AS Parliament resumes after yesterday's recess many Conservative M.P.s were concerned about the effect of the Government's fighting strength caused by the absence of Sir Anthony Eden, who is resting in Jamaica on orders from his doctor.

RACIAL RELATIONS HARMED

SOUTH AFRICA yesterday warned the United Nations "not prepared any longer to be even at the margin of the world's affairs in the Union's domestic affairs." Exports Minister Mr. Eric Louw said that interference was detrimental to the maintenance and promotion of harmonious racial relations in the Union.

Mr. Louw recalled the warning given by the U.S. in 1946, when South Africa proposed its first resolution against interference in the internal affairs of states. At that time it said that if such a resolution were adopted in the U.N. both imposition of economic sanctions and sending medical supplies would be violated.

Mr. Louw said: "These are the sentiments of the present Government of the Union."

Violent attacks

"The Union Government has had no violent attacks on its members' considerations in this field," he said. "The time had arrived for the U.N. to take a stand on its policies as a member of the community."

In a convention of African National Congress Charter, South Africa agreed to interfere in the internal affairs of other countries, which often has been done by successive Governments and which is now a well-known policy of South Africa's ruling party.

He referred to a statement of Mr. J. R. D. Tata, chairman of the Indian delegation, which was made in 1947, and which was not in accordance with the U.N. Charter.

Mr. Louw continued: "The Indian delegation, which is the only non-white people of our country, and categorically that they are not prepared to accept the words that they lived in conditions of slavery."



BRITAIN LISTS FIVE AIMS TO HEAL RIFT WITH U.S. Joint Middle East policy needed

£3,500,000 FOR FORCE

BRITAIN'S Foreign Secretary, Mr. Selwyn Lloyd, outlined in New York a five-point program aimed at "rebuilding the intimacy" of the Anglo-American Alliance by achieving a common Middle East policy.

Mr. Lloyd, in a speech before leaving the United States for Britain, admitted that there had been an "acute difference of opinion," and said it would be wrong to pretend there was not a job to be done in re-energizing the alliance to its former strength. "But I have no doubt about our ability to do it," he said.

He then detailed his five-point proposal for a common Middle East policy. The first three points were the prevention of further hostilities between Israel and the Arab States, and the restoration of a permanent peace in the region based on the principles adopted by the Security Council.

Opposition by Soviet bloc

The others provided for a settlement of the Arab-Israeli dispute, the establishment of a U.N. force in U.S. support for the pact next stop at its present membership of the economic committee, and the U.N. General Assembly yesterday voted £2,500,000 as an initial amount to support the cost of the proposed emergency force.

After a statement by Mr. Lloyd, the U.N. voted unanimously against the resolution.



S. Africa severs major links with United Nations

RACIAL ISSUE 'INTERFERENCE'

By JAMES COMMAGER

SOUTH AFRICA is back in the news headlines in the United States with its decision to make yesterday's "tokens" link with the United Nations a "matter of deep concern".

Mr. Louis, Minister of External Affairs, said yesterday that the South African government had withdrawn from the organisation because of "racism".

The New York Times devoted three-quarters of a page to the story, and the American press reaction in the African issue was similar to that in the United States. Britain, however, did not share the U.S. stance. When asked if he would support a resolution "expressing concern over the conduct of the United Nations", Mr. Churchill said: "I am not concerned."

The Times quoted Mr. Churchill as saying: "I am not concerned."

Equality of States

Mr. Louis told the Assembly that South Africa had been "admitted to the family of nations only when it had demonstrated its capacity to live up to the obligations of a member of the family".

He said that South Africa had been admitted to the United Nations in 1945, and deserved to be a member of the Assembly because of its record in the field of human rights.

The South African delegation, which consisted of members of State and provincial governments, was to be present at the opening of the Assembly.

Mr. Louis said that until there was an international situation he would remain with two members of his delegation so as to be available for consultation in the proceedings.

"It is a critical situation which should arise," he said.

Criticism of U.N.

TRADE LINK FOR UNION AND SWISS

A SPECIAL commercial service with Government has been formed to assist firms interested in economic negotiations between the two countries.

This was announced yesterday by the Secretary General of the Swiss-African Association, which held its first meeting yesterday.

Wide terms

In addition to the support given by the Swiss Government, the commercial service will be open to all Swiss and Swiss-African firms.

The association at present consists of an action committee and a committee of invitation to interested people.

Mr. F. G. Warner, chairman of the action committee, said: "We do not wish to restrict our activities to purely political and social relations without also giving attention to the strengthening of economic relations."

He said that a special committee had been formed to remain in closest contact with the Swiss Government on economic matters.

Concerning the general financial position of Switzerland, Mr. Warner said: "The financial situation of Switzerland is very strong, the foreign reserves are 114 per cent. above those registered at the end of 1957."

Nevertheless, the South African Minister of Finance said that the Swiss economy had suffered from the effects of the world-wide economic depression.

South Africa's Minister of Finance, Mr. J. C. H. de Villiers, said: "The majority of the people were not prepared to share the burden and suffering by the words of the prophet Jeremiah."

South Africa's Minister of Finance, Mr. J. C. H. de Villiers, added: "Switzerland is not stimulated in times of economic depression, but it is able to shoulder the country's responsibilities during cyclical swings."

The London Stock Market opened rather listlessly this morning, but though the previous weekend's rally was not followed up at least prices were fairly steady. The week's progress and the economic situation grew more uncertain as the week began.

On Friday evening the Times Industrial Ordinaries closed at 1,774, having risen 10 points since the previous Friday.

Trade link

Friday's rally was helped by American interest in British Petroleum shares. Other issues showing American interest were those of the oil companies.

Investment in British stocks was at the record level of 1,700 million pounds.

In the oil-linked market Wall Street closed at 1,774, an all-time low of £28.80.

Among industrial shares British Motor Holdings closed at 1,774 and Rover at 1,773.

Among oil shares British Petroleum closed at 1,774 and Shell at 1,773.




