

KENYA WANTS CHINA: WE WILL GET IT BACK

Kenya demands safety for Peking Embassy

Kenya's Foreign Office has issued a strongly worded warning by the Kenya Government to the Chinese Government to "swift reciprocal action" if Kenya's Embassy and staff were not guaranteed maximum security.

It came in a protest Note from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, officially delivered to the Chinese Charge d'Affaires in Nairobi.

It said the Kenya Government would regard the continuation of demonstrations against Kenya's Embassy in Peking as "an unjustified act" and would hold the Chinese Government "fully responsible for the serious consequences that might befall Kenya."

The Note accused the Chinese Embassy of "indulging in blatant lies and trickery in order to provoke a breach of relations between the two countries."

The Chinese Embassy was accused of having been summoned to the Ministry yesterday by a Government spokesman who formally read to him the Government's ultimatum.

The Note stated that the Chinese Embassy was not supposed to start or revive such a "campaign of violence" directed against the status of the Republic of Kenya.

It charged the Chinese Government with continuing with its "policy of provocation" and "incitement" in Peking against Kenya's Embassy and staff.

Diplomatic norms ignored

Bid to attack Lagos from swamps fails

FEDERAL Nigerian troops claim to have beaten back a bid by Biafran troops to attack Lagos by sailing through a chain of lagoons and mangrove swamps.

The Federal troops were reported to have trapped Biafran soldiers assembling boats in creeks 140 miles east of Lagos. According to an unconfirmed report from trusted reliable sources, 200 Biafrans were killed or captured.

The swampy battle occurred near the town of Okinawa, only 24 miles by road south of the coastal town of Onitsha. The Biafran forces were reported to have taken place in the last few days.

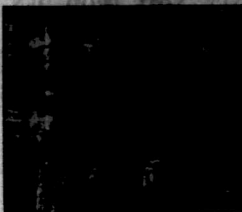

Kenya warns China 'stop hooligans or face the consequences'

THE following is the text of a protest Note which was officially handed over to the Chargé d'Affaires of the yesterday, after he had been summoned to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs at 11.30 a.m. The Chargé d'Affaires Embassy of the People's Republic of China in Nairobi refused to accept the Note.

The Government of the Republic of Kenya has learnt with utter disappointment that the Kenya Embassy in Peking has been subjected to organised and unruly demonstrations in the form of mobs carrying posters with derogatory references to the Government and people of Kenya.

They are also responsible for having broken the Kenya Embassy's windows and for causing malicious damage to property belonging to the Government of Kenya.

It is understood that the cause of the said demonstrations was an alleged motor accident involving a Kenya diplomat and two Chinese citizens.

Under normal diplomatic practice such an accident is dealt with through the established machinery in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the receiving State.

It is therefore, surprising to note that the Chinese Government has instead been dealt with by mobs in connivance with the Government of the People's Republic of China, contrary to the accepted norms of international practice, diplomatic decorum and civilised behaviour.

The Government of Kenya has been gravely and dangerously injured, infringing the principle of inviolability of diplomatic missions. It calls for the responsibility of diplomatic missions. It calls for the responsibility of the People's Republic of China to forthwith repair the damage to the Kenya Embassy in Peking and to bring the misdirected and malicious offenders to justice.

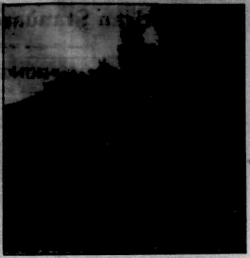

NEW SCHOOL TO AID THE HANDICAPPED

An almost completely new school is being built on the site of St. Nicholas Special School at Kileleshwa, Nairobi, for physically and mentally handicapped children. The school, which is to be called Kileleshwa Special School, will cater for handicapped children of all races between the ages of two and 17 years. It will replace the existing St. Nicholas and the Aid-Khan Special School which is situated in Lennox Road, Nairobi. These two schools have now amalgamated to provide more and better educational facilities for handicapped children. The existing St. Nicholas school is being completely renovated and extensive in-classroom, laboratory accommodations, a new dining-room and more religious recreation rooms, are being built. The Kileleshwa Trust has donated £25,000 to meet the cost of rebuilding the school. Mr. B. A. Bahakula said the new building will accommodate up to 50 day pupils and up to 70 boarders. The new school is expected to be completed by next April.

SABOTAGE FROM PEKING

IN CONFIRMING Peking is addressing a protest Note to the Chinese Government over the unruly demonstration against the Peking Government, the Chinese Government has shown considerable restraint. It would not have been surprising if Kenya's leaders had necessarily to take much more drastic action in view of the deplorable behaviour of the Chinese boat in Peking and Nairobi.

But as Kenya's sternly worded Note makes clear there are grounds for supposing that the Chinese have thereby indicated in blatant lies and trickery to provoke a breach of relations. It was to maintain cool self-discipline and to refuse to be goaded into the breach. In this way, it can satisfactorily put the full blame on Peking for sabotage of friendly relations.

The Communist Chinese cracked on the Kenya Government and particularly on the Vice-President, Mr. Mwangi Njiru, in a most abominable and unbecomingly courteous way to the extent of a Note delivered to the Government on Monday. In fact the Note had been requested. Kenya yesterday summoned Peking's Charge d'Affaires to receive a Note protesting vigorously against the Government's Embassy, and also issued a statement refusing China's wild allegations.

The full descriptions of the incidents in Peking and Nairobi would be regrettable evidence of the deaths to which the unprincipled and the deplorable behaviour of the Chinese dragging the long-established conventions of diplomatic exchanges.

Deedly unable to leaders

As Kenya's statement points out, what is really objectionable — and smaller — about Chinese tactics is the blatant attempt to represent that Peking does not consider the Government of President Kenyatta as fully representative of the people of Kenya.

This is manifestly inferred by the publicistic absurd warning that if the Government persists in its attitude against China you would be crushed before the Chinese and Kenyan peoples and again in the charge against Mr. Moi of causing discord in the friendly relations between the African and Chinese people.

No doubtless insult could be offered to the leaders of a popularly elected African Government than to suggest that they are unrepresentative of the people. It is a robbery outside China, a repudiation and prestige of President Kenyatta and his Ministers unless an endorsement will be undimmed by such an allegation as that they are unrepresentative of the people. It is not Kenya, but China.

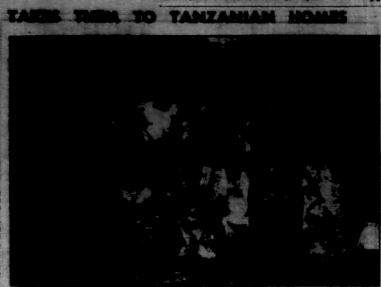

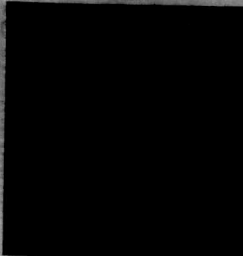

Mr. Abdulla expressed a hope that coffee from Bukoba might in future fetch a good market in Zambia which would be a boon to the East African countries.

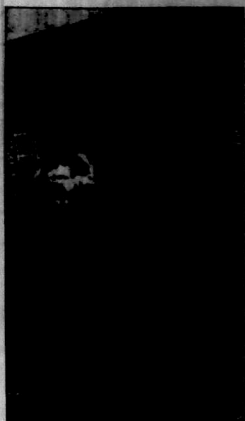

TEN YEARS OF "MERIDKA"

IN A WORLD riddled with crises, riots and plagues for a few moments a country that is firm and steady has emerged as a beacon of light to the nations of the East. The country in Malaya, which yesterday started a five-day festival to celebrate ten years of Merdeka (Independence).

The Malaya has cause for pride in its achievements. While many problems still exist, they have for the most part been solved. The country has made progress in many ways. Its economy has expanded and its industry has grown.

Malaya now is one of the highest standards of living in Asia and a country which has developed in the past ten years that of almost any other in the world. The price of its raw materials has risen, its rubber is selling at a high price, its tin is producing an economic gain to reduce its dependence on its developed countries but industry and other aspects of progress have been made.

There have been setbacks, of course, perhaps the most disappointing being the withdrawal of Singapore from the Malayan Federation. There are still dangerous Communist guerrillas on the Sarawak-Indochina border and the Malayan frontiers with Thailand and there is still some unrest in Sabah (formerly North Borneo).

Racial tension is another problem that persists in this mixed country. The Government has tried to settle this through a campaign known as "Operation Good Will" but there are fears that this will be conducted in the weeks of Malay as the sole official language of the Federal of Malaya.

The Alliance Government of Tunku Abdul Rahman, the 64-year-old Premier known affectionately as Bapa Merdeka (Father of Independence), has taken a firm line against subversion, but in other respects its policies have been notable for their flexibility. As a result Malaya has been able to achieve, despite all the efforts of Malaya's enemies, and foreign interests who are encouraged to put money into the country as necessary in a developing country.

As Malaya realizes some of its achievements but the threat of outside help and the pending withdrawal of British forces is causing a shadow over the expressed confidence in the future, which is symbolized by the anxiety of the current celebration.

A happy coincidence, news of Indonesia's decision to renew full diplomatic relations with Malaya and the Singaporean reached Kuala Lumpur on the eve of the independence celebration. Now that the Sukarno's imperialistic ambitions which were the Indonesia's Malaya to fear, have received their final blow the Indonesian Government has decided to end its relations with Malaya. The good wishes of Africa go with Malaya as she starts her second decade of successful independence.

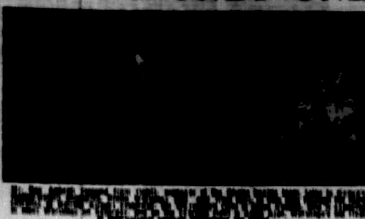

REVOLT AGAINST MILLS

The Agricultural Society of Kenya had spent a great deal of money in preparing the show at Princes Park, and this budgeted for a £200,000 loss, but attendance figures of around 30,000 will reduce this figure considerably.

The show's success has confirmed the A.S.K. intention to make it an annual event, and it can be expected to prove a money-maker next year. The most important fact is, how successful have been the show's results.

It was fortunate that President Kenyatta's visit coincided with the opening, and his presence and keen interest in the exhibition helped to stimulate the revival of Coast agriculture which has been in evidence in the past few years.

There is still much to be done to bring general farming in Coast Province up to the national level in many fields, however. This is shown by the figures for maize quoted by Mr. Kenyatta — the yields of two and a half tons an acre compared with the national average of five to six tons. There is obvious scope for improvement here and this can be achieved for maize and other crops if more farmers make use of the Government extension services available and apply modern methods on their own farms. Some improvement is called for in production of banana, sugar cane and even the tree crops, though these have always been the mainstay of the industry.

It is also fortunate that the show has shown the importance of even though coconut and mango grow well by the sea, a properly tended tree will bring more wealth to their owners and to the country.

There is still a serious problem of title land in the province, and of squatters. Last year squatters were settled on some of the 12 large farms declared multi-owner properties throughout Coast Province. The President's appeal, and the visible results of hard work being done on show at Princes Park, should stir Coast farmers to even greater effort.

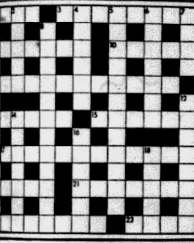

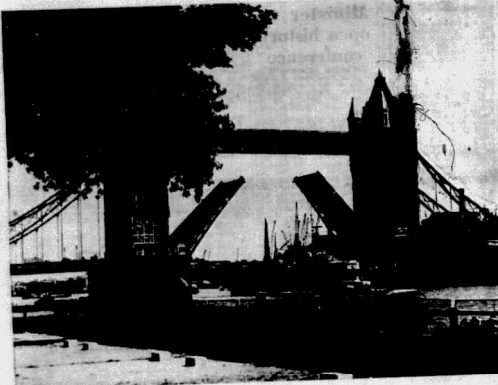


