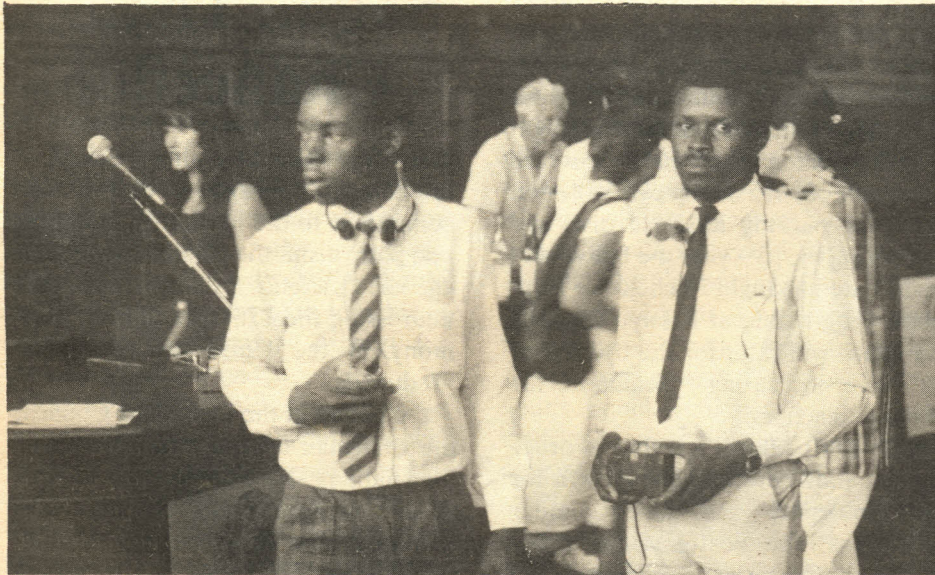
of Nairobi to enable them host the congress.
