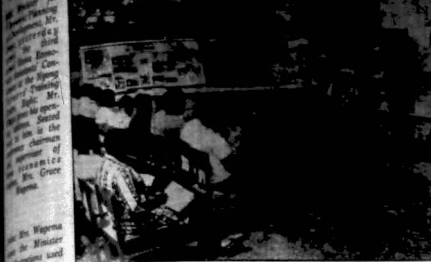

Shift for school-leavers seeking top jobs

Many who drifted from place to place in the private sector were normally received shift from Kenya's Ministry of Education, which was yesterday.

ASPIRATIONS SET HIGH

It was the nature of the situation today that young aspirational school-leavers tended to have set their aspirations very high. When they went into jobs they expected to do, they found the employers were willing to pay and, as had been said recently, they wanted to become mediocre men and women.

This was where the personnel manager became of vital importance in helping the aspirational school-leaver to come to terms with the realities of the world in which they found themselves.

In the case of Africa today, a university education, preferably in the sciences, was more likely to be a waste of money than it was in the past. Kenya alone had over 100,000 students in its tertiary institutions and the Government was unable to finance them all. It was therefore necessary to encourage students to take up vocational courses and to accept a measure of responsibility for their own future.

Algiers case today

THE former Congo Premier, Mr. Moise Tshombe, will be executed as soon as he is returned to the Congo from Algiers, the Congolese News Agency reported yesterday. Expressing certainty that the Algerian Supreme Court will decide to extradite Mr. Tshombe, the agency said the death sentence would be carried out "within the forthcoming hours."

Mr. Tshombe is due to appear in court this morning to answer questions from the president of the court on the Congolese Government request for his extradition. He will be represented by two French lawyers, M. Rene Floriot, and a leading Algerian barrister.

Calling Mr. Tshombe a "faithful servant of imperialism and neo-colonialism," the Congolese News Agency said: "It is well known that the Congolese people will carry out the sentence against Tshombe within the forthcoming hours."

M. Floriot told reporters in Algiers that he was not optimistic or pessimistic about the outcome of the case. He and the Algerian barrister spent the day studying the Congolese arguments for extradition.

Extradition question

The Algerian court has to decide whether the death sentences passed on Mr. Tshombe in his absence last March were for political or criminal offences.

Only criminal offences are held normally to justify extradition. If the court decides against sending Mr. Tshombe back to the Congo, the Congolese Government of State II will decide in favour of the Congolese.

A Congolese resident in Algiers said the Congolese Government could sign an extradition decree or not.

Mr. Tshombe's extradition would be a political act, he said, and would be regarded with suspicion by the Congolese people. He said he was sure the Congolese Government would not do this.

Mr. Tshombe was arrested in Kinshasa in 1965 and taken to Algiers. He was held in the Hotel de Ville. He was released in 1966 but was arrested again in 1967.

TSHOMBE WAITS FOR FATEFUL JUDGMENT

Closed doors hearing

ALGERIAN Supreme Court judges were expected to announce their decision on the Congo plea for the extradition of former Congo Premier, Mr. Moise Tshombe, late last night, after a hearing which lasted several hours behind closed doors.

Little more than five minutes after the hearing began, the court president ordered the Press and public, including Mr. Tshombe's French lawyer, M. Floriot, the Congo Attorney-General, Mr. Kabera, and the plain-clothes policemen, to leave the court. He gave the reason as "the reigning atmosphere of hate and vengeance."

Before the court went into closed session spectators who had gained admittance were searched twice by courtroom guards armed with rifles. Security police dismantled the film machine gun. A B.B.C. television team earlier granted permission to film.

Mr. Tshombe's Algerian lawyer, Mr. Abdelhak, said after the hearing that he was not sure of the court's decision "with confidence." His client had given the court all the explanation necessary about the situation in the Congo and his own acts.

'Possibly his last chance'

The first batch of nearly 1,000 foreigners, mostly British and American, trapped by the Nigerian civil war, boarded an evacuation ship yesterday at Port Harcourt in breakaway Biafra.

Among the evacuees, including about 400 British, 100 American, and 300 Nigerian, are expected to reach Lagos today aboard the British tanker passenger liner *Imperial*, which is being chartered by the British.

Mr. TSHOMBE'S FATE

THE DECISION TO HEAR the Congo report for Mr. Tshombe's criticism is in essence as the Algerian Supreme Court was not suspended.

Mr. Tshombe's criticism of the French advance, Mr. Plé, was independent over the secrecy raising, as many others will be inclined to think, a public hearing was not meant to be held. On the other hand, the Africanist movement generally, and the Congo in particular, is a movement which is not without legal representation, having the services of a distinguished lawyer.

So intense are the emotions stirred by the very mention of Mr. Tshombe's name that it is difficult for any African nationalist to remain completely unemotional. The cold logic situation, however, is that the Supreme Court was asked to decide whether or not to suspend a death by a military court in Kinshasa for criminal or political offences. It faced three alternatives: (1) the possibility for the measure of North Kensington; (2) under I.A. protection; and (3) recruitment of foreign forces to maintain order.

If the offences were political — the thesis on which Mr. Tshombe's case was based — he could not be legally extradited. If criminal, he can be, but a final decision rests with the Algerian Prime Minister, Col. Boumedienne, who need not sign the extradition decree if he so chooses.

The absence of extradition agreements between Algeria and the Congo (Kinshasa) does not prevent extradition being carried out. A precedent was set some time ago when two Germans were extradited, though no such agreement existed with their home country.

New story of hi-jacked plane

Sending Mr. Tshombe back in the Congo means certain death for the Congolese. News Agency has announced he will be executed as soon as he is returned "without comment". In addition to the previous report, it is now assumed by being implicated in the rebellion for the purpose of his flight.

Mr. Tshombe has left the State of Emergency in the Congo. He has been received by the Government forces. Apparently, the mercenaries have fled to Point à Pitre, France, where the Emergency continues. Mr. Tshombe is in Government hands. The rising is being put down and the Government may not need the active intervention on this occasion, of the few hundred units from member countries of the O.A.S. for which he has called.

The fighting has been a tragic reminder that keeping mercenaries in any African Congo brings with danger and the O.A.S. joint force may still have much to do before the Congo is cleared of disquieting foreign agents.

The rebellion appears to have been kept in check by Mr. Tshombe's reported flight. Very mysteriously has veiled the whole affair from the time he last landed in Africa until he departed plane landed at a military airport near Algiers.

Reports, described from the first as "fantastic", made out that his plane was hi-jacked in mid-air by a gunman who suddenly appeared on the cabin. It is now known that the plane was hijacked by Mr. Tshombe's main private party.

It is pointed out here have the two British pilots and three Belgian passengers, who are still detained, were not allowed to ask questions or out what really happened. This incident, although it is still in the news, is a situation that the plane was never hijacked in that manner at all but that Algerian pilots were hijacked by the plane and the two Algerian MGs were sent up to face the plane and to land at Bechar, where the truth, taking the Tshombe into custody, has been handed over to the Government and its Government, with the Congo demanding extradition and diplomatic representatives of other countries exerting pressure to have him extradited to commit acts of murder against civilians.

Government gives outline of policy on Kenyanisation

Government is determined to ensure that Kenyans are given maximum responsibility and authority, including the opportunity for private enterprise and private sector of the economy. This is set out in a booklet outlining policy on Kenyanisation in the private sector, which was published yesterday. The Government said that the booklet will not do and will not be tolerated.

The booklet, prepared by the Ministry of Labour and Transport and the Ministry of Industries, is being used for pursuing Kenyanisation for its own sake. A truly Kenya national property cannot be built if management of industrial and commercial concerns remains in the hands of non-Kenyans.

It added that the Government had sought the co-operation of private enterprise in achieving more rapid rates of Kenyanisation, and expected that management would immediately establish training programmes designed to develop the skills of Kenya citizens to the point where they would be able to participate actively in managerial and other administrative functions.

NEED FOR EXPATRIATES

The Government appreciated that where Kenyans with the necessary managerial, marketing and technical skills were unavailable there was a need to supply personnel from abroad provided this is supported by a training programme.

TIME FOR MEDIATION

FOR MORE THAN 20 WEEKS now people who a few years ago were jointly celebrating their freedom from colonial rule have been locked in bitter, unproductive combat. The Joint Federation of Nigeria, which, propped up by the British, has been the mainstay of the Eastern Region, is torn by civil war over the secession of the State Rivers.

There is no early sign of an end to the fighting launched by the Federal invasion of breakaway Biafra. Although the secessionist government has received a major success by their capture of the university town of Ibadana, there appears to be some doubts whether their forces are full control of the area. To overthrow the rebel Government of Biafra, the Federal Government will have to launch a major battle through jungle terrain populated by hostile and fanatical tribesmen.

The numbers of troops involved on both sides is comparatively small, with little of the modern transport and air cover of modern warfare. This need not be such a complete bar to an approach to the belligerents by the Organisation for African Unity, however, since there are special circumstances affecting the status of the Federal Government which remain basically a neutralism by a center-coop which retained political role — created by the government in 1963, but weakened further the previous links which sustained the secessionist Federal Premier, Sir Abubakar Tafawa Balewa, had driven to secession.

Whether the Federation, in its old form, can be fully revived is doubtful, but if the fighting can be ended and the sides allowed to negotiate, a further, positive action should still be possible to restore some level of amicable relations which will ultimately be to the advantage of all regions of Nigeria. UPRISING Uganda woman told a Nairobi court yesterday that she had given a dead girl's handbag as a gift, only hours after the girl is alleged to have been murdered.

Eusee Nalmsami Serwanta alleged that the bag was given to her by one of five men charged with murdering two Uganda girls — one of them a policewoman — in April.

Ms Serwanta was giving evidence at the preliminary inquiry into the murders of Lilian Mills and Sarah Mwanza, whose bodies were found in sacks floating in the Athi River on April 9.

She said that on April 3 — the day the girls are alleged to have been murdered — she had been looking for work for the second, Kevonia Mwanza, who had some money she had borrowed. She was unable to find him either at his place of work or at his home in Ndashighi, and had returned to the Kirk Road hostel where she lived.

'ACUSED LOOKED DRUNK'

"I was just about to go to bed when there was a knock at the door. When I opened it I found all five accused there," she said. "They asked me to go out for a drink. They all looked drunk and I told them I was too tired."

They told me they had something to tell me but I refused to go out. Then they decided to leave. They had just come a few seconds when I saw them again. They came back with a handbag wrapped in paper. He gave the paper to me and said: 'Eusee, this is a present for you.'

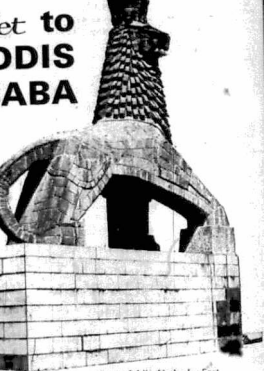
