farm. Although it is anticipated that the yield of European-grown maize will be very considerably below that of last season, the present lack of rain, with less water and drier winds, is unfortunately having a serious effect on the maize crop, in particular in the native reserves of the Kikuyu Province.

The present prospects, the yield of wheat will be something like 100,000 bags, and of barley, a season's yield of 60,000 bags, that it appears that the Colony will still have to import wheat in this respect, besides continuing to supply neighbouring territories requirements.

### Royal Industry.

The position of the steel industry is more favourable than for some time past. The total quantity received at the Coast for export during the period of 1935 was a record for the Colony, the figures for six-monthly periods since the beginning of 1934 being: 6,800 tons, 7,200 tons, 5,900 tons, 9,000 tons. The tons and (chiefly) steel may be said to be in a favourable state as to which to bring under consideration, especially as some of the steel which is sent to the East African, it is essential that East Africa is to maintain its position against the competing services of other countries, it is ready to supply and as far as possible anticipate every new demand for steel there, we must therefore take advantage of every improvement in machinery and in the technical and economic organization.

### Other Commodities.

Without going into too much detail, it may be mentioned that the situation in regard to tea and coffee has also materially improved. The situation in regard to coffee, butter, sisal and waste work is unfortunately at the moment not so favourable.

The recent rise in coffee prices is to be welcomed as some effect on the decline in the crop yield owing to the unseasonable drought of 1935, and the recovery in the condition of the trees after the November rains promises well for the main crop of 1936 provided the Colony enjoys, as I hope it will, good rains in the near future.

"As far as butter is concerned, as I stated in my last Legislative Council speech, a departure which should go far to bring equality into the native reserves and at the same time to contribute towards overhauls in the handling of produce of European-owned farms, is the supply of bottled butter to natives by the Co-operative Societies. Though this kind of arrangement will not be without its initial difficulties, I have every confidence that a successful scheme will be evolved within a reasonable space of time. There is some hope, too, of opening up new markets for goods."

### Cattle and Hides.

"Although, I fear, partially due to the number of cattle that died owing to the drought, the quantity of hides exported during 1935 is expected to be in excess of 90,000 sets. This is greater than in any previous year. From the immediate standpoint, the value of the export in 1935 will be some 50 per cent greater than in the year previous year. In attending the efforts of improving the production of the hides and this commodity will doubtless be one of our important objects. Experiments in the disposal of native cattle for the most part are being continued, and it is hoped that these, if successful, will lead ultimately to the disposal of the hides and of overstocking in native reserves."

### The Gold Field.

"You may have seen in the Press that I recently paid a visit to the gold fields, and from what I saw I am able to say a few words to your fellow citizens. There is no possibility that the Secretary of State may be able to go to Kakungu on Thursday next week, and an announcement is being made in that neighbourhood, but we are naturally anxious that he should do nothing to weaken his strength. He is intensely anxious to visit East Africa, and will give him an insight not only into mining conditions, but also as regards the effects that are being made both by the Government and the natives in the mining industry."

### Members.

"There has, as you are aware, been some discussion over events in the Southern country, particularly with regard to matters that have been committed there and to the difficulty of obtaining evidence sufficient to bring the perpetrators to justice. Evidence has now been produced to the satisfaction of the Supreme Court that, owing to the influence of the Talion Olo Olo, the administration was being hampered in this respect, and he was recommended for deposition by the Judge. The recommendations, supported by the Government of the Government-in-Council, and arrangements have been made to send him to Kenya in the Coast Pioneer."

### Civil Service Board.

"The fourth Interim Report of the Civil Service Board will be laid on the table during the Session. This, and the other reports, have been laid before Executive Council, and the Board will be asked to consider that a special meeting of the Council has been called to give consideration to the very complete details. It is hoped that I shall be able to give you more definite information about the new Local Civil Service during the next Council meeting in April."

Agricultural Research in East Africa.

VALUABLE WORK CARRIED OUT AT AMANI.

A New Species of Sisal.

INTENSIVE STUDY OF COFFEE ROOT SYSTEMS MADE IN KENYA.

The first annual report of the East African Agricultural Research Station at Amani, Tanganyika, has recently been published. The Amani Institute occupies a corresponding position to the Veterinary research station at Kabete and the Sleeping Sickness research station at Entebbe.

Amani has a staff of some 15 fully qualified scientists and research workers including the Director, Dr. J. G. Nowell. The Entomologist spent the greater part of his first year of work in Kenya Colony investigating coffee problems.

In addition to extensive and valuable research into coffee problems, most important work has been done in connection with animal improvements. The Institute has been experimenting with a new species of Apave which in many ways is proving superior to sisal.

Streak Disease of Maize.

Dr. Nowell in his report to the authorities carried out by the Department of Agriculture has completed an intensive study of the streak disease of maize as developed under the conditions of the principal districts of Kenya, for comparison, of two districts in Kenya. The root systems of 200 plants were examined in a vertical section and charted. Extensive research has been carried out in connection with the disease and it appears that a close correlation exists between the root system and the disease of the soil profile. 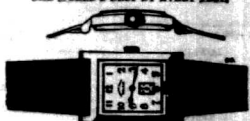

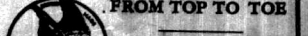

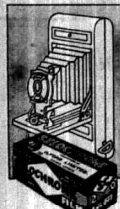

Levy Imposed on Sisal Fibre for Export.

BILL PASSED BY LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

To Finance Research.

FUND TO BE ESTABLISHED FROM PROCEEDS.

The Kenya Legislative Council yesterday passed through the second reading of a Bill to impose a levy on the export of sisal fibre. The Bill is to be fixed by the Governor in Council after the maximum being 10 cents per hundredweight.

Under the terms of the Bill a fund will be established from the proceeds of the levy, to be devoted to research into the sisal industry and to research in connection with the production of the Government up to a limited amount.

The Colonial Secretary explained that a levy on sisal had been recommended by the Agricultural Commission in 1929 and in 1930 a Bill was drafted, but owing to the depression it was not proceeded with. He added that a similar Bill had been passed in Tanganyika and that the funds would be disbursed by Ministry agreement.

Government Contribution.

Among the Bills passed by the Kenya Legislative Council at its sitting yesterday was one to amend the law in respect of the sisal industry and to regulate the expenditure of the proceeds thereof. The Bill grants for the purpose of the improvement of the sisal industry.

Containing certain clauses and operative until the end of 1938, it provides for a levy on all sisal exported from the sisal plant. It also provides for a fund to be established from the proceeds of the levy, to be devoted to research into the sisal industry and to research in connection with the production of the Government up to a limited amount.

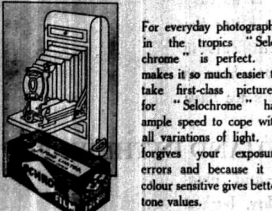

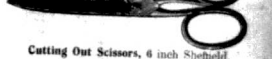

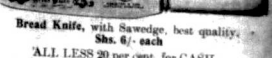

**AN EXPLANATION TO NON-ANGLICANS.**

To the Editor "E. A. Standard," Sir—The point of view of the non-Episcopal Churches in regard to Church Union requires some explanation and we therefore desire to put forward clearly, for the benefit of Anglicans and non-Anglicans alike the basis, as we understand it, of the present agreement.

We believe that the Church of England in this respect has been very generous, inasmuch as to accept the Church of the East Africa, which will accept only those of the best elements in the heritage and tradition of the existing Churches.

For Anglicans this means that they recognize the fact that the Church of the East Africa has been and encouraged same through the ministry and work of the non-Anglican Churches, while we, on our part, gratefully acknowledge that the Christian cause in every land owes to the Church of England, in the United Church, a debt of gratitude.

But the United Church will also be the Church of the East Africa, and it will be no more pro-tem or extension of any one of the existing Churches, but the result of the genuine union of its constituent members in true and sincere fellowship and mutual trust. For this great ideal the best terms we can suggest are those which suggest organic union and growth. Under the United Church, the best of the same implies no disparagement of the ordination of one own ministers. It is regarding matters for that 30 years according to the inauguration of the Union the ordained ministers of the participating Churches will be received in the government of the United Church.

In accepting the Episcopate, the non-Anglican Churches are primarily concerned to secure the unification of the ministry within the United Church. Massive Damage Caused by Artillery Fire.

IMPOSSIBLE TO EXTINGUISH BLAZING HOUSES IN THE FIRING ZONE.

Attacks on the few remaining Socialist strongholds have been successful and as a result the strike has collapsed and resistance is nearly at an end.

The use of mountain artillery has proved effective but it has necessitated the destruction of many modern buildings not only by the shells themselves but also by the outbreak of fire following bombardment.

It is now officially admitted that well over a thousand people have been killed. Though Dr. Dollfus promised an amnesty to the strikers who would lay down their arms, stern reprisals have been taken against the leaders and already two prominent Socialists have been hanged.

Government Reorganization.

**FENCING ORDINANCE.**

Discussed by Usain Gikha Farmers.

[STANDARD'S CORRESPONDENT.]

At a public meeting held at the Southern Union Fencing Farmers Association, the partial application of the Fencing Ordinance 1920 was discussed.

A letter from the Director of Agriculture was read explaining that the Ordinance had not yet been brought into operation as Government was not in a financial position to meet the obligations under the Ordinance and also that until lately funds had not been available to meet applications to the Land Bank for loans for fencing under the Ordinance, ranking in priority to any mortgage secured on the land.

After considerable discussion the meeting decided that while the partial application of the Ordinance was not to be applied to the future fencing applications, the suggestion of the partial application of the Ordinance was impracticable in any way for some years. Some groups of farms of sufficient size to justify their becoming a protected area were, more than one of them did not appear to possess lands suitable for fencing, roads, to such an extent as to financially preclude the owner from obtaining the partial application proposal, and until more funds were available from the Land Bank to assist farmers who should be compelled to fence under such a partial application.

**Dipping.**

The meeting was further of the opinion that until the Fencing Ordinance can be applied it is useless to apply the Cattle Dipping Ordinance as dipping without fencing was everywhere acknowledged to be insufficient to protect the cattle.

A further letter from the Director of Agriculture was read. It was decided to refer the question of the partial application of the Ordinance to the best type of fencing to be used to a Committee selected by the meeting and immediately afterwards the meeting recommended for an economical and sound boundary fence.

The rubus situation was discussed with the District Veterinary Officer and it was reported that the rubus menace in the district was on the wane and it was thought that the remaining stock holding, being carried out until the grass is short, or unless further outbreaks should occur.

**DISCOVERER OF KAKAMEGA.**

Mr. L.A. Johnston's Case to be Considered.

In view of the valuable services which was largely responsible for the development of the Kakamega goldfields, the Government is prepared to give due credit to the services he has rendered in considering any application he might make for a mining concession.

The above information was supplied in Legislative Council yesterday in reply to the following question put by Mr. Conway Hayes (Laloo): "Will Government be pleased to consider the prospect of showing public appreciation in some practical manner of the valuable services rendered by Mr. L. A. Johnston in the discovery of the Kakamega goldfields?"

The Colonial Secretary replied as follows:—Government is prepared, in considering an application on the part of Mr. L. A. Johnston for a mining concession, to give due credit to the services he has rendered in the mining in the district in Kenya by the discovery of the Kakamega goldfields.

Mr. T. J. O'Shea (Laloo) inquired whether any of the services rendered by Mr. Johnston had been entered into a certain amount of consideration.

Application Refused.

The Colonial Secretary stated that naturally Government would give them equal consideration.

Mr. O'Shea then mentioned the meeting of the application to Government of Mr. Johnston in having refused his application.

While this latter was true, he replied the Colonial Secretary, it is interesting that the application was allowed in the manner described.

Crime Committee Report to be considered.

The Lamuka.

Mr. Conway Hayes (Nairobi) asked if the speaker could not give some indication of the measures being taken to deal with the trial of the Lamuka.

The Colonial Secretary replied that he had recently been the subject of a careful investigation by Mr. D. O. Brumage, the District Commissioner, who had particular knowledge of the Lamuka trial. The general result was that he believed the Lamuka, who exercised a very strong influence, were really, at the bottom of a great deal of the crime.

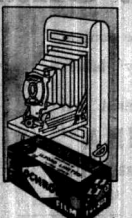

## ECONOMIC RECONSTRUCTION.

(Continued from page 5.)

self in close cooperation with Government in devising a solution to its economic difficulties. Without exception, the men offering themselves as candidates at the forthcoming elections were pledged to that policy, because the same course gives that that co-operation would be welcomed and result in active measures to find the solution needed. What was going to be the position of those men at the first step of carrying out that policy was withheld by Government.

"Can you imagine it going to the length of not allowing the Government to do what it deems might be, it was dependent on the moral support and co-operation of the people for a continuance of its existence. On the other hand if it went forth, despite the difficulties foreseen by the statements of the Secretary of State, that Government was determined the facts should be explored and a case made, which would give new life and hope to the country, and it would encourage those who had struggled through difficult years to continue their struggle; it would accustom the people towards recovery already in operation.

"If Government has the courage to take that step, the results in the next twelve months will be well worth to come to look back on this day when something was done for which we could not credit."

### A Definite Undertaking.

The secretary to the motion was the leader of the European Elected Members, Lord Francis Scott, Biff Vane, who reminded the Council that a similar motion, similarly worded and seconded, was introduced by him in 1925, and was given its effect by His Excellency to appoint this Committee to a definite undertaking, and to consider whether it was possible to give in public in this form by the Governor of the Colony should not be implemented. It is it would be a terrible thing if others if the word of our Governor of Kenya known as a mere puff of air.

Lord Francis, like the previous speaker, believed that a second case could be put up to show that Kenya was in a financial position to carry further loan funds, and that the financiers would judge the case on its merits.

In further remarks Lord Francis differed with the view of the Secretary of State that a construction loan was in fact a method of relief and not development, arguing that relief to hard pressed farmers to enable them to carry on was definitely a measure for the development of the country.

### Effect on Country.

The motion was supported by Lt.-Col. the Hon. J. G. Kirkwood, (Trans Nyanza) who wondered whether the refusal of Government to

accept the motion was an attempt to stultify the country back on the constitutional issue on the eve of the general elections. He too hoped that Government would accept it, and advise the Secretary of State accordingly, so that the effect on the country would be desirable. It made him wonder too whether it would not be a good thing to give Tanganyika back to the Germans so that the Imperial authorities would free them to hold to establish a very strong European settlement and to bind their own in this part of the world on behalf of the Empire. He was speaking as an Imperialist who had spent several years of his life in service on behalf of the Empire to keep it flying, and it was a most deplorable thing to have to speak on a motion like this.

The speaker hoped that Government would not allow the motion to be put but would defer it for further consideration.

### The Government's Case.

Major the Hon. J. O. K. Delap (Ukamba) having supported the motion in a similar manner, the Colonial Secretary, immediately following the adjournment, replied on behalf of the Government. It was because of the fact, he said, of the desire to forward as rapidly as possible the recovery from the economic depression that Government accepted the motion of this committee. They felt then with the information before them that its activities would be fruitful, and that one of its duties would be to examine the financial position of the Colony and to gauge whether or not further loan funds for whatever purpose would be required, and if so what was the likelihood of the Colony being able to obtain them.

Indeed, during the interval the Treasurer and himself had informally discussed the terms of reference.

When the Secretary of State visited the Colony it was reasonable, he thought, before agreeing either on the terms of reference or the appointment of the committee to get some information from him as to the chances of the Colony being able to obtain further loan monies. Members had been quite frankly informed at the interview as to the position of that matter. In view of that pronouncement Government felt some hesitation in proceeding with the appointment, or if he might say so, they felt that to proceed with the appointment of a committee which would explore the different demands for loan funds was an operation which would probably take a considerable time; only to know that when such an application was made at home it would be turned down would be wasting the time of members, and also it might be leading the public in general to foster false hopes which would not be satisfied.

### Committee to be Appointed.

However, the sum of the debate that evening had based on rather different lines. The point had been taken that a primary was made by Government, a pledge given, a pledge that it was not going to be fulfilled.

"I agree that it would be unthinkable to suggest that a pledge given upon open terms in Kenya is not going to be honored," (Hear, hear!) the hon. member for saying that it is the view held by hon. members opposite, and that the real question before the House is whether or not the pledge given by Government, even though the appointment of the committee may not result in what was originally proposed, with the appointment of the Government. (Applause.)

**Terms of Reference.**

The terms of reference had not been decided on, and it would be considered by the Executive Committee, but the speaker wanted his friends in the light of cold realities. He explained that hard-headed financiers in London would not be influenced by speeches, but by an examination of the Colony's finances.

The Secretary of State had fought Kenya's battles in the past, but he had stated he had got to present these data to business men, and that it would probably be better done through the various industries which had already their organizations which he congratulated and commended. The difference between Government and the Executive Committee was, rather the Colonial Secretary was not a master of technique. That was the only difference, then he repeated his authority from the Governor, and the committee would be appointed.

On behalf of the elected members, Capt. the Hon. H. G. Selwanger (Nairobi North) expressed their pleasure at this decision with which Mr. O'Flaherty associated himself.

The motion was then put and carried unanimously.





A COFFEE PROBLEM.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard," Sir—A letter under heading "A Coffee Problem" and signed by "Foster" makes me think not only an interesting question but one of considerable importance to the Colony. He states, that he has managed, amongst other things, "to get the most of what he knows, what with, and in what proportion" and "quantity."

It seems, therefore, that bumper crop can never be produced unless the "Law of Minima" is rigidly adhered to, as it is mentioned in para 14 page 7. The plant cannot produce a profitable crop without danger to its life, unless it can absorb an amount of nitrogen from the soil sufficient to balance" etc. etc.

Another point of interest is the following statement which also appears in the same paragraph: "Fibrous roots are killed by excessive soil temperature. If this is so, one may imagine that soil bacteria in any humus surrounding the tree are also rendered incapable and consequently nitrogen plant food sterilized and made useless." A few days ago, I was in the tropics of the soil at a depth of five inches, to be in 60 deg. Fahr. temperature in the afternoon. What is a suitable soil temperature or, rather, what is the danger point there?

"Hansen" also states that in his reared puppets his coffee. They are no doubt of some interest but I should prefer to see included in the report a chemical analysis of the soil of the berry. One would think that during the period of an actual period what material the tree was feeding on, and which was most probably affecting the ripening of the various constituents, especially when compared with prices received, over the same period.
