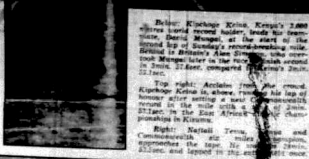

AMBIA WILL Mediate on Shifita Plan for Ministers to meet in Lusaka

Kenya Vice-President, Mr. Kapwepwe, has agreed to mediate in the dispute between Somalia and Kenya. It was reported in Kinshasa that both Kenya and Somalia had agreed to accept the mediation.

RESULTS FROM KINSHASA

KINSHASA MAY MARK a turning point for the Organisation for African Unity. A few weeks ago the Heads of State met there to discuss the crisis in the Congo, with the Congo again threatened by rebellion. President Mobutu's determination to proceed with the war has been fully justified by results.

Some harsh words may have been said in private session, but this is the first O.A.U. conference to have been held without major quarrels and walk-outs, and its tone has been serious and constructive. It is the first conference set up machinery for mediation in the border disputes between Somalia and Kenya, and between Ethiopia, but the Heads of State have grasped the giant tent of the Nigerian civil war.

The O.A.U. has also been seen to have been in the Congo in the light of the situation in that country.

In the direct governmental relations between Somalia and Kenya, the O.A.U. has been a catalyst in the sense that it has brought the two countries together in a way that has not been possible before. The Kenya-Somalia agreement calls for maintenance of peace on both sides of the border and for the cessation of hostile propaganda. These should be put into immediate effect, and measures should be taken to ensure that the remaining disputes are aware of the peace move.

Somalia can prove its sincerity by helping to spread the information and calling for a ceasefire.

Three demands by Federal ruler

In the course of Africa as a whole, the attempt by the O.A.U. to bring the Nigerian civil war to an end is even greater impetus, those who conflict carries within it the seeds of African disintegration. It is most encouraging to see that the Federal Government has refused the offers of a mission composed of members of the Federal Government, President Diouf, President Mobutu, President Abello and Gen. Agha, would have been harmful to the Federal case, which is a strong one.

Gen. Gowon has now wisely agreed to receive the mission, though without making clear whether he will go further and accept the offer to badge his insistence on three pre-conditions for a settlement. The ending of the Eastern Region's secession, the replacement of Col. Ojukwu as its ruler and the acceptance of the proposal to split the Federation into 12 States. Since it was the latter move, which sparked off the civil war, Biafra will resist this unwelcome attitude.

On the other hand, the Biafrans appear eager to negotiate a settlement. Much may hinge on what bargaining points they have to offer, and whether the O.A.U. mission is able to visit Enugu.

The case for mediation is a powerful one. Though the Federal forces appear anxious to have gained the upper hand there is no prospect of their early victory. Col. Ojukwu still appears firmly in charge in the East, and State plan, which cuts off the Biafra region from most of the oil they now control. It may therefore be necessary to reach a compromise by which Biafra returns to the Federation but its secessionary aspirations are given more autonomy.

It is interesting to note that the O.A.U. has demonstrated at Kinshasa that it has the will and the spirit to provide Africa with outside help. Africa's people must now show how they can follow the example of co-operation and determination set by their leaders.

OLYMPIC MISSION

MEMBERS OF THE MISSION sent by the International Olympic Committee to study South African sport in relation to apartheid have been "re-tensed" in Nairobi for the past couple of days.

Their leader, Lord Killybegh, is on record as saying that the South African Olympic Mission is a "dashed" affair because the South African Government has not been forthcoming in providing facilities in South Africa. The "dashed" part is because in many countries of Europe, "White" sportsmen are allowed to play for Black and White sportsmen, however good they may be, do not compete in the same division.

The official South African position has been described, at its origin in principle, by the Minister for Sports, Mr. Frank Erasmus, in a speech to the House of Assembly in Johannesburg. He is said to have "dashed" the hopes of those sportsmen who were "White" and those who were Black, by saying that the Government would not take place in South Africa since their mixed trials would take place in the country's basic rate of separate sport.

Apparently, the only alternative would be for White and non-White athletes to take part in trials outside South Africa, but the athletes' representatives, and it is doubtful whether the South African Government would agree, the chairman of the International Olympic Committee, Mr. Avery Brundage, would agree to have mixed trials held "behind closed doors". Starting through the way or the other, the mission will take place in South Africa since the selection of the team will rest with a liaison committee of White and non-White administrators under the chairmanship of the President of the South African Olympic Games Committee. Each ethnic group will have its own representatives to the selection and the national representatives will be chosen according to their individual form. They will also participate in the Olympic opening ceremonies in uniform suits and under the South African flag.

Indignation over 'stoops' label

To many outside observers, this will seem a devious way to circumvent the application of apartheid to sport inside South Africa, while giving the semblance of a compromise and multiculturalism to the world. Much of this is shown to show that, while Mr. Vorster has lifted some restrictive practices previously applicable to competitors, he has not gone as far as to allow for the removal of all hindrance to his opening the rigid racial barriers inside South Africa.

Sir Aida Ademola had something to say, before leaving Nairobi, about the attitude of other African countries to African athletes which should serve as a lesson especially to those critics who describe would-be African overseas competitors as "stoops of White people". African athletes in South Africa have to live with the conditions in their country, but are not less nationalistic in their attitude. Sir Aida Ademola said many African athletes are very indignant about being labelled "stoops" by people from African countries. Instead of uniformed athletes, their predicament should evoke genuine sympathy.

One of them, Humphrey Khwai, was quoted as being resentful of the cancellation of his participation in Kenya, though authority has been confirmed in South Africa. A team of boxers comprised in "stoops" would be useful for African countries dropped their ban against visiting athletes from Africa.
