Mobilisation of Troops in Paris.

GOVERNMENT'S FEAR OF DISORDER.

Tanks Rushed to the City.

PREPARATIONS FOR OPENING OF DEBATE IN CHAMBER.

The French Government fears a further outbreak of disorder in Paris, when its new Cabinet meets the Chamber for the opening of the debate on its policy, particularly in regard to the dismissal of the Prefect of the Paris Police and the Stavisky revelations.

Trains of the Paris garrison have been mobilized. Tanks are being rushed to the city, while two divisions have been ordered to march to the city. The remainder of the garrison has been warned to be ready for contingencies.

The action by the Government has brought the wrath of the Right opposition on its head and a stormy debate is expected. It is predicted, however, that the Socialists will save the Ministry from defeat, in return for the sacrifice of M. Chiappe.

A demonstration by one of the ex-soldiers organizations was dispersed by the police and Republican Guards, while it is stated that the Republicans intend to stage a demonstration outside the Chamber during the debate.

corruptly to accept among other names £200 from Harris on December 17, 1931, and a guarantee by Harris of his account at the National Provincial Bank, Moore gets up to £1,000. A Leopold Harris was the holder of a fire insurance company who were frequently employed by claimants in this case. Harris had, according to the prosecution, when Miles, opponent before the Magistrate at Bow Street, been for some years the subject of the deposit suspension by the Fire Officers' Committee, and he was considered as a particularly dangerous person. Miles as Chief Officer of the Salvage Corps, regularly attended meetings of the Committee where the activities of Harris were frequently discussed. It was Miles' duty to protect the interests of the fire office, and those interests were in sharp contrast to the interests of those persons making insurable claims. It was Miles' duty to see that the claimants received no more than that to which they were entitled. One of the services due which Harris would pay would be for obtaining information of fire, so that he could be very early on the scene, and if he could arrange to be employed to give him instant information, obviously it was a very great advantage. Such information was regularly conveyed to Leopold Harris or his partner in the Salvage Corps, and if it alleged, Miles himself.

Fire Conspiracy Trial.
The Leopold Harris and a number of associates were charged with a conspiracy in regard to the fire which occurred at a factory in all parts of the country. Harris was sentenced to 14 years' penal servitude. It is alleged that when the prosecution of the fire conspiracy gang was imminent, Miles, who was deep in the confidence of the persons having charge of those proceedings, and at a time when money was plentiful, betrayed the plans and designs of the advisers to the insurance companies for money received from Leopold Harris. deduction, it must remain for the present part of the case of interesting anecdote which too often passes in Africa for anthropological fact. With his belief that I have not proved very much, I cordially agree. On each occasion of many specimens, widely removed from Mr. Leakey's province of archæology, results are not obtained in a night. Dr. Vint and I have already expressed our conviction that our results are but a small fraction of the total knowledge that ought to be acquired before science can be said to have made any progress. With all reference to the work of learning from which it is written, I can hardly repeat the letter of Dr. Cyril Hart as a serious contribution to the subject. It is directed wholly to what Dr. Hart calls a "close scrutiny of conclusions" which he states I have drawn. His statement is a misrepresentation. His alleged "conclusions" are opposed to each view as I have ventured to express in print as questions to which the answers remain hidden, but need not so remain. "Allow me to add. See that it is now over 10 years since I first became acquainted with the African in his own retirement, and to urge from practice, study that his highest interest are centered in the great problem brought into prominence by the small research it has been my privilege to report. The solution of the problem requires first, a close observation of racial, political and other problems; secondly, a close research, carefully and liberally planned, directed by great scientific minds; and thirdly, the necessary funds. The object I submit, is one to measure those who have faith in Africa and faith in science."

THE CATHEDRAL.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."
Sir—It might have been expected that, according to a very recent revelation, some Judah would have objected to an aesthetic offering in this case the location and development of the Cathedral on the ground that the tower would be better spent on the Post. This has not happened, however, because the history reply of the Founder of the Cathedral, the subject was a completely constructive.

It has been left to a clergyman of the Church of England to offer objection to the fine line of work of those interested in the proper and economical financing of the new organ, and to the fact that the Reverend Richard Allen, who has been in charge of the Cathedral, admits apathy as a reproach to the people in Kenya.

Putting over the objection of such public criticism, the Church of England, in its action undertaken by those responsible for the Cathedral, may owe it to Mr. Allen for his charitable consideration that the stirring of public opinion and the matter may possibly be explained in some, at any rate, spiritual sense, as a matter of constructive.

If this be so, then it becomes a matter of some importance. What over the ways and means? What is the real intention of the Church is now seriously considered forward can be intricate but the decision looked by hard work.

Mr. Allen says: "The appearance of the Cathedral is only a symptom of a disease." On the contrary to the man in the street, the fact that it is all well and that it has progressed so far in the face of all other hindering circumstances, is an interesting proof that some at least of the clergy and laity of Kenya are filled with determined religious and patriotic feelings and their Church, a source of no believe that that devotion is now going to continue itself further as an increase in the amenities and beauty of the Cathedral of the Highlands.

This has been the way in past ages, and the love and self-sacrifice of our fathers, manifested in the beautiful old buildings of the Highlands, are always in the construction by an inspiration and encouragement to such an end as the Vatican. It is not a question of awaiting the attainment of some ideal spiritual state; the initiative taken is evidence that the spiritual force is adequate for a start to be made. The Cathedral, like the Church itself, is there for all who will avail themselves of it. It is too much to hope that many will be drawn to the work as it proceeds, and that the struggle and effort they may find a deepening of their effective spiritual life.

But one is thrown into doubt as to whether the reverent writer of the letter in your "today's paper" has informed himself as to what is proposed. His words: "The provision of a large and magnificent building" certainly do not apply. No "magnificent" building has been planned nor is it proposed to "doubt a towering wall with unimpaired towers and spires." The proposed building starts with the contrast that may well be made a good show: they seek the acquisition of a reasonable Christian community by ensuring a solution which involves no further addition to the work.

We are prepared to admit at once and our real and earnestness are very very far short of what they should be, but when Mr. Allen was perusing his letter, if he had been listening, it is possible that he might have heard the whisper of a well known voice saying: "Judge not."

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard,"
I beg to quote a letter received by me today from the Town Clerk of the Nairobi Municipality—dated 21st January last. May I suggest that you be good enough to find space in your "E.A. Standard" to publish it. There has been—and still is—considerable objection to the Council's avowed intention to withdraw permission for keeping side-parked buses to remain in Sixth Avenue and elsewhere. The Council claims ownership of the footpaths, and objects to certain parties of shops adjoining these footpaths, serving their customers from the buses, erect their awnings. Now—the suggestion that owners of Sixth Avenue property should bear the cost of "flagging" the footpaths which are the property of the Municipality, has outraged the Municipality, through its Town Clerk.

My argument, the obvious reply of property owners whose premises are used for the Motor Trade might well be that if they consent to "flag or pave" the footpaths owned by the Municipality that Authority should willingly give a "quid pro quo" in exchange by allowing petrol pumps to remain on their footpaths, where their removal would create hardship on the owner, or the tenant or both of them.

The Town Clerk's letter quotes specific instances, notably of a bank, and an oil company, who have at their own expense put down elaborate paving on the Municipal footpaths. I suggest that the creation of these two instances, in a way, fair, or should be advanced for comparison with other, and more modest property owners, who might believe that it is certain cases, the Municipality has either neglected the whole or part of the cost of paving for certain important property owners in another part of the town.

I hold, that it is the duty of the Municipality to subsidize the Sixth Avenue Side Roads with out asking property owners to make up their footpaths for them in exactly the same manner as they made the main Sixth Avenue Road without a similar charge.

I also regard the position as an unbalanced offer—try to ask certain property owners to spend their money on Municipal footpaths in addition to paying their ordinary rates, and simultaneously to threaten to deprive certain occupants of their livelihoods and livelihoods of their lives. Have not we said enough of this nonsense? Have we not solemnly on the Legislative Council to represent commercial interests? There seems to be a singular parity of "fair mind" in the Municipal Council at the present time.

The suggestion that the property owners concerned might reasonably be asked to defray the cost of paving or flagging the footpaths, does not involve any new principle or principle in Government Road have been paid for the cost of constructing footpaths, and in Sixth Avenue the cost of flagging the footpath in front of the Standard Bank of South Africa and Rhodes House was paid for by the Bank and the Shell Company, other property owners have entered into a similar arrangement, and it is understood that several of the property owners in Sixth Avenue have already intimated their willingness to defray the cost of flagging the footpath co-extensive with their premises.

The Municipal Council will be glad to learn that you are agreeable to fall in with the proposal, which does not appear to them to be unreasonable, as they are proposing to expend approximately £2,000 in contriving the roadway portion to a far standard, or equal specification.

If it would assist the owners in coming to a decision, the Municipal Engineer will be pleased to furnish an estimate of the cost of making up the footpaths to each owner concerned.

EMPLOYED IN SOUTH AFRICA.

Nearly 2250,000 Spent in Three Years.

STANDARD CORRESPONDENT, Durban, Jan. 28 (By Air Mail).

Nearly a quarter of a million pounds has been spent by the Cape Town City Council during the last three years in providing work for the unemployed of the Peninsula. Through the unemployment problem has been somewhat alleviated by the steady improvement in trade conditions, the Unemployment Committee of the City Council is considering a proposal to raise a loan of £100,000 to finance further advances for the relief of unemployment.

In view of the fact, however, that the Government has definitely promised to consider Cape unemployment during the present session of parliament, the Finance Committee is not prepared to recommend that further steps be taken at present to raise the loan.

Government's Turn.

The Council has still a balance of £20,000 to spend on relief work, but when this has been exhausted they will be no further funds to finance such schemes.

In these circumstances the committee recommends that urgent representations be addressed to the Government to press forward its legislative programme to deal with unemployment on local, national and provincial levels, and to request the Government to consider the possibility of a loan of £100,000 to finance further advances for the relief of unemployment.

TACTICS IN GOLF

Penalty Stroke in Foursome Play. Does not Affect Rotation. A MUCH DEBATED POINT.

In a foursome match, a player, or driver of and puts his ball out of bounds, without the partner's consent, should drive the second ball. The question cropped up at the week end, just as it has cropped up on innumerable occasions to my knowledge. There is absolutely no doubt as to what the rule is. It is distinctly stated in the rules, yet those are first instance should drive again. The second ball counts three strokes, but the first stroke must be taken by the same player. There is no greater error. The penalty for a ball out of bounds is stroke and distance, but a 'penalty stroke does not affect the rotation of play. Definition 14 in the Rules of Golf says: 'A penalty stroke is a stroke added to the score of a side on certain rules, and does not affect the rotation of play. Nothing could be more distinct to my mind.'

Rule 3 says: 'In a three-stroke or foursome the partners shall alternate in driving the ball on the teeing ground, and shall alternate during the play of each hole if a player plays when his partner should have played, his side shall be penalized.' Rule 3 and A. Decision. In singles it is not important to distinguish between an ordinary and a penalty stroke, but in foursome play it is all-important to know which partner of a side must play, and which partner may play in a match and bogey play in a hole. In a stroke play side qualification if one partner plays when the other should have done. This decision was given by the Royal and Ancient to a query from the London Golf Club (L.G.C.). 'Take the case where the local rule is that a ball driven out of bounds is not penalized, but the hole is to be played in the mind of all as to who must play. If a player plays when he is not to play, the hole is to be played in the mind of all as to who must play. Peaceful Morning in French Capital. CITY RETURNS TO NORMAL CONDITIONS. Troops Still Standing By. M. DOUMERGUE COMMENCES HIS TASK OF FORMING A CABINET.

A peaceful morning in Paris followed a night of rioting on Thursday. There were still crowds in the streets but there was no sign of disorder, although troops occupied various spots as precautionary measures. M. Doumergue received a rousing reception by huge crowds when he arrived at the capital by train. He was loudly cheered as he drove from the station to the Elysee to interview President Lebrun. M. Doumergue spent the day in consultation with political leaders with a view to forming a cabinet. Crowds waited outside the Quai D'Orsay during the afternoon and evening, eager to learn the names of the new Ministers.

Although the Cabinet has not yet been officially announced it is stated that some posts have already been filled. Included in the authoritative forecasts are the appointments of Marshal Petain as Minister for War and Admiral Lacaze as Minister for Marine, while a military officer is likely to be appointed Minister for Air.

Other Cabinet portfolios are being filled by a second either as Ministers or by suitable non-Ministers.

Ministerial Forecast. [NEWS SERVICE'S AGENCY.] Paris, Feb. 9. All was apparently peaceful this morning in the capital as the first military deliveries being the only activity in the streets. The crowds were held back at the Quai D'Orsay by an imposing line of helmeted cavalry. M. Doumergue was escorted to the Elysee where he conferred for half an hour with President Lebrun, before his political consultations with a view to forming a Cabinet. The sitting of the Chamber this morning only lasted 20 minutes. M. Doumergue is expected to be appointed till a Cabinet was formed.

Olderly Crowds. The excitement of France to learn the names of the new Cabinet is shown by the large crowds waiting for hours during the afternoon and evening outside the Quai D'Orsay. M. Doumergue is forming his Cabinet. Troops stood by as the courtyard. Comment February 9. [NEWS SERVICE'S AGENCY.] Paris, Feb. 9. Chamber of Deputies opened in many parts of France yesterday but with very little effect, except at Lyons where there were a few disturbances and stops.

HUGE SHIPPING MERGER. The White Star and Cunard. With Treasury Consent. [NEWS SERVICE'S AGENCY.] London, Feb. 9. The Financial Secretary of the Treasury, Major J. Hain-Edwards, announced in the House of Commons today that a formal agreement had been reached between the Cunard and White Star Lines, the two largest shipping companies in the world, for the formation of a new company to be known as the White Star Line. The new company will have a capital of £100 million and will be controlled by the British Government.

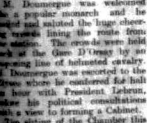

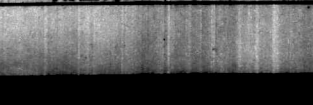
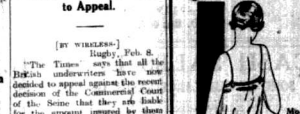

6TH AVENUE SIDE ROAD.

To the Editor "E.A. Standard,"
Sir, Although the Council have referred to the side roads in 6th Avenue was fully explained in the meeting of the Municipal Council, there appears to be a little misunderstanding in the minds of some of those "intoxicated."

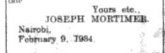
It is probable that if there had been no financial difficulty, the question of the pavements would not have arisen. The side roads would have been made up and the sidewalks left for the owners to pave them or not as they pleased at the same way as Government Road and other streets.

These side roads have been included in the Municipal road programme three years ago. The programme then made it the duty of the Council to make up the roads and sidewalks and to make the estimates for revenue have been sent down which made it imperative that the programme should also be sent down. Towards the close of last year, when the gully traffic had been made a condition of the programme, it was suggested that while the plan and the map were on the way a meeting of about £200 could be effected by doing the side roads. The Council at that time agreed to be unamiss that the side roads of the Avenue as far as the Railway Crossing, which he does this year and consented to the plan of the Council. At the special meeting of the Council held for the purpose of accepting the estimate for this year and laying the rate, the necessary arrangements were made on the road programme had to be re-considered.

Many of the owners in 6th Avenue were so anxious that their side roads should not be left out that they voluntarily offered to defray the cost of having the sidewalks in a form of the property made up in order to have the work done this year. These included the Post Office and several of the largest frontages. I believe the first one was taken to the Town Clerk by Councilor Newmark.

There seemed to be anything unfair in accepting these offers but it would be unfair to have gone unpaid as is the case in Government Road, and thus perpetuate the debt and mud. He the method proposed by the Municipal Council the work can be done at the most possible cost to the owners, there will be uniformity in the pavements and 6th Avenue will compare favourably with many of the splendid streets and boulevards in Britain and other countries.

All this with no objection to any one.

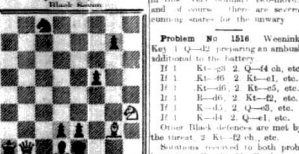

SCENE IN HIGH COURT.

Racehorse Offered for Sale.

SIX A BUTT AWARDED DAMAGES

A Racehorse was offered for sale in the King's Bench Division.

The offer was made during an action in which Sir Alfred Butt was awarded £150 damages and costs against Mr. C. Hesterston, a trainer of Stockbridge (Hants), for issuing to a racehorse to be ridden by Misses Langston, after it had run at Goodwood last July.

Sir Alfred contended that the owners were liable for the award of Langston just before the weekend was closed, and that it was now worth only about £100.

Mr. Fox Anderson addressing the court on behalf of Sir Alfred Butt, remarked that his client had authorized him to say "here and now" that he would sell Langston for £100 if he could.

Mr. Justice Macnaghten: This is not "faterial" as you know, Langston.

Mr. Fox Anderson: No, but I made the offer. This is the only occasion on which I may have the opportunity of offering a racehorse for sale and I offer it to anybody for £100 and the offer will remain open and the hammer will not fall.

Mr. Justice Macnaghten, giving judgment said the stable had bought Langston against the driver of the horsebox to go on his side. The driver of a motor vehicle seeing a racehorse coming along, added the judge, with reasonable experience, intelligence and ordinary reasonable care, and considering the narrowness of the lane where the accident took place, would at least have stopped his vehicle, if not his engine as well.

MORE DISORDER IN PARIS.

Baricades Erected in the Streets.

CAVALRY CHARGE RELIEVES BELEAGUERED POLICE.

New Ministry Formed.

M. DOUMERGUE ASSURED OF SWEEPING MAJORITY IN PARLIAMENT.

There was a further outbreak of disorder in Paris on Friday night, resulting in a number of casualties. The riot, however, was not of such a serious nature as that on the previous Tuesday, owing chiefly to the fact that the authorities had taken special precautions.

The demonstrators on this occasion erected baricades at various points and these seriously held up the movements of the police. A police station was besieged and was only relieved by a cavalry charge.

It is stated that M. Chiappe, the Prefect of the Paris Police, whose dismissal from his post, brought about the downfall of the Daladier Cabinet, is likely to be appointed French Ambassador to Brussels.

M. Doumergue has succeeded in forming a Cabinet, chiefly of ex-Ministers. The War and Air portfolios have, however, been accepted by the distinguished soldiers, entirely unopposed with politics.

The new Ministry which embraces all parties, except the Socialists and Communists, is expected to command a sweeping majority both in the Chamber and Senate.

Marshal Petain Accepts Office.


