TROPICAL TYPHUS.

Causation and Methods of Prevention.

A TICK-BORNE DISEASE. Undoubtedly Preventable if Precautions Taken.

The following is the text of a pamphlet published by the Kenya Medical Department on Tropical Typhus. Copies may be obtained from the Medical Department Headquarters.

Every year a number of cases of Tropical Typhus occur in the Colony. It is desirable, therefore, that the causation and methods of prevention of this disease should be better known.

Tropical Typhus is a severe and debilitating fever which is occasionally fatal. It is caused by the bite of a tick. The ordinary grass tick which usually feeds on sheep and cattle, but which will, on occasion, attack both dogs and human beings has never been definitely proved to convey the disease though it is strongly suspected of doing so.

There are, however, two species of ticks which prefer to feed on dogs and may definitely be considered dog ticks; and of these species will attack human beings if opportunity offers and this species of tick which is usually proved to be a carrier of tropical typhus in a severe type. It is therefore most important to prevent dogs from becoming infested with ticks.

Life History.

A short account of the life history and habits of the tick may help to explain how infestation of human beings may be prevented. The eggs are usually deposited on the small ticks. These minute ticks climb blades of grass and, at the first opportunity, attach themselves to any warm-blooded animal that happens to brush through the grass, choosing for preference their own proper host. After feeding, the tick detaches itself and takes refuge in a convenient place. When the tick reaches its adult stage, it seeks out its own host and attaches itself to the skin and engorges as adult ticks are voracious. The female tick cannot produce eggs, however, until after it has taken a blood meal and become fully engorged. Once a tick has attached itself to its host it will not go to its host voluntarily until it is fully fed; this takes on an average about four days. A fully engorged tick cannot move far, and can only obtain access to a house by being brought there on the body of some animal.

It is obvious that a animal used likely to bring ticks into a house is the dog; and heavy infestation of a house can only occur if eggs are laid and young ticks actually hatched on the house.

This occurs when a dog brings in on its body a fully fed female tick which usually settles the cover of darkness, before leaving its host and making its way to shelter. Such a tick must have been on the dog's body for approximately four days before it can become engorged.

When a house is infested, ticks will be found under picture rails and shade rails; between and beneath floor boards; in crevices, behind door frames and in the wicker work of chairs.

Methods of Prevention.

The following measures will suggest the methods of prevention which should be adopted.

(1) For a reasonable dog should not be allowed within the house, unless thoroughly doused with ticks prior to drop off at night, dogs should not be allowed to sleep in the house.

(2) A tick must remain on the dog for approximately four days before it can become engorged; therefore, regular dousing of dogs should prevent the animal from being a source of ticks, except in the case of a dog's coat should be sprayed with paraffin and kerosene Pyrethrum mixture, or with one of the numerous proprietary sprays which are sold for such purposes.

(3) Where obvious power is available, the regular use of an electric vacuum cleaner will go far towards keeping the home free from ticks.

(4) Where a heavy infestation has been discovered it is advisable to remove picture rails, chair rails and skirting boards and destroy the ticks and their eggs by means of a blue lamp.

(5) Most patients suffering from Tropical Typhus give a history of having been bitten by a tick and, particularly, of having allowed the tick to become nearly fully fed before it was removed. It is in any reasonable case, or because they are not so fast, it is probable that, even if a

A REVIEW OF THE RAILWAY RATING POLICY.

Necessity of Economic Readjustments.

COUNTRY PRODUCE.

Full Consideration by Railway Advisory Council.

A review of the rating policy of the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours, as given in the General Manager's Bulletin No. 11, just issued, in which he repeats that it has been publicly stated with regard to the necessity for economic readjustments. Country produce, distribution rates, and grain rates are dealt with in detail.

With regard to the country produce, the Railway Advisory Council approved the proposals in the following three steps—

- 1. To decide which is the fair rate for such country produce in usual his, with equity to pay rates on other similar articles of similar or other nature.
2. To decide the fair rate to be applied to each particular article, on the basis of a fair rate without undue hardship, the attention to the fact, if the rate is higher, than the existing rate.
3. To consider whether in the present time and conditions, industry can bear without danger the addition of the special high import rates.

Apartment from a number of other countries, but longer engaged, there were some 40 commodities for which preferential rates were granted. After careful consideration and research, to ensure that no unfairness should be done to any section, a screen tariff, as it is called by the Railway Advisory Council and approved by the High Commissioner, that the following 20 items should be exempt from the Country Produce List with effect from January 1, 1934:

- 1. Beef, fresh or dried; 2. Bones, clean and polished; 3. Bees; 4. Birds, domestic or wild; 5. Butter, cream or salted; 6. Cattle, live or dead; 7. Eggs, fresh or dried; 8. Fish, fresh or dried; 9. Fruit, fresh or dried; 10. Milk, fresh or dried; 11. Oils and fats, refined or unrefined; 12. Sugar, refined or unrefined; 13. Wool, raw or spun.

In all except seven cases the preferential rates applied to the locally produced article has been maintained, although it is not altogether clear that these rates are in all respects fair rates, representing an equitable distribution of transport charges. This aspect of the matter will require further consideration at a later date, if necessary. The proposals will be discussed with the industries concerned at some future date and will also receive full consideration by the Railway Advisory Council before any action is taken on them.

Distribution Rates.

Regarding distribution rates, it is reiterated that "if generally desired after full consideration, the management would recommend their continuation, on the condition that protection against road competition must be maintained."

In the article headed "Grain rates, local movement" the arguments advanced by the General Manager at the meeting of the Associated Chambers of Commerce of Eastern Africa are set out in detail—like an examination has disclosed the existence of several undesirable features which necessitate a re-consideration of the present position of the railway as a burden upon the community at large. The first of these features is that the present condition of affairs from the viewpoint of rail rates, which are described as unattractive, both from the point of view of the consumer and general public and of the industry themselves. The general proposal is that, except for types of grain which command comparatively high prices, grain in small lots will be charged Class 6 and grain in wagon loads, Class 10. It is proposed, however, that wheat, which in normal times is of greater value than maize, should be placed in Class 7 in small lots and Class 9 in wagon loads. At the same time, it is also suggested that small

grain is taken by an infested tick, it will not contract the disease if the tick is removed within a short period.

It is important that householders generally should make the danger of allowing their houses to become infested with Tropical Typhus is undoubtedly preventable, and on any body exposed if precautions are suggested. A general adoption of preventive methods would very probably reduce the incidence of Tropical Typhus.

quantities of maize and maize flour, which are at present charged at Class 9, should when possible, in lots less than 10 tons be charged at Class 8. Against this increase, however, it is suggested that maize and maize flour in 10 ton lots should be charged at Class 10 with a maximum, instead of the existing rate Class 9 with a maximum of 20, 1 per 100 lbs., which becomes effective at 100 lbs. On the present movement of the minor grains such as pulses, barley, beans, mung beans, etc., it is not proposed to alter the rates on wheat flour except in the case of imported wheat flour. It is also intended to retain, as at present a special rate for local wheat flour against imported flour.

Import Rates on Grain.

With regard to imports, it is suggested the import rates on wheat and wheat flour should be abolished. Notice of these considerations, in normal times, is limited in quantity by country, as Customs duty and the ordinary means and results constitute ample protection. But in times of shortage, when wheat is imported, the rates on wheat flour should be inevitably have added for and applied. This normally creates difficulty, and it is proposed, therefore, to abolish the import rates which is never required.

In the case of iron, ships and palm oil, the proposed rate provides for an increase from Class 9 to Class 8 for small quantities and a reduction from Class 9 to Class 10 for consignments of 10 tons and over, but, at the same time, abolishes the Maximum Rate of Sh. 1140 per 100 lbs. The effect of this change is a reduction for all consignments over distances up to 215 miles.

"The whole question will be submitted to the Railway Advisory Council for consideration. Unless acceptable to the industries concerned, it is not proposed to press for their introduction at the present moment."

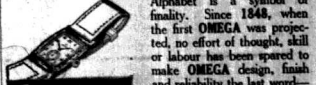

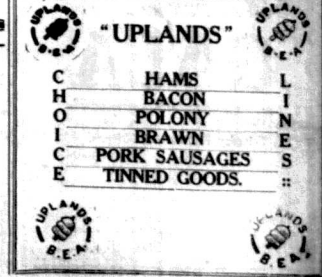

Chile is in total default. Peru in partial default. Brazil was £3,540,000 in arrears with her interest payments. Greece £2,000,000, Mexico \$4,400,000. On top of these is the latest news from Germany. Earlier in the year Germany agreed to pay 50 per cent of her external indebtedness. INVENTIONS IN 1933.

Over 36,000 Applications for Patents.

The number of applications for patents made by inventors in 1933 was 36,714. This figure is 308 less than that for last year. However, it is evident that applications by foreigners have dropped off, but there has been a marked improvement in the nature and possibilities of inventions made in the British Empire. It is doubtful whether there has been such practical progress made in 1933 as in the previous year. The number of inventions in the motor industry has been gradually stimulated by a number of generally good road change speed devices, many of which are purely automatic, there being a tendency to replace gear wheels with friction gear mechanisms and fluid pressure devices.

Probably the most important inventions are those not so readily noticeable, such as chemical, mechanical and treatment of waste. BRITISH DISARMAMENT VIEWS.

Memorandum Issued by the Government.

NEW DIRECTIVE SUGGESTIONS REQUIRED.

For Geneva Negotiations.

SUGGESTED ABANDONMENT OF CERTAIN CLASSES OF WEAPONS.

The British Draft Memorandum, the terms of which have already been communicated to Paris, Berlin, Rome, Washington and the other Governments principally concerned, has now been made public.

The first part of the Memorandum deals with the general reasons for its preparation and the second part explains the methods which the Government suggests as the most likely to bring about the aims expressed in the first part.

The principle of the equality of rights is stressed in the memorandum as being of equal importance with the general principle of security. Detailed suggestions are made also for the limitation of armaments.

Germany's Return To League.

London, Jan. 31. "We must seek a solution where a solution can be found," states the British Disarmament Memorandum published last evening.

The memorandum is in two parts, the first explains the reasons for issuing the present memorandum and says that the resumption of negotiations at Geneva, without any directive suggestions, would lead to further disappointment.

The discussions since last March had shown that the British Draft Memorandum was not acceptable. A solution involving the abolition of the right of withdrawal from certain powers was manifestly impossible to prevent. The Government could not escape from the conclusion that some permission to opt out could not be satisfactorily denied to member.

The clause for Europe leads to an agreement on a convention regarding the abandonment of certain classes of weapons. It is suggested that the countries which have not agreed to increase their present armaments. The Government generally proposes for active pursuit of the first course.

The bullion may acquire gold from storage in the United States, or from the United States Treasury, or from gold bullion imported, re-exported or placed in custody for the foreign or domestic market.

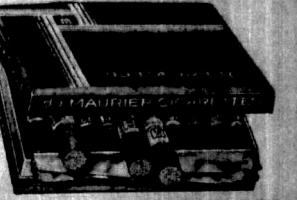

Enquiry into the Problems of Africa.

A COMPREHENSIVE SURVEY TO BE UNDERTAKEN

Preliminary Task.

SCHEME WHICH HAS BACKING OF COLONIAL OFFICE.

Towards the end of this year a number of well-known people headed by Sir Malcolm Hailey, at present Governor of the United Provinces in India, hope to embark on a general survey of African problems.

The task is expected to occupy a long time and it is not anticipated that the report embodying the findings of the enquiry will be available until some time in 1936.

Sir Malcolm Hailey's Work.

For the last two years a group of persons interested in the welfare and development of Africa, of which Lord Lothian is chairman and Lord Lugard, Mr. Cromley, Mr. Lancelotti, Mr. G. H. O'Sullivan, Sir Arthur Stanley, Professor G. H. O'Sullivan, and others, have had under consideration the scheme, headed by Governor Hailey in his Rhodes Lectures, to make a comprehensive study of African problems, and of the extent and character of the knowledge being used in dealing with them.

Funds Available.

Through the generosity of the Carnegie Corporation of New York funds have been placed at the disposal of this committee for the purpose of conducting a preliminary survey of the main problems of the whole of Africa south of the Sahara, in the Mediterranean region, with a view to discovering the extent and character of the knowledge regarding these and also seeing that there is further research.

The Malcom Hailey, at present Governor of the United Provinces in India, has undertaken, on his own initiative, to carry out this survey which is hoped to complete in 1936.

In the meantime the group, headed by Sir Malcolm Hailey, is collecting certain preliminary information, mainly in the scientific field, by means of a preliminary expedition, headed by Sir Malcolm Hailey, to be carried out in all fields which is being done in and on behalf of Africa.

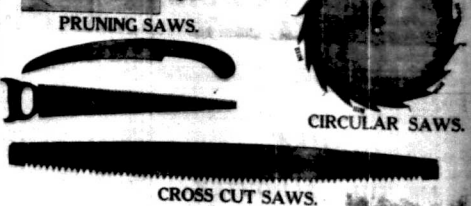

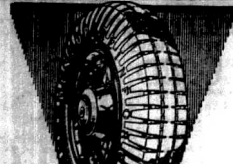

Gold Reaches Highest Price in History.

EFFECT OF AMERICAN CURRENCY PROGRAM

Heavy Exports to the States.

DANGER OF COMBAT BETWEEN DOLLAR AND STERLING.

As a result of the American currency programme and the devaluation of the dollar the price of gold has reached the highest point ever recorded in history. Instead of being based on the French gold standard franc, as hitherto, the price is now based on supply and demand.

There are fears that the American policy will result in a currency war between the dollar and sterling, as Britain is unwilling to pay the pound a fixed rate. Although the U.S.A. Treasury is only allowing the export of gold to standard countries, Britain can combat this by purchasing gold with francs.

It is stated that the return of America to the gold bullion standard has resulted in two opposed movements, namely the buying of gold on the cheaper European markets and selling in the domestic market, and also a rush to buy dollars and dollar securities.

There has been heavy shipments of gold to America chiefly by private institutions. The withdrawal of gold from the Bank of France has been considerable, as much as 500 million francs being withdrawn by one day.

France, however, at present, has decided not to place an embargo on gold as it is considered that the demand for dollars will not last long, but it is probable that the French bank rate will be raised.

He hoped, however, that the advent of better times for the farmer would be reflected in increased membership for the Association.

A New President.
 The election of officers willing to undertake the duties of president and secretary for the current year came up for consideration in view of the fact that both outgoing officers had decided not to stand for re-election, owing to the extensive programme of work for 1934 in their respective farms. The vacant presidency was given to Mr. Walter Mann who after requested requests was good enough to accept the position. Though Mr. Mann is not amongst the older settlers in the district, his business and shrewdness are well known and the association may be congratulated on the wisdom of its choice.
 The finding of a new secretary was a still more difficult matter and Mr. Mitchell who has already had three years of the work agreed to carry on for another term. The retiring president was accorded a well-earned and hearty vote of thanks. "Bargainmen and proposals for the betterment of the Association" having been given a place on the agenda of the meeting, this matter

was gone into under the new Presidency.
Coffee Industry.

After a short discussion it was decided to form a committee of coffee growers from amongst the most prominent planters in the district. The work of this committee is to cater for the interests of coffee growers. It will be responsible and report to that body monthly. Postage and other expenses mentioned to the functioning of the coffee committee would be paid for by the Association funds. It was decided to write the following coffee growers with a view to forming a committee as proposed—Messrs. Reynolds, Crumpton, Howard, Elmer, Best, By, East Hill Anderson (Anderson), D'Oyley, Powell, Leonard and Jackson with Mr. Maher local agricultural officer as ex-officio member.

Resolutions would be voted as on previous years and a meeting would be called at Kitalo on March 2 at which letters be given. It was hoped the new coffee committee would be in a position to play an important part in making the road a success and real help to coffee growers.
 Whilst on the subject of coffee it was brought to the notice of the meeting that the recent questionnaire issued by the Agricultural Department seeking information on the incidence of Coffee Berry Disease, had been largely ignored by coffee farmers. The meeting strongly condemned the apathy if farmers even in matters directly concerning their own personal interests.

Doctors in Conference. The second of the series of conferences of East African medical men was held a few days ago in Dar es Salaam and like the inaugural meeting which took place in Nairobi in 1922, it was productive of interesting and valuable discussions which are likely to have a considerable influence on the progress of health work in the territories. It is no sphere in the development of the conference system likely to achieve greater results than that in that of which makes possible an exchange of views and knowledge amongst people situated with the all important task of looking after the health of the community at large. The material discussion in this sort of the work depends to a very considerable extent upon the constant exchange of views. Medical science has done a great deal to transform modern medicine into a science and districts into areas where mankind is free without the constant fear of being open to attack by some epidemic and to be well, disease, but much remains to be done. There are still problems to be solved and these will be discussed by the doctors who are to be met by the meeting of the medical men which is to be held in Nairobi on the 10th and 11th of the month. 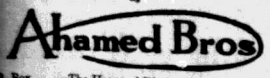
