## Tension after threat to ambassadors

**THE Belgian Embassy in Kinshasa was yesterday sacked by rioters who broke windows and burned all the furniture in the street, sources close to the Belgian Foreign Ministry said in Brussels yesterday. Embassy personnel had previously been evacuated.**

The report said the Congolese police did nothing to stop the demonstrators, but President Mobutu had promised to prevent similar demonstrations in the future.

The Belgian Foreign Ministry had also learned that a loudspeaker van belonging to the newly formed People's Revolutionary Movement had toured the streets of Kinshasa announcing that the British, French and Belgian Ambassadors to the Congo would be arrested.

### Flights cancelled

The threat to arrest the three Ambassadors had not been carried out but had resulted in a tense atmosphere in the Congo capital. The Belgian Foreign Ministry also announced that it no longer had any direct contacts with the Belgian Ambassadors in Kinshasa.

A spokesman for the Belgian embassy, Sabena, said yesterday that flights in and from Kinshasa had been suspended until further notice. The airline had been requested that it should in the airport and should also be requested the signature of a Boeing jet to be leave Kinshasa for the Congo capital.

## BLA FRANS Brig. Banjo grabs power in Mid-West

**THE** Biafran Army leader, Brig. Victor Banjo, yesterday took over the Government of Nigeria's mid-Western State after saying that the Federal Military Government could not claim to represent the people of Nigeria.

Brig. Banjo said in a 25-minute broadcast from the mid-West capital of Benin that he had assumed all legislative and executive powers in the State. The 31-year-old former minister in the Federal Nigerian Army led last week's attack on the mid-West.

He condemned the Federal Government of Maj-Gen. Gowon, whose forces have been trying to put down the Biafran secession, as a Government sustained by violence and backed by an "army of the feudal North".

### Yoruba Westerner

Brig. Banjo, a Yoruba Westerner, said: "As soon as is practicable, I propose to hand over the administration of mid-Western Nigeria in order to proceed to the war front and complete the liberation of Nigeria."

He said he had urged Eastern military leaders against secession and "I still do not think that we have the right to destroy a nation that was handed over to us as a moment of grace."

But Brig. Banjo had the right to overthrow a Government that has been "ruled by the sword" because of "brutality, savage oppression and the denial of the rights of the people."

## PURGE IN CANTON EXPECTED

**TRAVELLERS** from the Canton area yesterday said that rumours there said a Communist purge was expected to be carried out in the area.



# Millic liquor 'root of crime' say city police

### Attempts to smash unity

He said that in the long run South Africa and Rhodesia could not succeed. "It may take years or even decades, but time is on the side of Africans if we use it properly; that is, if we remain united," he added.

Zambians must particularly guard against attempts to smash the unity of S.N.P.E. The methods of their opponents would be insidious, underhand and clever. The main attempt would be to create tribal squabbles.

"I was surely delighted to be in the city of Harare when the Zambians were in Zambia, Zambians had the most advanced future in their grasp. The only way to ensure the bigger danger was to bring down the Zambians from within."

## TWO VIEWS OF CHINA

**NUROBY REALLY KNOWS what is going on in China, and it is not surprising that attitudes towards this troubled giant were startlingly. Maensu's President De Bevo, refused to receive the Peking regime and recently visited Taiwan, which still holds China's UN seat at the UN.**

Judging by the enthusiastic comments he made about it when he passed through Nairobi yesterday, the Minister has no regrets over his choice, or over the Communist Chinese seat at the UN for \$15,000,000, which he claims was offered to him by a Peking envoy while he was visiting the Peking regime and the fact that the Peking regime's attempts to Communise Africa have failed, and lays claim — not without justification — to some of the credit for this.

President Kuunda of neighbouring Zambia, holds a very different view of the two Chinas. While scathingly dismissing suggestions that a three-day visit to Peking could make him a Communist, since he has paid many visits to the West, he says that he has no regrets, and has his undivided praise for the Communist regime there. He told his Congress that he had been impressed to find that in 20 years China had recovered "from poverty and stagnation to a position where it is now providing adequately clothed, fed and sheltered in preparation for hard work."

Zambia's non-alignment is interpreted in similar terms to that of Tanzania, with which it is becoming increasingly linked; it reflects disillusion with Western countries suspected of neo-colonialism and intricacy over the Rhodesia crisis, and corresponding willingness to seek aid from the East. Dr. Kuunda says, quite rightly, that he would gladly accept \$100,000,000 from Peking to finance the railway he has been so long and so highly unlikely to be offered such aid in non-aligned countries, or in any other comparable form.

Dr. Kuunda's picture of life in China — he was a field guest in the comparative class of Peking — is not borne out by news agency reports that violent conflicts are going on in most provinces. A few weeks ago up to 40,000 Chinese were being driven out of their homes by a military commander in the strategic city of Wuhan. It is well claimed that the Prime Minister, Chou En-lai, who once visited Africa was ripe for revolution narrowly escaped being kidnapped.

## Seeking revolution in Africa

Two television journalists who recently toured China's main cities discovered that the Cultural Revolution had brought chaos all over China, with many villages empty and even such things as floor cleaning, astronomy, and schools run by revolutionary rebels. Their experience of the Red Guards was that the latter youth were "substantially angry by comparison." Production stoppages have led to food shortages and other hardships for the people.

But though China's leadership is bitterly divided and has more than enough to handle at home, it appears unlikely to mount disturbances abroad as Kenya's Vice-President recently declared.

A new anonymous pamphlet is circulating in Nairobi questioning the formation of a League of East African Friends of China's whose aim is "to initiate a revolutionary change in our countries, under the guidance of Mao Tse-tung's brilliant thought and to stage an African Cultural Revolution." This pamphlet is said to be the work of a crack or a warped practical joker.

If they have a more serious aim, it is well worth noting that the League has now been expanded to take in not only the Kenya Friends of China but the Revolutionary Committee of East Africa, the Youth League, the "Movement for Cultural Revolution in Nigeria," the "Revolutionary Committee of Uganda," and the "Zambia Association of National Congresses."

These Gambanian bodies, if they exist, are presumably clandestine. They call for support of "Chairman Mao's Great Revolution" which will be without parallel in history and will "bring forth new leaders." This should not engage the attention of those present leaders who are being wooed up by Peking.



And now a whole new era is opening up. 70 per cent of its area has an annual rainfall of less than 20 inches—its variety of climate from the tropics of Queensland and the Northern Territory to the cool-temperate climate of the southernmost island State, Tasmania, means there is little that will not grow somewhere in the continent. Success has at last met the long search for oil. After 73 years of effort and disappointment there are good indications of substantial oil reserves in several areas from Western Australia to the waters south of Victoria and in inland Queensland. Natural gas has been found in quantities sufficient in quantities in two large cities—Melbourne and Sydney—with a new source of energy for industry, heating and cooking for anything up to 100 years, and the Adelaide and Brisbane of the coastal fringes. ### Jump in exports

High grazing land in the south eastern corner of the continent, stretching north along the coastal fringe, produces some of the world's finest butter and cheese, exported throughout the world. The butter is packed in cans for tropical countries and the milk is concentrated and canned, frozen or powdered for shipment overseas. Manufactured export rose by nearly 30 per cent in 1946/47 over the previous year to a record £128,000,000 and made up 13 per cent of the total export receipts.

Major items were iron and steel, chemicals, petroleum products, vehicles and parts, and machines and machinery.

In 1946/47 manufactured exports accounted for only five per cent of total exports. Australia now sells slightly more than a quarter of its manufactures to East African and Asian countries and a further 30 per cent to countries in the South Pacific region, chiefly New Zealand.

Australian manufacturing industries regarded as most likely to develop export potential are: automobiles, auto parts and service equipment; tele-communication equipment; petroleum products, petrochemicals and a wide range of manufactures, particularly of metal.


A recent survey by the Australian Department of Trade and Industry of expansion work begun, completed or planned by major Australian companies points to substantial growth in the industrial sector. Companies producing iron and steel, metal shapes and treating scrap reported projects worth more than £10,000,000 in the near-

ferrous group. 22 companies listed projects with a total value of £11,000,000; heavy engineering groups had provision for similar development.

### BLACK APARTHEID IN U.S.

WHILE RACIAL RIGHTS continue to dominate America's social scene abroad, the verbal excesses of some of the Negro leaders are reaching alarming proportions. One of the leading agitators, who has been invited to visit here are made fully aware.

One of the leading provocateurs of "Black Power" is a kind of apartheid in reverse — is Mr. Stokely Carmichael, in a recent issue of *Black Panther*, he has called on American Negroes to take up arms for "total revolution". This is the typical rhetoric of the "imperialist, capitalist and racist structure of the United States".

Mr. Carmichael has hardly been permitted to be allowed to continue to preach this sort of creed if and when he returns to the U.S., although he has had a few more. Mr. "Rap" Brown, however, has not been allowed for more freedom than they would expect of most other agitators. Both have talked of the killing of "bumkins" (Whites) and Mr. Brown has had the President's name "trashed". But though he bears charges of incitement, Mr. Brown is allowed free rein to make more violent attacks.

An illustration of features of the improved Negro attitude is the strong evidence of emotional feelings for Africa through the military Negroes. A report yesterday disclosed that an official of the Congress of Racial Equality has been in the United States, possibly to print textbooks to teach young American Negroes Swahili. This is the same Swahili which is being used as a major language. But it would be a pity if nostalgia were to lead American Negroes into a futile campaign for "return to Africa" such as that of the Rinzarans of the West Indies.

In La Havana agency Mr. Carmichael trusted on the same theme, saying: "We were kidnapped and robbed from Africa and therefore we cannot be part of the United States which violates the African continent."

The appeal to Negroes to look backwards to their forefathers' long-lost homeland is an obvious one, but it is unlikely to have the result of emotional fervor and an approach reality. There are more than 200,000,000 Negroes in the U.S. (some put the figure at nearer 300,000,000 Negroes) and a lapse of a dozen generations most are considerably moved origin and, whatever they themselves think, are not Africans.

### Integration still the crux

The danger is that the unending appeal to a distant era of honor and misery will recall racial hatred and turn more people to the fight to implement the Negro homeland within the U.S., which is clearly unappreciated.

The Negro people are in a minority in America and are likely to remain so for a long time, though not to reach an extent as now. They should take account of this reality and concentrate on the fight to implement the full equality they are accorded by law, but are so often deprived of by prejudice and unjust State laws. Integration, not separation, must be the goal.

Many more reasonable Negro leaders recognize this and the struggle for equality long before any of the present posturers of violence were heard of. To be labelled as "moderate" at times of hysteria is a political death knell in a public figure, unfortunately, and Dr. King has been pushed into the background.

Another major cause of the present hysteria is a man, Roy's son, as the second donor. He and the other advocates of violence are an epitome for Negro cities of Miami, Brown and Carmichael, and carry the spirit of the mass of their people, as indicated by the name of the Negroes who were the cause, and that of an alien American, would be a more apt name. 

## RUSSIANS SEND JETS TO AID NIGERIA

### Air strikes likely

ABOUT 15 Soviet transport aircraft have landed at Kano Airport in Northern Nigeria, each carrying a Czech L-29 jet training plane, a being put together by Soviet technicians who flew in aboard the transport aircraft.

A Federal Government spokesman said that aircraft would gradually take a toll of Biafra's military operations. 




Kenya's Stephen Yanga (left) scores the opening goal for Kenya against Congo's Leopards.

The diplomats watched as the demonstrators waved the placards, with slogans like "Kenyanas are more civilized than the Chinese" and "Red Guards are behaving like hungry dogs".

### 'No need for you to come in'

The marchers asked for a delegation of five to be allowed in to hand over the protest note. One of the diplomats replied: "There is no need for you to come in. In fact, I do not know there is any ground for the embassy to receive a protest note."

The Nairobi KANU branch secretary, Mr. Samany Maitu, who was to hand over the note, told the diplomats that his group had sent a "peaceful delegation" to the embassy to hand over the note.

## N.F.D. OFFER STILL OPEN

WHEN KENYA GAVE NOTICE to Somalia in May that she no longer intended to tolerate armed aggression from across the border on the part of her people, it was made clear that the Kenya Government was prepared to extend the hand of friendship to the Mogadishu, Yaxshid and the Minister for Defence, Mr. Mungai, emphasised that Kenya's desire to return to normal, neighbourly relations is unchanged.

Unchanged, too, are the conditions which must be met before this desire can be realised. Kenya's offers were powerfully set out in Kenya's May declaration. Somalia was told she must renounce all claims of Kenya territory, must accept the High Commissioner of the N.F.D. Liberation Movement, halt the supply of arms and landmines to the Government, cease militia training camps; concede the right of Kenya Somalis to live in peace; conduct the Government to cease interference with neighbouring States, and join in co-ordinating the use of violence in the Horn of Africa.

Kenya is now urged that when these conditions were met she would be prepared to discuss the resumption of diplomatic relations, the removal of trade restrictions between the two countries, join in submitting a report to the O.A.U. that the dispute had been peacefully settled; and hold discussions on future co-operation to promote economic and social development on both sides of the border, particularly over such matters as water, communications and agriculture.



# Chojas proposed to uniform marriage law

**Standard Staff Reporter** Kampala. — The Hon. Albert M. M. Jaffer, who made a submission on behalf of the Khasia Shis 10th Supreme Council to the Commission on the Law of Marriage and Divorce, now sitting in Mombasa, said that it was appreciated that multiple social problems arose from the abuse or misinterpretation of customary, traditional or religious laws and this could give cause for serious concern to Governments.

Key effort by the Government to remove social evils from the marriage law to replace the existing Islamic law was not the right one. Customary laws behind them were not having any religious basis and were more dangerous in the case of Islamic law, which was an integral part of their religion and not found in ritual only. These laws could not be viewed as a threat because of serious concern to Governments.

**WILLING ENTRY**  
The community felt, therefore, that the best way would be to "let hundreds of flowers bloom." National unity and the same religious belief, why, therefore, was it essential that there be a uniform law of marriage and divorce applicable to all people in Kenya? The Hindu-Advent application of Islamic law was a sensitive and delicate issue and was not to be changed without destroying the religious faith of the community.

Mr. Jaffer went on to explain that all citizens should have the rights of women for 12 months in the event of non-payment of maintenance. As Mr. Jaffer said, the law should be uniform. African society has a long history of matrimonial law and has not completed these laws. The law should be uniform and have no religious basis.


