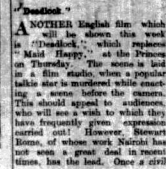

## PUBLIC SERVICE.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard," Sir.—It would be interesting to know what is the practical value of the statistics of "Cognizable Offences" you published today in relation to the question of adequate punishment. The general sense of the public is a feeling of insecurity; many of us are the first time in more than a twenty years life in Kenya, keep our eyes and ears open for anything unusual. This is no vague nervousness to be easily warded off by an outburst of statistics. It is within the definite knowledge of many of us that crime against life and limb and against property have lately assumed most alarming proportions.

"Cognizable Offences" include such crimes as poisoning, murder, in the wrong place, delaying justice, returns beyond statutory date, driving without rear light, etc. It is almost impossible to ask who but the "Magistrate" is to be held responsible for this consciousness of the extent of their crime in a number of technical offences?

Let us hope that the Traffician Managers do not select this time with too narrow without protest many attempts to blow dust in the eyes. A good question now requiring to be asked is this—What percentage of time in the Courts and the day's work of the Kenya Police, is taken up with trivial technicalities to the detriment of their real work in life, which is the protection of the public? Yours etc.

## NATIVE ADMINISTRATION.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard," Sir.—There has been a plethora of lungeries and crime not only in and around the Capital but in the rest of the country during the past few months. Those reported in the Press are only a small part of the total. I have lately only fifty per cent of what really takes place as there are very many cases not reported in the Press or Public Opinion as I fear the only method we have of altering the present unsatisfactory state of affairs, which I cannot help but regard as a disgrace to the Administration.

The natives are the greatest asset the country has, but are becoming a liability through wrong methods of treatment. I have visited countries where there are many more millions of natives, than there are in Kenya, and from my own personal observations in those countries I must say the Natives are much more under control and better disciplined than the Kenya Natives. He naturally asks the reason of this, decreasing respect for authority. I do not think it is fair to seek. Officers in many cases, appointed to outside posts, are straight from home, possibly only a few months in the country and in some cases do not strive to become conversant of the Natives and their customs. I maintain a Colonial Administrator Service cannot be too quickly inaugurated. Fifteen or twenty years ago things were very different from what they are today. Administrative Officers—I could name many of them—travelled about through the reserves amongst the Natives not rubbing in motor cars but treating on foot, and they had spent most of their time in this way with a shot at an occasional

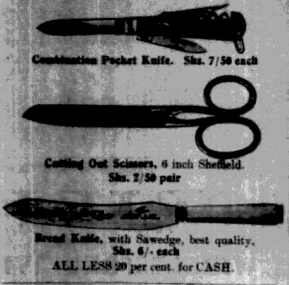

Stratton, said that on the whole the financial year had not been unsatisfactory considering the difficulties which confronted all concerns, whether public or private. In speaking of expenditure and income Mrs. Stratton pointed out that the year included dependents, building of garages and fences, and other irksome but the duties and expenses on catering. Money had also been put aside for passage for the staff. During the year income had dropped from Shs. 47,049 to Shs. 39,675, and expenditure had been reduced from Shs. 48,036 to Shs. 40,421.

The Committee were re-elected with the addition of Mrs. R. Adams and Mrs. H. Broadhurst (Officers for 1934) over President Mrs. H. M. Moore, Vice-President and Treasurer, Mrs. J. R. Sturges, Secretary, Miss Shaw, Committee, Madamira (Mrs. Jean Dawson, Galton Pratt, E. J. Clark, R. Adams, and H. Broadhurst).

The Very Rev. W. J. and could not be continued unless Government introduced new Bills. When the budgetary position was clearer later in the year, it was only temporary, and the position must then be fully re-considered as to which forms of taxation were the first to come off as an instance, it would be a favourable moment to consider whether the communal contribution to educate the children of a flat poll tax should be continued, or whether Government would undertake to keep education for European and Indian children up to the standard considered necessary out of the general revenue.

If this were done, it might entail revisiting some slight form of a graduated poll tax and the abolition of the flat poll tax for education. He was not counting himself to the advocacy of any such policy, but it was quite evident that the whole question of the financing of education must be gone into this year. From letters in the Press it must seem as if everyone were in favour of free primary education, added Lord Francis, who had submitted that it was not the case. He had been at many meetings, especially when the member for Mombasa, brought up the question of compulsory education for children, and he had found the vice strongly held that it was not only the privilege but the duty of parents to provide for their own children's education. They, however, resented being taxed to pay for other people's children as well. That was an undesirable attitude, and if there was to be compulsory education it was quite obvious that the parents would not be able to pay for it, so that if there was free primary education the present system of retention of fees there-to-day must be extended.

Lord Francis agreed with those who would see money into the question of education this year, and a particular question was one of the things that had surprised him. Another matter that had been

extending people's minds had been the recent increase in railway rates, especially the minimum rates. The question was on the agenda of the Railway Advisory Council meeting in Uganda this week, and he regretted that he had not received from a single person in the district facts and figures to assist him in taking the matter up.

A passing reference to the necessity for increasing European settlement and Lord Francis touched on the future of Kenya children, a problem he described as not easy of solution. It would save itself, of course, if the economic position of the country improved, and he hoped that not only would the Local Civil Service be established this year but that eventually all the overseas Service would be filled by people brought up in Kenya. His next point was the necessity for increasing the general wealth of the country in order to meet the need for closer co-operation between European and native producers, citing as an example the fact that the remunerations were now falling in native produce. The development of the goldmining industry should also be helped in every sound practical way possible. In the committee, Lord Francis expressed regret that the smaller syndicates applications for claims in the new areas recently liberally were not met more grant; personally he thought it a wrong policy not to have allowed them in there. The question of the Morris Carter Land Commission report had also been raised with the Secretary of State, who had promised to expedite it and hoped to bring it before the Cabinet before Easter. There was no question but that the absence of the report was definitely holding up increased settlement in Kenya.

An Accusation of Weakness.

In conclusion, Lord Francis Scott offered himself for reelection. He had never pretended to be a politician, he admitted, but when people said that he was just a pleasant gentleman who went to fight Government he took his bearings would not believe it, nor the intimation that he was a flat member by meeting Cabinet Ministers in England that he had been "robbed" by the new Cabinet Ministers when I was in the nursery, and it is many years since I had the definition that they were "supermen." (Laughter) The truth was that, though he always took a long view, he had a horror of over-statements, of threats or wild promises which one knew could never be brought to fruition, and in consequence he had himself open to the accusation of weakness because he would not give vent to wild statements for the sake of bound-

ing in the Press. He could not always read the mind of his hearer or leave him as he was, (Applause)

Railway Rate.

Questions were invited, and Mr. H. W. Penderwick always wanted to know why, if the Railway had a surplus of a quarter of a million pounds, it was necessary to raise the rates.

Mr. W. J. Dawson stated that rates on essential oils were raised in January. He interviewed the chairman of the rates committee and they were put back to the former end. Col. Cobille brought up the question of the reduction in the police strength at the Victoria area, and the meeting learnt from Lord Francis that the Commissioner of Police had played the game as far as economy went as probably better than any other head of department, though it was not his wish to reduce the Force, he felt economy was essential, and he recommended economies that he thought would be carried out with the least detriment to the Colony.

On behalf of the meeting.

Mr. B. H. Wright, the chairman, thanked Lord Francis for his speech. In the course of this the latter had said that as the aging member for Nait Valley during his absence no better person could have been chosen than Mr. Wright. He had made an admirable remark, and now that he was standing for another constituency this time he would wish him the best of luck and success. (Applause)

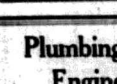

### A STORK TRAGEDY.

#### Shearing Electric Cables at Malaya.

[“STANDARD” CORRESPONDENT.]

Managua, February 15.—The stork is looked upon by many as being a sacred bird, but it is to be doubted if the engineers of the East African Power and Lighting Company venerate it to any marked degree.

For some time now a large flock of these birds have used the flat-topped Malaya for a feeding ground. If they would only keep on the ground they would probably be welcome. Unfortunately, and probably owing to the recent exceptionally high winds, they are constantly flying low in the electric cables to Nairobi, and with disastrous results, not only to themselves but to the temper and patience of the field staff of the Power Company.

#### The Common Roll.

The memorandum states that the Indians are not satisfied with the measure of representation at present granted to them on the Legislative Council of Kenya, and further that residential segregation is provided in some important areas in spite of its formal abandonment, and steps are being taken by the Government to meet the educational and medical needs of these communities, are entirely inadequate.

The experience of the last few years has shown that the present system of non-official representation on rural lands is unsatisfactory and tends to make necessary co-operation for the welfare of the Colony practically impossible.

#### Local Problems.

The members of Kenya Indian Millers (Native Reserves) Association, submitted the question of issues of Indian owned mill plots in native reserves under the Native Lands Trust Ordinance 1920. A memorandum on the subject was submitted to the District and Provincial Commissioners, Kisumu Division on October 6, 1923. The Association was formed for safeguarding the interests of the Indian millers owning flour mills worked by water power in native reserves. There are 23 mills in this Province and the capital cost in erecting the necessary structures and installing grinding stones amounts to £10,000. The first mill commenced work in 1918. It will be appreciated that the Indian community had done pioneer work in opening up the reserves and supplying the needs of the natives in this respect.

The plots on which such mills are working are on partly temporary leases, such leases are renewed yearly at the option of the Central Land Board set up under the Native Land Trust Ordinance of 1920. These leases can be cancelled at the end of the year, and the structures on the plots may be removed before three months are over, failing which they become the property of the Government.

The memorandum submits that the Indian Millers in the native reserves are entitled to a grant of 5,000 acres of land who made available for Indian settlement, the whole had been fully developed.

## Practical Hints Wavelength and Frequency.

A GOOD deal of confusion invariably seems to surround the question of the wavelength or frequency on which a given station may be transmitted. In reality, the relationship between the two is a very simple one. Assuming that the velocity of propagation of radio waves is five times as fast as 200 million metres per second and knowing that the length multiplied by frequency gives the velocity, it is easily seen that given the wavelength in metres the frequency in thousands of cycles per second (kilocycles) may be obtained by dividing the wavelength into 300,000, or given the frequency the wavelength can be got by dividing this into 300,000.

**Short Waves.**  
A knowledge of the relationship is particularly useful when dealing with short waves, as stations working below about 30 metres in terms of metres are 40 to be misleading. A select receiver will effectively separate stations that are apart which is about the minimum separation used in local transmissions but this separation involves only about one hundredth of a metre on the 10 metre band where as on about 1,000 metres a 10 metre separation involves something like 30 metres.  
Judging by reports there are few S.W. sets capable of receiving receiving G. 2s and the French Colonial stations when all three are transmitting in spite of the fact that in terms of frequency there are adequately separated. With increased signal strength, S.W. listeners will have to expect a certain amount of interference from other stations unless their receivers are reasonably selective.

The improvement has not been confined to any particular wave band but stations which have been weak for a long time come through at full strength, notably those in the 25 metre band. It is interesting to note that in this band there has been a very good signal indeed but it is apparently more very consistent and some kind of interference is often present. All three Empire Zone 5 transmitters have been exceedingly good at times but as often happens when signals are strong high speed fading was occasioned by present towards the end of the week which interfered somewhat with quality.

**The Radio Society.**  
In my last week's Notes, in a moment of forgetfulness I referred to its frequency between 500 and 1,000 kcs (500 and 300 metres) as a possible happy hunting ground for those engaged in the Radio Society's receiving contest. This was of course a mistake as the contest embraces wavelengths up to 101 metres. This limit may be of use to other listeners as when the static level is low the use of a set up to 101 metres in this contest will be a considerable advantage.

**The Moon.**  
There is some talk in Radio circles today about the influence of the moon on S.W. reception. It is a question which has been raised in the past but I have hitherto never associated the phases of the moon with wireless reception until the matter was brought to my notice. As far as it can be gathered, the general consensus of opinion gives the full moon period as the best for wireless reception.

**And Astronomy.**  
It seems that yet another scheme will be added to the

growing number which contribute to the advancement of wireless. Some time ago observations were made of a continuous radiation of unintelligible signals on a wavelength of about 15 metres. Further and more recent observations indicate that these signals originate from some definite point in space. Astronomers are to advise on the observations and if possible fix the extra-terrestrial point from which they emanate.

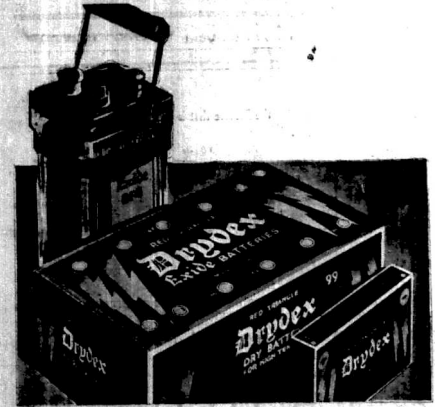

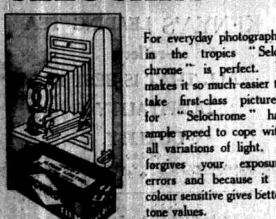

### RAILWAY FACILITIES—THE NAIROBI-KISUMU SECTION.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard." Sir,—In raising the subject of passenger accommodation on goods trains travelling the Nairobi-Kisumu section of the K.E.I., I am hoping that it will catch the eye of some one in authority who will be able either to help or persuade to be effected, a change that I am sure will be welcomed and appreciated by the public who have to use this portion of the line. Travelling recently from the Coast to Kisumu, we landed at Nairobi early in the morning when we were controlled by reason of circumstances to take a goods train to complete the journey. We had a small coach to be attached, since the journey was to be so long in point of time rather than distance but were refused on the grounds that it would not be possible to get the train to Kisumu in travelling in order for this favour to be granted more so for several weary hours we had to waddle down in the goods van coupled up like the rest of the train.

It is in the small amenities that life is made miserable and I feel sure that a sympathetic understanding of the public who could, at a small cost if any at all, greatly assist the unfortunate who use the railway to travel in other than regular passenger trains.

In saying that the Nairobi-Kisumu section is the poorest on the whole line as to train service is only stating an already known fact, but since a goods train goes either way every day, all that is required would be for a small coach to be attached and, this being a very small matter, I do not think that it would be an impediment to quite a number to use the railway to go to other towns of transport.

Guard's van travel is not value for money and to say it is equal to second class travel (and to charge second class fare for it) is not quite the truth.

If this statement is questioned, I would invite those on the railway who will have their own coaches to travel in to judge the goods train of the Nairobi-Kisumu train the next time they have to travel this section just to understand how it feels.

Come along Railway! Give this section a wee bit of consideration and do the right thing by also public that, when given a reasonable trial there is nothing to fear—rather there is much to gain in the goodwill of the public in which matters and of the public. Let the Railway not the other way round. Much has been done in the past few years to undertake travel on the K.E.I., a standing credit to those who have done it, and I have no doubt that a little honest, sympathetic consideration of the small matter that is in this letter will soon put it right. Let us have the slogan: "Every goods train has a passenger coach."

### ANGLING IN KENYA—THE MAREBE.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard." Sir,—In my letter of February 6, I only put forward a close family relationship between our British Isles and the Mahoor, an argument against its introduction. Might I say in this space to state another argument and that is the economic one.

The same applies to the Indian community, some of whom, great fishermen and good cooks, are in possession of the present fisheries and Lake, unaccountable fish would be turned into economic fish.

Mahoor was, I believe, being shipped out of India or in India and there is no doubt the expense of such an importation would be great, attended with a number of expenses, a fish which has had to be used in some form from Lake Malawi and there is no doubt of the fish such as the Bauri, Euphrates, Baraka, Nairobi river fish, etc., a good one all the way.

The main thing is the recent introduction of the Mahoor, which is a fish which is not native to this part of the world. The question of the introduction of the trout stream in the same body of water, as all the rivers in the world have natural protection in the form of their own species, neither fish could go without the human element.

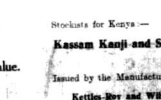

It is an old story... that there are a number of people who do not worry at all if their Squatters do one month in a year, and it is for that reason that a clause should be inserted, that no Squatters will be allowed on undeveloped farms if the place, which they must work is more than eight miles from the undeveloped farms.

As for getting medical attendance during serious illness, who has to carry the "bush" to the hospital, or the "Squatter"? It is a bit thick to expect the employer to pay a doctor to come out 20 or 30 miles to attend one of his Squatters. It would be more reasonable if the employer was allowed to knock it off the Squatter's wages, no Squatter or his family, but pay for medical attendance, if they know that their Squatters have a doctor in the bush. It would be much easier if the Squatters had to pay for their own medical attendance, if a doctor is called out. Except in the most serious cases, when a doctor is called out, it would be better if the employer should pay all the expenses.

**FRANCE TO SEND DELEGATES.**

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT]. London, Feb. 13. (By Air Mail.) The first forward step to repair Anglo-French Rugby relations since the breach in 1931 was made public this week.

On his return from a conference with delegates of the four British teams at Edinburgh, Mr. Cyril Kuthbert, the international secretary to the French Federation, was presented with a letter signed by Mr. H. The French Federation announced this evening that M. Danton, president of the Federation, has decided to accept this invitation and will send a delegation to meet the four British teams on the eve of the England-Scotland match at Twickenham.

This latest move towards the resumption of international matches between France and the four home nations, is greeted with enthusiasm in French sporting circles, though it is admitted that the result of the negotiations is not a foregone conclusion.
