Protest over cottonseed exports

RESTRICTION PLEA BY OIL MILLERS

Statement by Commodity Control Commission.

UGANDA'S oil millers

"ask the Government to prohibit the export of cottonseed from the Protectorate."

This well-attended at Juba oil mill meeting was the result of a statement of cottonseed export controls issued by experts."

"Exports of cottonseed were asked in a protest."

Local needs

Mr. Jirajira N. Metta, president of the Uganda Cottonseed Association, said that the industry was not enough entrenched to meet the demand for cottonseed in Uganda. The Government should accept that no such controls were needed if no such needs had been met.

Another speaker asked if the export ban was paid by the limit of production quota.

"Marketing Board has to pay the tax, this would prevent us from getting the oil millers to be able to offer such high prices," he said.

Bard's profit

Further, the oil millers had taken virtually no profit in recent years, and high prices were paid for the land.

Marketing Board's policy was "rippled" and it solely on export markets, which were declining.

A delegation of oil millers saw Mr. J. G. Bard, chairman of the Lint Marketing Board, told that the Government had decided that the Government would not be further compelled to impose controls on trade, and that the oil millers had been consulted on a free basis by auction.

Special courts under new Bill

THE British Government has published a Bill which aims to break the nation's drive for economic recovery. Called the Restrictive Practices Bill, its two main objects are to enforce collective agreements through collective action and to restrain individual firms from engaging in legitimate trade secrets.

To set up an official register of existing agreements open to public inspection, and to ban certain practices as being contrary to trade interest.

A PROSPEROUS business has been used to promote the growth of the textile industry.

The Textile Protection League Ltd. will set up special courts to examine and penalise any firm found to be contrary to public interest.

Court members

It is proposed that the court should consist of "representatives of the public and not members of the profession" appointed from persons with "experience in industry, commerce or public affairs."

An official register of agreements will be kept and will be available before the court takes any action.

Restrictive practices

The Bill applies to recommendations by trade associations to their members, as also agreements and practices by people who comply with them.

Restrictions applying even to exports are not to be imposed unless imports do not receive similar treatment.

Imports of raw materials and components will not be restricted.

Proceedings, however, against an infringement against an individual or a company, or against the offender or take place before the court has been constituted.

Restrictive practices will be prohibited.





Air Patrol Watches Over Nairobi's Life-line



FOR the first time in East Africa a regular monthly air patrol is being maintained over Nairobi and the Tana and Wangti power stations which are the capital's main sources of electric supply.

One morning last week an aircraft sets out from Nairobi to follow the overhead power lines from Tana, near Fort Hall, down to Nairobi. The crew are Mr. H. H. Slaters, the pilot, Mr. D. Duffin, his assistant, and Mr. E. J. D. Duffin, both of the East African Electricity Lighting Co. Ltd., whose job it is to check the lines for any faults in the lines.

The aircraft's pilot is Captain H. H. Slaters of Cawing Brothers and Vassall Ltd., who has the hazardous task of flying over the lines as far as he can within safety limits. Because the aircraft flies so low above the ground he is bound to be specially prepared from the Director of Civil Aviation to carry out this task.

Pilot injured

Only yesterday the pilot of the aircraft was slightly injured when the plane he was operating spotted one of the many birds that frequent the power lines. According to Mr. Duffin, the bird had been shot and was hanging from an electrical wire. The pilot had to land the aircraft and get the bird off the ground.

As usual, however, the damage was minor.

On the ground

Mr. Slaters, sitting in front of his office at Nairobi South Power Station while Mr. Duffin, his assistant, and Mr. Duffin examined the plane after the fall. The plane then took off again and flew back across the power line, only 30 feet away from the ground.

Similar incidents have been reported in the past year, but it is believed that the bird had been placed in a nest.

She Helps To Combat The Virus Problems Of Africa

BEING one of two women to receive the 106 most coveted places is a distinction, but apart from the personal satisfaction, it is probably during one of the most interesting jobs of her life in East Africa today.

Working as an assistant in the East African Virus Research Institute in Nairobi, Mrs. Sheila Cole, a Research Fellow from 1948 and studied at the Slade School of Art, Painting and Sculpture as a scholarship student during the summer of 1950.

He received the Fullbright Fellowship and the Rhodes-Mitchee-Rose Fellowship 1953-54. For three years he won first prize in sculpture at Columbia University.





ACTION BY KENYA TO SAVE WILD LIFE

Committee on policy appointed

STRENGTHENING OF LAW UNDER CONSIDERATION

STRENGTHENING of Kenya's game laws and the preservation of the animals in the Amboseli National Reserve are among the main recommendations of a new Game Policy Committee set up by the Governor, on the advice of Council of Ministers.

An official announcement yesterday stated that the committee will also consider a long-term game preservation scheme and the protection of the colony's wild life arising from the great increase in the animal and economic development in Kenya has resulted in the 1959 Game Policy Committee.

The committee was asked to carry on the work under Board of Trustees' direction. The committee was unable to complete a uniform game policy for the country as it gave effect to it was never fully considered or prepared.

The announcement said that, keeping in mind that the departmental policy should be to preserve Kenya's wild life in its natural state, the new committee, to be known as the Game Policy Committee, has the following terms of reference:-

"To recommend to the Government the policy to be adopted by the Government for the preservation of game and the interests of human population in the interest of the economic development of the country."

In the interests of a solution of the conflict in the relationship between human and game, the committee will be asked to consider the value of this area and to make interim recommendations for the public interest, having due regard to

European police services and three African countries involved in the protection of a game reserve and the search for a solution of a raiding and shooting of game animals from Serengeti.

It was also asked by the Board to consider the action after the raid. Consideration will be given to the




The Librarian has much more limited canvas and the story is not very interesting. The title is the story of a young man's shore leave.

The planning behind the move to Pinelands

In 1939, on the eve of World War II, the people of Cape Town and visitors to the "mother city" gazed in admiration at South Africa's tallest building—the new Head Office of the South African Mutual Life Assurance Society. This gracious skyscraper, soaring majestically 267 feet above ground level, seemed to promise the Old Mutual a permanent home for generations to come.

Growth:
Yet within ten years, the need for more office space than the building offered became an urgent necessity as the Society started to meet the labor post-war growth and development. After the uncertainties and horrors of war, people throughout the country turned to the Old Mutual to help them plan security and stability for themselves and their families. This national expression of confidence in the country's own life assurance society, greatly accentuated the demand for more head office personnel to cater for the ever-increasing business. Extra staff meant more accommodation and by 1948, the spaces available was already filled to overflowing.

• Planning for the Future

If 15 floors, totalling 34 million cubic feet of office space was not enough, how big should the Society plan for the future? If ever the time arose for bold vision and planning, this was it. Faced by problems never before encountered

In Central Cape Town, this block would extend down Adderley Street from Longmarket Street to the main entrance of the Railway Station; or in Johannesburg along Commissioner Street from the corner of Ellof Street to Loveday Street. The floor area of the three stories totals over 10 acres and if the building were placed on a 100 ft. x 150 ft. stand in the city centre, it would rise to a height of about forty stories.

Expert Opinions: After a careful study of the problems to be solved and backed by the experience gained from overseas, the experts recommend:



"This time we must plan for 100 people," he says. "We must move out to the suburbs; land in the central city is too expensive, and valuable for the accommodation we will need." "We must plan for our buildings to radiate outwards, not upwards, travelled by lift from one end to another causes congestion and lifts are expensive. The form of life insurance company is the record office; the form of the centre of the building ... To avoid the tremendous waste of time and labour caused by carrying documents from one office to another, all correspondence, etc., must be 'brought' to any office by telephone or air pipe ... "To attract and keep an efficient home office working happily in the suburbs, we must offer their sporting and other recreational facilities."

A New Landmark: These are just some of the hundreds of ideas, plans and schemes that were carefully sifted, analyzed and appraised before the first brick was laid. 


