## CONSTITUTION BILL ATTACKED

### Gas attacks criticised by powers

### Concern on loss of entrenched clauses

Strong opposition met the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) Bill in its Second Reading stage in the House of Representatives yesterday with a number of Members, including Mr. K. G. Ngala (Kitui) and the former Leader of the dissolved Opposition, referring to the possibility of entrenched clauses of the Constitution.

The debate on the Bill—which has been addressed to technical measures coming after a Bill which altered the Constitution in line with the Republican status of Kenya—was adjourned to be given today as consideration resumes in the House.

Mr. Ngala, describing the Bill as the most serious measure ever brought to the House by the Attorney General, said that he was very much concerned for what they had introduced in London. It did not make clear various aspects of the meaning of procedural provisions, nor was there provision for salaries or allowances of council members.

### Warning on forest powers

He warned against the power given to the Minister for Natural Resources merely by an order in the Kenya Gazette to designate forest areas on trust land as Central Government forests without consulting county councils.

Mr. Ngala complained of the use of terms such as 'provisional' and 'interim' before the House had approved the Bill. It must be made clear whether the House was dealing with a final Bill or a provisional one.

## BANKS OPEN AN HOUR A DAY Barclays strike may spread tomorrow

Banking services throughout Kenya are to be restricted to one hour a day—9 a.m. to 10 a.m.—from this morning because of a strike by the employees of Barclays D.C.O. over their provident fund.

The Distributive and Commercial Workers' Union, which represents bank staffs, has threatened to call out employees of all banks in sympathy tomorrow unless the dispute is settled by their employers.

In Nairobi, about 400 employees of Barclays branches came out on strike and maintained picket lines at bank branches throughout the day. Although the Ministry of Labour drew both sides into discussions no agreement was reached. At Mombasa, Kisumu and Kisumu the strike was also effective.

A supporting statement from the union's general secretary of the Railway African Union, Mr. Walter K. Otiyero, stated: "The R.A.U. is convinced that the time is overdue for a constructive general strike. I am requesting to convene a general secretary, Senator C. K. Laboso, under an emergency general council meeting before Saturday."

### £12,500 from Nigeria

## EARLY MAN IN E.A. HAD NEIGHBOURS

The Kenya anthropologist, Dr. Louis Leakey, said in Chicago he had discovered evidence of three different species of prehistoric man living at the same time and in the same place. He told a conference at the University of Chicago that he found the evidence at excavations in the Olduvai Gorge, in Tanganyika.

He said he had questioned the skull of a mainly cranium which he called a Pithecanthropus.

Dr. Leakey has previously announced his discovery in several excavations of two other man-like creatures which he called, respectively, "Zinjthropus" — the "Tribesman" — and "Homo Habilis".

He showed exact pictures of the Pithecanthropus and Zinjthropus which he said were constructed from more than 100 fragments. "George" was created by casting together fragments of the skull. Dr. Leakey said 200 specimens of the material had all three creatures lived at the same time about 1,000,000 years ago.

# Appeals to run 1965 Saabs in rally fail

Several general appeals to the F.I.A. — the international body which organizes motor sports — to allow the latest 1965 model Saabs to run in the East African Safari, failed, Saab's competitors maintain, in Nairobi yesterday.

The ban also applies to Ethiopian entry, Car No. 59 (Carl Forsmark and Bryan Coleman) and a Kenya private entry, Car No. 4 (Keith and Roy Mayer).

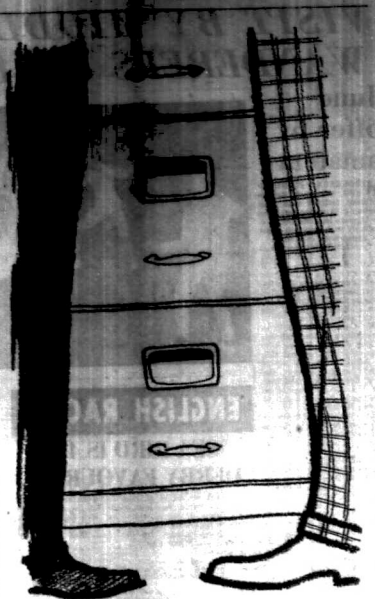

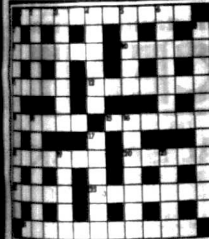
