MAU LEADERS RECALCANT ON SURRENDERS

Breakdown of talks after 'reversal'

MINISTER'S DISCLOSURE IN LEGISLATURE

MINISTER change took place in the attitude of the Mau Mau leaders towards the Government's offer of a general amnesty, which they had previously accepted. This was disclosed by the Minister for Home Affairs, Mr. J. M. Nyoro, in a statement made in the House last night.

Mr. Nyoro said that the Mau Mau leaders had broken their word and had refused to accept the terms of the amnesty. He said that the Government was now faced with a difficult situation and that it was necessary to take a firm stand.

Mr. Nyoro also said that the Mau Mau leaders had been given a clear warning that if they did not accept the terms of the amnesty, they would be treated as enemies of the State. He said that the Government was now prepared to take any necessary steps to maintain law and order in the country.

The contacts made and developed through the Mau Mau leaders from widely different areas were heretofore secret. It was only after the Government's offer of a general amnesty that they were disclosed. ULTIMATUM BY WAR COUNCIL

It was announced that the War Council had issued an ultimatum to the Mau Mau leaders. The ultimatum demanded that the Mau Mau leaders should accept the terms of the amnesty by a certain date. If they failed to do so, the War Council would take necessary steps to deal with the situation.

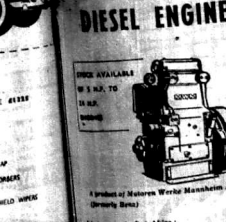

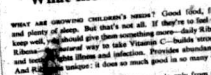

LEADERS of the 70,000 locomotive men who are striking in Britain in support of a wage demand stated that they were prepared to hold out for three months for a settlement of their claim.

Road traffic was extremely heavy, particularly between London and outside resorts. British European Airways operated extra services between London, Glasgow, Edinburgh and Manchester for holiday crowds stranded by the rail standstill.

A STATE of emergency to combat the railway strike was declared in Britain yesterday. Members of the Privy Council flew to Balmoral for a meeting over which the Queen presided. The proclamation will be issued until the state of emergency will take effect today.

The new Parliament will be opened by the Queen on June 9 instead of June 14 as previously arranged. This because Parliament must approve a state of emergency within a certain period.

With the end of the Whitsun holiday, factories resumed work but the prospect is bleak for the weekend, many will have to lay off their employees because of shortage of raw materials. Thousands of workers already have to use alternative means of transport because of the railway strike. The road network is congested with cars and trucks. Under the Royal proclamation giving the emergency powers, the Government will be able to commandeer road transport to heavy essential supplies moving. Stocks of materials can be taken over and Service men and vehicles used to carry workers.

The Ministers who flew to Balmoral where the Queen is in holiday were led by the Marquess of Salisbury, Lord President of the Council, The Prime Minister, Sir Anthony Eden and the Minister of Labour, Sir Walter Monckton. Monckton takes part in any settlement of the strike.

GOVERNMENT TO ASSUME MORE POWER IF NEEDED

Additional powers assumed by the Government under the state of emergency include the right to requisition any vessels, vehicles or aircraft required for the distribution of petrol, oil, fuel, food and essential supplies, restrict postal services and to ration gas and electricity. The police may arrest without warrant anyone suspected of committing an offence against the new regulations.

A Government announcement commencing on the new powers said: "They represent the minimum required to enable the Government to perform its duty of securing the essentials of life to the country. The Government hopes that it will not be necessary to take any additional powers, but it will not hesitate to take them if the situation demands it."

The state of emergency does not involve the calling-in of troops. The Armed Forces will not be concerned beyond providing 200 Army lorries for the use of securing the essentials of life to the country. 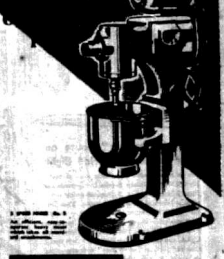
