HISTORY ELEPHANT BRUILES IN UGANDA Brains Tusker Sets House on Fire CONTROL POLICY SUCCESS

Five hundred forest elephants were destroyed in Uganda last year during control operations in the previous year, states the annual report of the Uganda Game Department.

As usual, the report contains many interesting records of adventures of game scouts and Natives. One of the most surprising was that of an elephant, which after having laid a burning log through at it by a Native whose shikaris it was mauling, picked up the log and placed it on the owner's hut, which was burned to the ground.

Elephants generally are as abundant as ever, states the report. The influence of effective control on localities is reflected in the very marked decrease in total wastage, five hundred forest elephants being destroyed during the year. The estimated total wastage was 1,200. It is hoped that the Government will reach its control activities when it will be unnecessary again to increase the rate of killing. There is increasing interest in the subject in most districts. At the same time, as not only the game reserves but also the extensive closed season reserves in which the birds are rapidly increasing, are being protected, the situation there is also rapidly changing.
