PROBABLY RE-EXPORT

The Somali Government has found itself with a surplus of cattle and in the new spirit of co-operation with Somalia we are taking them and slaughtering them in the Athi River for processing, he said.

The eventual sale of the meat would depend entirely on its quality, but Mr. McKenzie said it was likely that most of it would be tinned, probably for re-export.

Negotiations for the deal were first set on foot by the Kenyan consulate after the Kenyan consular in Nairobi, Mr. McKenzie, was sent from Kenya to Somalia. 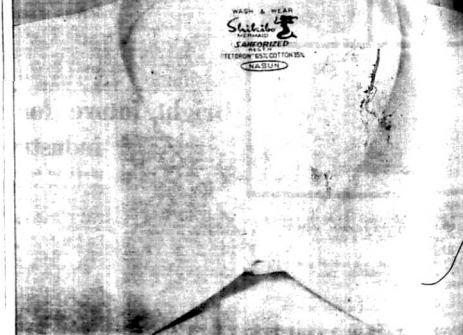

TANZANIA—The Government has issued a statement for the Minister for Agriculture regarding the arrival of the first shipment of 200 head of cattle.

Kenya's Minister for Agriculture explained that the agreement was reached to allow the Government to purchase 1,200 head of cattle for the purpose of restocking the country.

The cattle are being slaughtered to provide the most meat to the K.M.C. factory at Adisi River for processing. It is anticipated that the Government will purchase an additional 200 head of cattle for the purpose of restocking the country.

There will be no competition with Kenya ranchers because cattle from Somalia are of a lower grade, compared with the high-grade stock raised in Kenya for disposal through the K.M.C. to businessmen.

For some time, Somalia has been encountering difficulty in the disposal of surplus beef, while holding grounds have become overpopulated so the experiment will act as a relief measure. Otherwise, until plans materialize for its own canning factory, Somalia would have to rely solely on internal sales.

The agreement has much wider implications than merely handling tinnef beef, for it means the resumption of trading between the two countries, which has been totally banned by the Kenya Government since June, 1966. Here is a practical logon of the new spirit between the two countries, and the new attitude beginning at the O.A.U. conference in Kinshasa, when Kenya's Vice-President, Mr. Mbi, agreed with Somalia's Premier, Mr. Egal, on the 20th of the month. President Kaunda, to hold in Lusaka later this month.

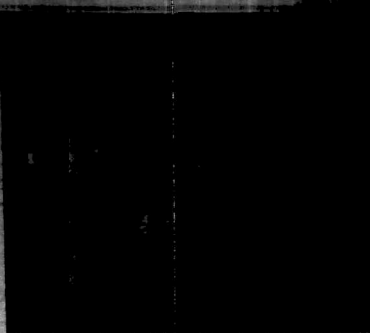

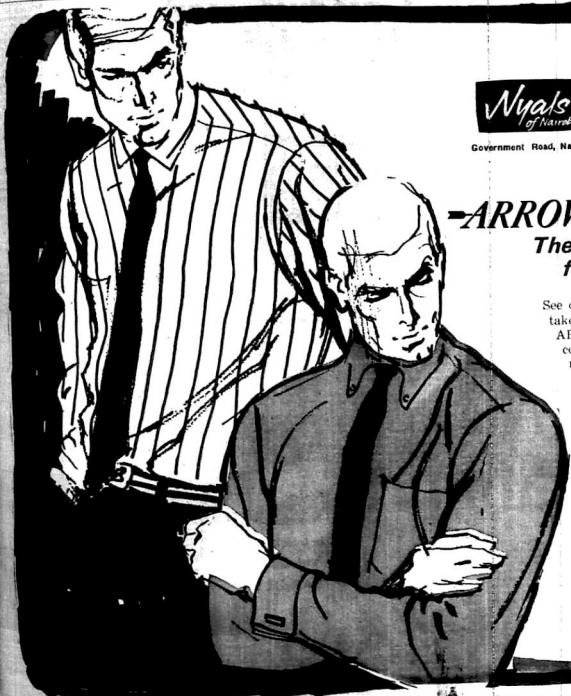

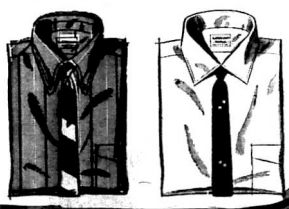

On President Kenyatta's part, his ready acceptance of the invitation, and his willingness to be invited, indicate his determination to undertake anything which holds the promise of settling this longstanding dispute.

Two years ago, talks on the same subject at Anasha regrettably proved abortive. On that occasion, President Kereve took advantage of President Obama's State visit to bring representatives of the two countries together. Let us hope for a better climate this time.

THIS YEAR'S 'Buy Kenyan' campaign will last for three months instead of one in order to gain more impact in the local area. Setting up such a committee might infer belief in monopoly. Mr. Kibaki refuted this charge, saying the Government did not feel monopolies were in the best interests of the country or the consumer, on the contrary, it believed in the spirit of competition.

Local industries, especially in their early years, need a measure of support against established foreign competitors, particularly from mass-production firms.

To succeed in the 'Buy Kenyan' campaign, the long term, the stimulation of manufacturers and merchants is essential. The public will cooperate as willing customers whenever Kenya goods hold the advantage in quality and price.

It is up to manufacturers to maintain high standards of competitive prices. New prisoners being built in Naivasha

A NEW prison, costing £250,000, is being built near Lake Naivasha and will be in operation next year. The new building will be about the same size as Kamukoko Prison which is the largest in the country.

Work on the building started in July last year. The population in the prison in the past 15 years has increased from 1,000 to 2,000. The new building will accommodate the increase in the national population.
