

# Kenyatta honours Ministers

## KENYATTA today confers the Order of the Golden Heart on all members of the Cabinet "in recognition of their perseverance and constancy in the stability and progress of the country since independence."

It is the second list of awards made by the President — the first, in which 84 people, including two civilians, were honored, was issued on Matarska Day this year. The list is contained in a special issue of the "Kenya Gazette."

There are three classes of the Golden Heart of Kenya. The first class is "for most conspicuous, outstanding and exceptional services to the Republic of Kenya" and is restricted to Kenya nationals and High Officials.

### For foreign nationals

The second, which the Cabinet Ministers now receive, is "for most conspicuous and outstanding" services to the country. This Order may also be conferred on foreign nationals such as Prime Ministers and Senior Ministers.

The third class is as far as Kenya nationals are concerned, for "most distinguished services," and is conferred on foreign Ministers and very important people of similar standing. Ambassadors and High Commissioners.


### ZAMBIA KEEPS EMERGENCY POWERS

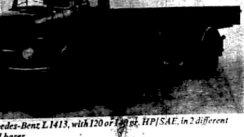

# Presidentia... highlight of Kenyatta Day

**PREPARATIONS FOR KENYATTA DAY** celebrations in Nairobi include a parade at Kamunjani which will be addressed by President Kenyatta at the end of the State House, a football match at Nairobi Stadium and races at Ngara.

According to a programme released yesterday by the Kenya News Agency, President Kenyatta will leave his Gatundu home at 9.50 a.m. tomorrow for Nairobi where he will preside on the boundary by the Nairobi area. Kumu vice-president, Mr. Kibaki, the Mayor, Mr. Ligonzo, and the chairman of Nairobi Kumu branch, Mr. Kihara Kabutu.

The President will arrive at the Muthiga roundabout at 11.30 a.m. where a State motorcade will be formed. On Mr. Kenyatta's arrival, the motorcade will leave on the route through the city.

The route from Muthiga roundabout will be by Fort Hall Road, Ngara roundabout, the Kijoko Mosque to the central line of Kenya Avenue, right into Government Road and then left into Duke Street and left into Jervoise Street to Kumu headquarters.

## STOP TO GREET DIGNITARIES

At Kumu headquarters the President will stop and greet dignitaries and officials of Kumu, after which the motorcade will follow Halle Sclausse Avenue to Land-nor Road, Sakwa Road and direct to the State House.

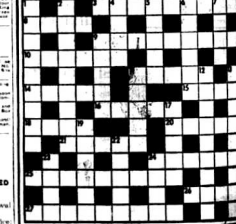

Having started from the top, in the Services and politics, no doubt the next lists will bestow honours somewhat lower down the scale, for very many ordinary people sacrificed heavily to win the struggle for Uhuru and have since served Kenya with distinction. The President's leadership has been an inspiration and his example has kept rival personalities together, but two who were with him at Kampanga were absent yesterday, having joined the opposition. Looking around him at the milling throng, and the ring of Ministers and Kanu officials, the President must be regretted finding them on the "other side". He remains a man who was the only people who could truly claim to be freedom fighters in the K.P.U., a party which, he commented again, could be crushed by Kanu.

A.R. rockets sink Israel warship

Israeli rockets fired from Egyptian ships sank an Israeli ship, the 2,500-ton Eilat, near Fort Said at the weekend, Israeli officials said.

150,000 PUT UNDER PRESSURE ON PENTAGON

President Johnson signed a bill yesterday banning demonstrations "unsanctioned by authorities" outside the American Congress, after 150,000 anti-Vietnam war demonstrators had marched on the Pentagon.

More than 200 demonstrators had been arrested by midnight as police and troops straggled to contain the vast crowd - estimated at 150,000.

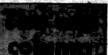

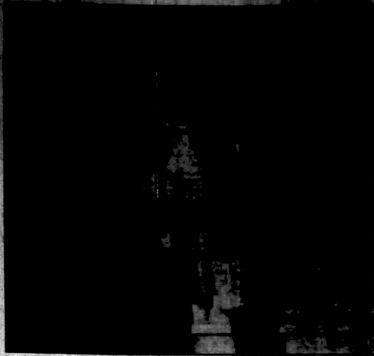

#### Scramble for a mud patch

So what are President Johnson and his advisers trying to achieve? Hundreds of young Americans are dying, thousands of miles from home, in a scramble for a muddy patch of Asia.

How can Mr. Johnson justify that? The answer, of course, is that America is trying to contain the Communists, to prevent the South Vietnamese from being subjugated by an alien creed. But how long is it since there was a truly democratic Government in Saigon? In South Vietnam there can be no Communist Government. It is the will of the North to do worse than that in the South.

If the United States pulled out from South Vietnam the country might go "free", but it would not be the aid of the world. And if America did withdraw, the North Vietnamese might be more inclined to negotiate with the country's determination to continue the struggle and end its energy victims.

But the North Vietnamese will not give an inch until the Americans withdraw and they will not be beaten even if the U.S. bombing is stopped up to their eyes. Only at the weekend the Hanoi Defense Minister, Gen. Nguyen Chiep, said over the French in Indo-China — reiterated his country's determination to continue the struggle and end its energy victims.

# Israel under pressure to strike back

Government was under mounting pressure yesterday for reprisals for the sinking of an Israeli destroyer off the Sinai Coast.

As some of the men who died in the destroyer were buried in cities and towns across the country, the Press echoed the theme: "This act of aggression cannot go unpunished."

Most Israelis regard a counter-blow as inevitable and see the sinking of the destroyer Eilat, with the probable loss of 51 lives, as a new Egyptian challenge to Israel which must be accepted.

## Only one answer

Typical of the angry reaction in Israel to the attack was this comment in the Jerusalem Post: "It was a cold-blooded, premeditated affair - little, if anything, short of murder."

The newspaper, *Masruva* said: "The Egyptians have made their choice: an unprecedented act of grave aggression. They can be only one answer to that. Another newspaper, *Yedioth Ahronot*, said the sinking of the destroyer proved that Egypt wanted to carry on the war by rules convenient to herself.

## SINKING SPEEDS UP U.N.

The sinking of the Israeli destroyer Eilat spurred diplomatic efforts yesterday to seek and aqppose retaliation in the Middle East.

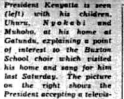

## ALLY SAYS PRETORIA CABINET IS UNFAIR

**SOUTH AFRICA'S** race policies in the labour field have been criticised by one of the Pretoria Government's strongest African allies in the country, James Mpanza, Chief Minister of the Transvaal, said at a meeting of his National Independence Party in East London this morning. He said that his people had to depend on the dictates of petty officials in the class where they were allowed to work.

The Russian presence in Port Said probably rules out an air raid, though the Egyptians are reported to be taking precautions by increasing the number of civilian aircraft, as also from Lammaia and Hama on the open flank in the Red Sea. If retribution is sought, the first retaliated air raids are being flown by the Egyptian Air Force, indicated by broadcasts.

Since the disastrous war, Russian radar equipment has been installed, as well as rocket launchers and anti-aircraft defences, so that the country is impervious to the kind of surprise aerial offensive which paralysed the Egyptian Air Force on the first day of the war.

Instead of bombing or bombardment tones from positions on the east banks of the canal, it seems more likely Israeli aircraft will strike at Egyptian naval units on the open flank in the Red Sea. If retribution is sought, the first retaliated air raids are being flown by the Egyptian Air Force, indicated by broadcasts.

However, the Egyptian naval vessels could be withdrawn from the Red Sea out of range to the south, as some have been moved from Port Said to the relative safety of Alexandria.

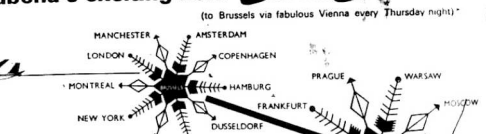

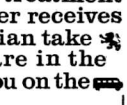

The electoral provisions in the Constitution are clear. The General Election which sent Kanu to power with a thriving majority lasted for 18 months and a Government in office for a term of five years expiring in 1968. At that time, Kenya had bicameral system. Presently, the Senate and the House of Representatives were amalgamated to form a Chamber, by popular assent. The effect of the constitutional change prolonged the life of the National Assembly by two years, with the next General Election due in June, 1970.

The Senators were most intimately affected among the elected representatives, having been returned for periods expiring in successive years to 1971. As the Senate was amalgamated with the House of Representatives, some arrangements had to be made for those Senators whose terms lasted beyond 1968. Therefore, it was equitable that the life of the National Assembly be extended.

Although the Constitution allows the present National Assembly to continue until June, 1970, the ruling party, under the leadership of Mr. Jomo Kenyatta, the leader of the party in power has the prerogative of choosing the date for a General Election.

Mr. Wilson's Administration in Britain, elected for a five-year period in 1964 on a very small majority, lasted just over a year when he felt the Labour Party had a good chance of reelection with a bigger majority. He asked the Queen to dissolve Parliament and the result of the General Election was a landslide victory for the Labour Party.

President Kenyatta is inclined to call for a General Election at any time he may choose, depending on his assessment of the situation. But only when the National Assembly is dissolved or the Government is defeated on an important matter of principle amounting to a vote of no-confidence, can a General Election take place.
