained that the grading of maize has been too loose and some which is grade K 2 should be graded K 3. At the same time, the grading is not as strict as it should be. It is, however, possible to do this. The following suggestions are made for the improvement of the grading of maize. 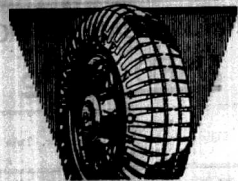

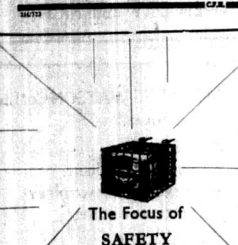

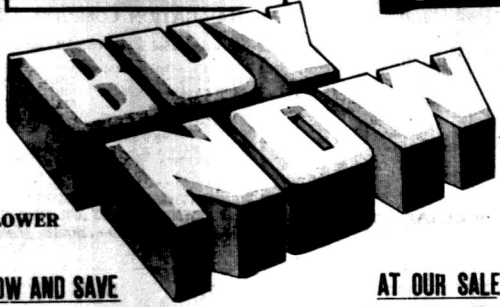

# Locust Destruction in Swarming Phase.

## HOPPERS, EGGS AND FLYING SWARMS.

### Standard Methods.

POISON BAIT, POWER SPRAY PUMPS AND MECHANICAL MEANS.

A second article prepared by officers of the Department of Agriculture dealing with methods of destruction during the swarming phase, the memorandum published in yesterday's "East African Standard" concerned the protection of crops against flying swarms.

It is pointed out that methods of destruction in any stage except the hopper stage are difficult and often impracticable. In the event of a red locust campaign becoming necessary the Department point out that extensive preparations have been made for the supply of poisoned bait.

## Possibilities of Aeroplanes.

The second memorandum on this subject issued by the Department of Agriculture reads as follows:

At the present time it is an unfortunate fact that little can be accomplished for the destruction of locusts during the swarming phase, except in the hopper stage.

With regard to destruction in the earlier stages of the life cycle, the most effective means of destruction are the use of power bait, supplemented where necessary by power spray pumps and mechanical methods such as beating and spraying. ## FRANCE TO REMAIN ON GOLD STANDARD.

### Statement by Governor of Bank of France.

#### EFFECT OF INTERNATIONAL AGREEMENTS.

["STANDARD" PARIS, JANUARY 25.] The gold standard is indispensable for a condition of healthy economic and social discipline, says the report of M. Maréchal, Governor of the Bank of France, which was read at the annual meeting of the bank.

M. Maréchal declared that international exchange would not expand so long as the principal currencies of the world remained on the gold standard.

The report reveals that the gold reserves of the Bank have increased from 1,000,000 francs last year to over 1,500,000 francs by the end of the year.

## BUILDING CONTRACTOR'S FAILURE.

### Losses on Recent Construction.

The public examination of Mr. Alfred Edward Linton, Nairobi, building contractor, who was appointed Receiver of the estate of the late Mr. J. H. Linton, is now being held at the office of the Receiver of the estate.

Debtor, who had described himself as a building contractor, was found to have a deficit of £1,711 on his estate. The Receiver of the estate has now issued a notice to the public.

## Request for Relief.

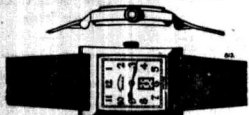

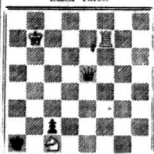

**LIGHTERAGE & WHARFAGE RATES.**  
**Methods of Charging at Dur ee Salama.**

**SUGGESTED REVISION.**  
**Voluntary Reductions Made by Contractors.**

"Whereas from the facts submitted by the Dur-ee-Salama Chamber of Commerce, it appears that the present method of charging lighterage and wharfage rates at that port may lead to inequalities in treatment, this Association urges that the findings of the sitting committee of enquiry will be published at an early date and that a reasonable opportunity will then be given for public representations in regard to the findings before a final decision is reached."

This resolution was passed unanimously at Monday afternoon's session in Nairobi of the Association of Chambers of Commerce of East Africa, following the presentation of a memorandum by Mr. C. Lane representing the Dur-ee-Salama Chamber and by Mr. Long.

In this memorandum Mr. Lane said in view of the fact that the rate of labour, whether monthly or daily, was considerably less than it was at the time when the existing scale of charges was set up, it was suggested that bearing in mind the fact that the charges were of a general nature, wherever possible, he brought into line with the existing scale of charges, a list of certain classes of goods, as well as the reduced cost of labour. Lighterage rates on export Classes 1 and 2 could, in the opinion of the committee which prepared the memorandum, be reduced by at least 10 1/2 per cent.

The Dur-ee-Salama Chamber would have to be considered individually, and only the more outstanding cases for revision were considered in the memorandum. The rate of 5s. 10/00 and 5s. 14/- would require consideration. While the rate had little or no effect on the sale price of 40s. or over cotton goods, it was undoubtedly out of place when other commodities were concerned. All building material, cement, etc.

egg-lain-for example, had fallen. Mr. Lane submitted the following figures for comparison:—Dur-ee-Salama, 5s. 4/- per ton; Dur-ee-Salama, 5s. 10/00 per ton; Kilindi, including the cost of wharfage on fair average value of 5s. 10/00 per ton; and Dur-ee-Salama, 5s. 7/-, and this Dur-ee-Salama was 50 per cent more.

**Banky Merchandise.**  
 While the sub-committee advanced a general scaling down of charges, it particularly recommended more liberal treatment for banky merchandise on which the development of the territory depended. Rates on general merchandise and banky goods, the present rate of 5s. 8/- per ton on petrol and kerosene compared with 5s. 2/00 four months ago, which could be regarded as a fair rate but not a low one. Finally they would welcome some method of grading goods and fixing charges on their capacity to pay, the fact that the present total cost from ship's lade to customs shed was the same for such widely varying articles as cement and silk or leather appeared to present an anomaly.

**Native Foodstuffs.**  
 (Cereals, nuts, meal and other native foodstuffs.) It shipped from one port in the territory to another, had to pay the cartorial rate of 5s. 10/00 on the present rate, equal to about 10 per cent of the Dur-ee-Salama value.

Mr. Lane said the attention of the sub-committee had in particular been drawn to such, which paid 5s. 10/00 per ton, a severe tax on the commodity, which from an average of 100 kilograms, the Dur-ee-Salama had to pay 25/25 per ton (5s. 15/-). Rates at Kilindi were well known, and the argument that, where facilities were for superior, certain materials vitally necessary, there were certain instances where they were loaded much more cheaply than in Dur-ee-Salama, the 4/- per ton and one cent was

asked voluntarily by the contractor, although they were under no obligation to do so until the three months' period had expired. The reduction had been offered and had been made in respect of such. They must remember that the lighterage companies were faced with the same problem as were the railways to-day, because of the unattractive reduction in the rate to be applied to banky goods. The Dur-ee-Salama had dropped to the appalling low rate of 5s. 2/00, which was valued upon for revenue. Any increase had been demanded by the Government and not by the contractor. In any case the matter was at the moment delicate.

"With the warm approval and support of the Honorable Colonel Foreign Office the National Rifle Association has instructed a Committee of Experts to select for the new competition the best of the 10 British Sporting or British Protected persons resident or stationed in 48 Colonies, Protectorates and Countries of the Empire. The conditions are similar to those of the "Morning Post" (Junior) Match, but to consist of five rounds to be shot in five days. The match will be first, under official supervision, on any day between 1st January and 1st November and on any range in the competing country, the certified results will be sent to the N.R.A. for adjudication. A Challenge Cup and Medal will be awarded to the team which scores the highest in the Country.

The attendance of overseas teams from British Dominions and Possessions at Bombay's Imperial meeting in 1933 has never been so numerous. Since 1920 not less than 80 teams from 20 different countries have taken part. Competitors have visited India in July to compete with the Indian Club, or with one another for the Senior and Junior Rangas Prizes. This year's list of visiting teams from such remote places as the Hawaiian Islands, the United States and Hong Kong are very heavy and make it impossible to hope for a complete list. The teams which the proposed match will help to introduce into the country, and which it is hoped may lead to an even wider representation of Overseas Teams are:

A STATEMENT OF POLICY.

Disarmament.

MINISTERS TO EXPRESS THEIR OWN VIEWS.

Belfast, Jan. 29. The Parliamentary session which began in November is being recessed to-day after a five weeks Christmas recess. In the interval Disarmament has been the subject of diplomatic exchanges and questions will be asked in the House of Commons this afternoon regarding the situation as it now stands and the possibility of any further development.

It is understood that British Ministers have agreed upon an independent statement of their views towards disarmament, and that this statement has been sent in the form of a memorandum to the Government.

It is not yet possible to say whether the statement will be made public to-day and it is probable that any details of the British statement will be revealed in the reply to this afternoon's questions in the House of Commons.

Consideration by Other Powers.

The newspapers anticipate that the Foreign Secretary, Sir John Simon, will briefly review the events of recent weeks which have led to the production of this memorandum. "The Times" says that seeing that notwithstanding in Berlin, it is proposed to question from the German Government (certainly) demands that that Government should first have time to consider it and there is reason to hope that it is already in their hands. "The Times" adds that it is natural that it should be circulated to other powers concerned in the recent diplomatic conversations on disarmament.

The British statement will be revealed in the reply to this afternoon's questions in the House of Commons.

The latest development of the Church controversy enables Dr. Mueller, who is relying on the support of the Prussian Government, to order to the supreme Prussian Church Council, thereby subjecting the whole of the Protestant churches belonging to the United Church to his dictatorial rule.

The decree is followed by orders for the suspension of default pastors in the United Church. The fact that Nazi Protestant leaders have been given the opportunity to hear Hitler and examine their own determination to support Dr. Mueller is hailed by the press as capitulation to the pressure of further developments are expected.

UNEMPLOYMENT.

Chief Measure Before Parliament.

The airmen reached Casablanca after 90 minutes flying in their monoplane at a cruising speed of 143 miles per hour.

The flight is successful, Italy is likely to compete with France and Germany in South American air routes.

Effect of Drought.

REDUCTION IN MAIZE OUTPUT BUT INCREASE IN WHEAT.

There has been a slight reduction in the output of maize for the present season in Kenya, harvesting of which is now general throughout the Colony. It is estimated that there will be a surplus of 650,000 bags for export although this figure is stated to be an over-estimate.

The Coffee Position.

The following report on Kenya crops in the European areas for a month of December has been issued by the Department of Agriculture. The yield for the Colony was estimated at 1,902,800 tons, or 2.1 to the acre, as compared with last season's crop of 1,180,615 tons or 6.9 to the acre. Harvesting is now well advanced throughout the Colony. The maize crop has been generally affected by the continued dry weather, but earlier sowings have, however, escaped the drought. The yield for the Colony was estimated at 108,200 tons, or 4.3 to the acre, as compared with last season's yield of 65,400 tons, or 2.1 to the acre. The wheat crop has been generally affected by the drought in all districts, and the yield has been reduced. The following table shows the estimated surplus for the various crops on the whole of Kenya:

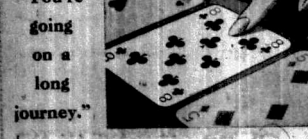

A POUND OF KENYA COFFEE.

History from Retailer to Grower.

ESTIMATED EXPENSES.

Mr. J. H. Phillips who returns from home have recently placed before a meeting of the Kipkarreri Farmers Association, the results of an enquiry into the marketing of Kenya coffee which he had carried out whilst at home.

He said that he had soon discovered that it was impossible to trace a consignment of coffee from the time it landed in England till it reached the consumer, so he had started from the other end.

He had gone to a retailer in Chorley and asked for 1 lb. of Kenya coffee which he had purchased for Shs. 2/4d. He had then asked the retailer how he had purchased his coffee and was told that the sample bought was part of two bags purchased in June. The retailer had shown him the bags one of which was full the other half full both marked CLAY, and he had then asked to trace those two bags of coffee back to the time when they were sold at London Auction on Bond on January 15 to Manchester wholesale merchant at Shs. 7/6 per cwt.

They were sold by the Manchester merchant in June to the retail coffee merchant in Chorley at Shs. 11/9 per cwt., and by the retailer in Chorley at Shs. 2/4d. per lb., rounded round, and shipped in a paper container.

Wholesaler's Profit.

The estimated expense on the two bags of coffee between Manchester Lane and retailer in Chorley was Shs. 11/9 per cwt. Bought by the Manchester wholesale merchant at Shs. 7/6 per cwt. (import duty payable by buyer) Shs. 4/8d.; transport from coffee warehouse to Manchester (Shs. 1/2 per bag 150 lbs.) Shs. 2/6d. Total 83/2d. The coffee was sold to the retailer in Chorley at Shs. 11/9 per cwt. and the Manchester merchant's gross profit was therefore Shs. 35/10d. per cwt. or 65-1/2% on the two bags.

Retailer's Profit.

The cost of transport from Manchester to Chorley was Shs. 2/2 per cwt. therefore the cost of the retail price was Shs. 12/1 per cwt. or Shs. 1/1d. per lb.

Allowing for loss in roasting and packing is 20 per cent. the cost of the retail price was Shs. 12/1 per cwt. or Shs. 1/1d. per lb. The retailer's gross profit was therefore Shs. 2/4d. per lb. making a gross profit of 114d. per cwt. or 114 per cent. The net profit was Shs. 1/1d. per lb. or 11d. per cwt. or 11 per cent. At Messrs. Lyons.

While in London the speaker had spent a good deal of time in the premises of Messrs. Joseph Lyons and Co., who are the largest buyers of Kenya Coffee in the United Kingdom, and they had given him every assistance in his enquiries, even giving him access to their books and a lesson in coffee tasting.

As a result he had been able to gather the following particulars regarding the sale of Kenya coffee in London.

Messrs. Lyons do not sell an unsorted Kenya coffee but they use large quantities of Kenya in the mixing of the various blends they sell. The other coffee they use are Java, Sumatra, Ceylon, Costa Rica, Mysore and Mocha. No other coffee used by Lyons has the "right" character and without it they could not produce a really the same flavours which they obtain in their particular blends. They did not state the proportion of Kenya coffee in any one of their blends.

The basis of most of their blends in Brazil (the cheapest) and Kenya, Costa Rica, Mysore and Jamaica are used for flavouring. Compounds with the varieties Brazilian is practically absent. Lyons state that when packed or tinned in air-tight tins, Kenya coffee loses its flavour sooner than any other kind of coffee.

Purchases are made in the London market by Lyons in the following manner: Samples sent to Messrs. Lyons by brokers are sent by the manager and any coffee which suits their requirements is bid for at

the action by Lyons representative. They buy "Y" number possible as for the purpose they require the coffee this size is just suitable as a "Y" number.

Messrs. Lyons are not prepared to buy coffee in Nairobi as they place no reliance on any particular estate mark and no coffee is bought by them unless a sample thereof has been tested and approved by their London coffee manager.

Price Variations.

Pure Kenya coffee can be purchased at most of the London stores at from Shs. 2/10 to Shs. 2/6d. per lb. rounded round.

Concerning the general disparity between the auction prices and retail prices the speaker said that so far as can be ascertained only the best quality are bought by retailers in moment to be sold as pure Kenya coffee. When used for blending purposes, coffee are auctioned at Shs. 6/10 per cwt. or less of the same value to the retailer as Kenya auctioned at, say, Shs. 9/0 per cwt.

Mr. Phillips said that he had shown that large variations in the price of similar coffee sold at the same auction, were due to two factors, either a quality only outstanding part of the quantity offered or when there may be break competition for say, "A" had been sold, the afterwards the remaining 15 bags may be sold at a considerably lower price.

At auctions where the competition is not very keen it is a practice for certain dealers to purchase coffee and then offer it to go back for sale again at later auctions.

Every coffee grower should take the improving quality of his own coffee before consigning to the sale, and while it is not expected that this procedure would enable a grower to estimate the value of his coffee, it is submitted that it would at least inform him of any material difference in the quality of his coffee.

Mr. Phillips said that the general opinion in London was that the quality of this year's Kenya coffee crop was very poor.

On his way home he had been enquired at one of the largest stores in Capetown for Kenya coffee, and they hardly knew what it was and said that they never asked for nor did they sell it.

The speaker said that the coffee producer here was also largely at the mercy of the dealer and the taste of individuals. There were only two ways of helping matters, one an extensive advertising campaign, which he thought impracticable, and the other, control of supplies in this country and the establishment of a grading for quality in the country before leaving the country.

The meeting resolved that the Coffee Board be written to and asked if the possibility of grading in Nairobi could not again be enquired into. A vote of thanks was passed to Mr. J. H. Phillips for the trouble he had taken in gathering the information given.

PETROL PUMPS.

Municipal Committee's Proposal.

The following recommendations will be submitted to Nairobi Municipal Council today in regard to the proposals of the Council relative to petrol pumps and sites for petrol service stations. It will be recalled that the Municipal committee ruled that all petrol pumps be allowed to remain until petrol service stations should be placed on selected sites.

The report of a special sub-committee recommended for adoption by the Council today is as follows:—

"It was agreed that the Council should arrange to have the selected sites made available as soon as possible.

"It was decided not to agree to the suggestion that the sites not acquired by the four of the sub-committee should be the subject of a petition that the balance of petrol pumps on roads or roads developed should be allowed to remain until four of the sites have developed.

"The report of the special sub-committee recommended for adoption by the Council today is as follows:—

"It was further decided to recommend that Government be asked to allow the Municipal Council to erect petrol service stations on the sites mentioned in (2) and (3) above, in order to effect the desired road improvement on (2), and the erection of public conveniences and shelter on (3). Also, the Government permit the land or portion thereof, between the Municipal Market building and the railway side of the Municipal Market, to be used for the erection thereon of a petrol service station.

"Resolved, that the foregoing recommendations of the Sub-Committee on Petrol Service Stations be approved and adopted."

"On the question of the sites to be immediately developed, it was decided to recommend the following:—(1) Sixth Avenue; (2) On a plot at the junction of Kenyatta Street with Westmoreland Road; (3) On a plot in Sadler Street, on the railway side of the Municipal Market; and (4) On an open station in the vicinity of Victoria Road.

"It was further decided to recommend that Government be asked to allow the Municipal Council to erect petrol service stations on the sites mentioned in (2) and (3) above, in order to effect the desired road improvement on (2), and the erection of public conveniences and shelter on (3). The Search for a Premier of France.

M. DALADIER ACCEPTS TASK OF FORMING MINISTRY.

"A Strong, Silent Man."

A GOVERNMENT OF ENERGETIC AND RESPECTED MEN.

The French President's task of finding a statesman who is prepared to accept the office of Premier has, for the moment, ended. After the Presidents of both the Senate and the Chamber had declined the offer, M. Daladier, Minister for War in the previous Ministry, was called and accepted the Premiership.

M. Daladier is described as the "Honest John" of French politics, and a man of unimpeachable integrity. His selection is a very popular one.

Although he has accepted the post, M. Daladier has not yet replied as to his ability to form a Cabinet. He states, however, that he would form a Government of energetic and respected men, capable of restoring the authority of the State and the confidence of the country.

M. Daladier, although a member of the Left group will be opposed by the Socialists, and it is probable that he will have to look to the Right for support. He favours direct negotiation with Germany.

Socialist Opposition.

[FRANCIS BAKER'S AGENCY.]

Paris, January 30. M. Daladier who is reported as the "Honest John" of French politics, was announced to the press this morning.

On January 30, M. Daladier said the President had entrusted to him the formation of a new Government and he would be warmly thanked by M. Lefevre for a mark of confidence.

M. Daladier told the President he would consult his friends immediately and he intended to announce the formation of his Government in the afternoon of this date.

Earlier in the morning Mr. Jules Renard, Secretary of the Chamber, had declined the Premiership.

A Popular Choice. Later, M. Daladier will return to give a brief answer whether or not he can form a Government.

The President's wishes of M. Daladier is welcomed as an important step in the only Left Government capable of forming a Government of the National Union.

He will be opposed by the Socialists, but it will have to look to the Right of the Chamber for support.

SAFETY ZONES

Use of Horses in Busy Streets to be Restricted.

[BY WIRELESS.] The Government's new Road Traffic Bill, designed to reduce loss of life on public highways, will aim to remove some of the defects which experience has revealed in the existing Road Traffic Act.

It is understood that one proposal for the future will restrict pedestrians from crossing busy streets. The Government's intention is also to use other measures besides legislation to reduce road risks and the help of newspapers and the broadcasting system will probably be invited.

Automatic Signaling.

The possibility of restricting the use of horse traffic on the basis of automatic signaling systems is under development as a receiving station—British Official Wireless Service.

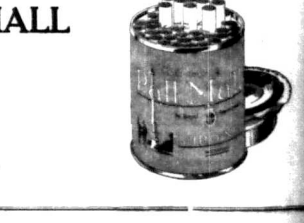

**SMALL NEW AIR  
LINERS.**

For Imperial Airways  
Service.

[STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.]  
London, Jan. 16.  
(By air mail.)

The first of two small air liners which are being built by Imperial Airways has just begun the fitting trials at Stag Lane aerodrome (writes the correspondent of THE TIMES). The machine is a biplane, similar in some respects to the Havilland Dragon, but fitted with four 200 h.p. engines instead of the two 120 h.p. units of that model. It is designed also for fast, high performance, having tapered wings and tapered fuselage.

The new machine will carry from eight to ten passengers, at a certain amount of mail. It has done an speed trials as presently built, 140 m.p.h. on level. It is the smallest four-engine aeroplane yet produced and it is of special interest as being the first to be fitted with the new 40 Havilland six-cylinder engine.

The placing of this order marks the interest of Imperial Airways in aeroplanes of high performance for passenger transport. Two other four-engined aeroplanes of similar capacity have been ordered by Messrs. British and Post. These are to be replicas of the mail-carrier which was shown last summer to be capable of a top speed of over 190 m.p.h. in an hour. The new six-cylinder machines, which should be ready in three or four months, will have less powerful engines, but are expected to cruise at about 130 m.p.h. in an hour.

## Notes of the Week.

Conditions are again reported as very variable and it is difficult for this reason to report on the transmitters here all at various times been very good but there have also been some bad nights. I am glad to hear Beaufort Road (X) has been some 100 metres which some months ago gave us such good reception. Though it is an yet rather on the weak side this station has the advantage that static is practically nonexistent in its wavelength. The 40 metre group of stations are nearly all coming through at good strength but static on this wavelength is generally rather troublesome and a really strong signal is required to overcome it.

### Aerials.

In last week's Notes when dealing with aerials I had intended to make it clear that two aerials should be left up. The relative passage should have read "and the best two aerials left up" not "the better of the two." The idea is that one aerial can be perfectly suited for reception of all wavelengths. Actually a different aerial should be used for every different wavelength but this is obviously not possible in practice.

In this connection, the experiments carried out by Postoffice are interesting and I can assure readers that time spent on aerial design and construction is time well spent. It is well worth while to have two aerials which by means of a simple switching device can be used as well for wavelengths from about 30 metres and upwards and one for longer wavelengths. What almost any kind of aerial will bring in signals on receiving is that this is generally done only through the extreme sensitivity, with which one is linked, of the set.

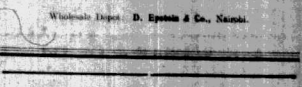

post 400 plus shares of profits plus four furnished quarters and passages, all as previously stated provided reference satisfactory, says Napier Clark, Alexander Road.

"I would draw particular attention to the use of the word 'passage' in the third in this telegram. This telegram was undoubtedly a conditional offer, the condition being satisfactory reference. On the same day the appellant wrote an unconditional acceptance."

"I have drawn particular attention to the use of the word 'passage' in the third in this telegram. It seems to indicate that there was no doubt in Mr. Clark's mind that he had to pay into the one passage out on non-acceptance of employment. What could the other passage be?"

"There is no mention whatever as regards the payment of Mr. Grindley's return fare to England should his employment terminate before the expiration of three years or be terminated at the expiration thereof." The question of liability cannot be satisfactorily answered, Mr. Grindley eventually settled for £200.

**Terms of Service.**

"There is some evidence that before he sailed there was an attempt to vary the conditions of service of the respondent by failing owing to the parties being unable to agree as to the proposed amendments."

"I am of opinion that the appellant made out to East Africa the employment of the respondent on the terms set out in the 'Terms of Service' as enlarged or substituted in the DeWail interview and that the respondent's objection to the proposed amendments was a conditional offer, the condition of which was subsequently fulfilled and that the appellant's failure of the same date was an unqualified acceptance of the respondent's offer."

"That being so we come to the question of 'six months' leave on full pay every three years with three months' leave on full pay every two years." In the former case "if you get two years service I will give you six months' leave on full pay every two years and will give you passage money with holidays."

"Any question of employment on the same or other terms would fall for consideration after the termination of such holiday."

**Initiated to Passage.**

"It is not in dispute that the appellant completed his three years service and so my mind is therefore satisfied, to his six months' holiday (and I use the word 'holiday' as you have used it) in the respondent's expense."

"The special damages to which the appellant is entitled would be six months' salary, i.e. £225 plus the cost of a first class passage to East Africa. He is not in my opinion entitled to house allowance or to compensation of profits after the termination of the employment."

"On the above reasons I am of opinion that the appeal must be dismissed with costs here and in the District Court and one returned to the High Court of Tanganyika in respect of the general damages and the housing allowance and interest."
