Mr. Kenyatta said that these reports yesterday — that his Government had taken a last-minute decision by the office in charge of the convoy and the Ministry of Defence had reported on the seizure of the arms at Kaji, he said.

The President's statement read: "On Saturday, May 15, carried by 11 civilian lorries, a quantity of arms being possession numbers and one a Tannania name."

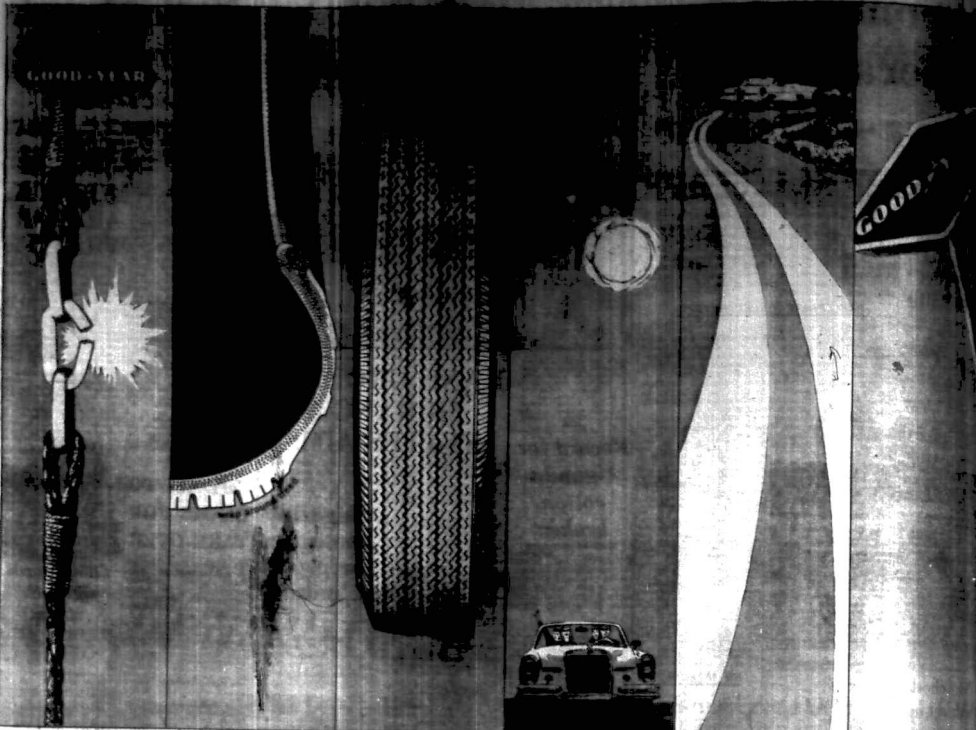

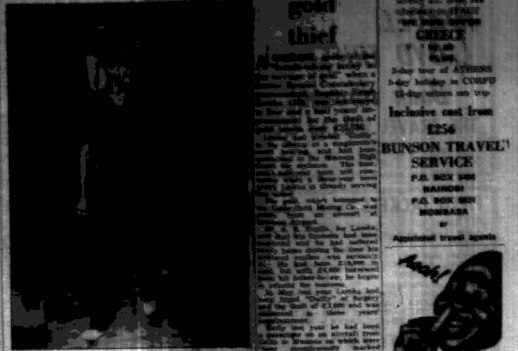

PEACE EAR IN DOMINICA Dock strike called over pay decision

REMARKS were reported to be making the most progress towards a resolution of the Dominican Republic civil war held their fire. An informed source said a political solution was imminent.

Under heavy international pressure, the forces of the "moderationist" Government refrained from resuming attacks on the rebel forces of Colonel Francisco Caamaño, now divided and hemmed in with their backs to the sea.

Significantly, General Antonio Imbert, the "moderationist" leader, refused to accept formal extension of the 24-hour humanitarian cease-fire that expired last night, on the grounds that his forces would not resume fighting unless provoked and on a long-term basis.

The rebel regime announced yesterday that it was sending the commander originally called to clear roads to grinding streets and help the hundreds of wounded. The 20,000 United States troops in the San Domingo area were under orders to keep the road forces apart.

French proposal adopted

The Imbert and Caamaño groups have been in close touch for the last two days with the international mediators of the United Nations and the O.A.S. (Organization of American States).

At the United Nations the Security Council on Saturday adopted a French proposal for the cessation of hostilities in Santo Domingo under permanent mediation.

The proposal, which was drafted by the French, called for a 24-hour humanitarian cease-fire, the withdrawal of all foreign troops, and the appointment of a permanent mediator.

The Security Council also adopted a resolution which expressed support for the French proposal, and called for the withdrawal of all foreign troops from Santo Domingo.

AIR RALLY SUCCESSES AT NAKURU

The race was sponsored by the Nakuru Air Club, and was the first of a series of races to be held at Nakuru.

N. VIETNAM HIT BY AIR FLEETS

MORE THAN 140 AMERICAN BOMBERS YESTERDAY BOMBED AND STRAFED NORTH VIETNAM, DESTROYING SEVERAL MILITARY INSTALLATIONS.

The attack, begun from within 100 miles of Hanoi, was the heaviest bombing raid against North Vietnam since the start of the war. It was carried out by the 7th Air Force, which is based at Udon Thani in Laos.

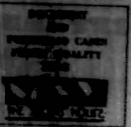

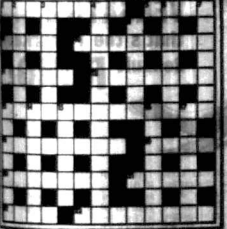
