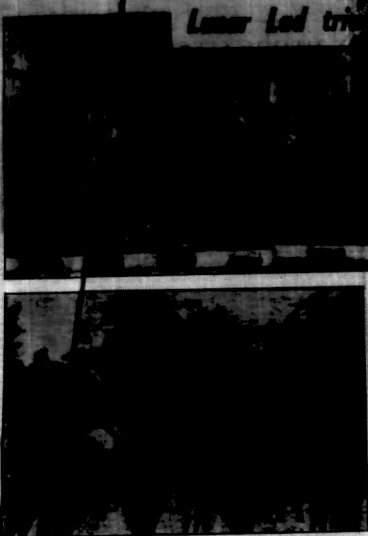

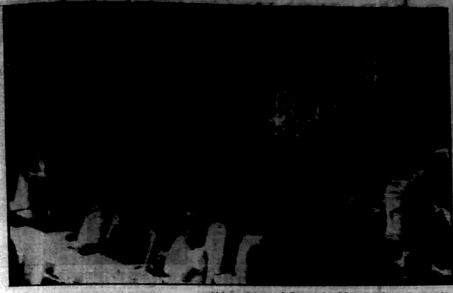

After enactment by Parliament, the Bill will come into operation at a date to be fixed by the Minister for Trade and Industry by notice in the "Kenya Gazette".

£500 fine or jail

The business of commission agent and manufacturer representative was included in the Bill's provisions. The penalty for trading without a licence, if the goods involved specifically authorised or if the trader was a foreign citizen, will be a fine of not more than £500 or imprisonment for one month.

People convicted may be prohibited from holding licences for up to a year and/or a year's imprisonment. Licensing officers will be guided by the principle that licences should be issued to a Kenya citizen, unless business area—these areas will be laid down by Kenya citizens and that specified goods to be dealt in by Kenya citizens.

'Six' worried over state of U.K. economy

The Common Market's Executive Committee today said it would be formally submitting to the British Government a 15-page report on the state of the U.K. economy and what might be done about it.

The report will be formally submitted to the Committee on Monday, which will then discuss it at its next meeting in Brussels. The committee says that only by direct negotiations with the four original member nations can the problems arising from their entry into the Common Community. "In any case," it says, "an adaptation of the British economy appears necessary."

Resolution that France was providing money to help the U.K. economy was agreed in Paris, where the British Ambassador, Sir Patrick Gordon-Lindsay, called on President de Gaulle. Only a few hours earlier the Common Market had rejected the proposal of the British Government to suspend the application of the rules of the Community. British and French papers kept alive the 27-year-old "Anglo-French" dispute.

"There was still a possibility of agreement," it said, "but it was not possible to reach an agreement with the U.K. on the terms of the report." The committee's report emphasized that the U.K. economic situation and her constant balance of payments deficits are likely to be a major problem in any entry into the Community.

The equalization which the economy of the United Kingdom is of a nature to raise serious difficulties for the assumption of the normal obligations required by the Community. In respect of the U.K. Government's financial position, the report said that the U.K. Government's financial position is such that it is not possible to work out the conditions of a transitional period, during which the U.K. economy would be able to re-establish itself in the Community. The report also stated that the U.K. economy is in a state of recession and that the U.K. Government is unable to meet its obligations to the Community.
