

UNIVERSITY SAYS 'NO' TO U.S. STUDENTS

THE University of Nairobi does not recognise the curriculum programme of the United States International University at Nairobi campus.

This was said yesterday by Registrar Mr. E. N. Gicuhi in response to a speech made by the director of the US university in Africa, Dr. William Lacey, who told a Press Club luncheon on Tuesday that the USIU had approached the Kenya Government to allow students who studied in Nairobi to complete their studies in the University of Nairobi.

The Registrar said that for admission purposes, the University of Nairobi only recognised the

curriculum programmes being used in Kenya high schools or other institutions with equivalent programmes in other countries.

"Therefore, prospects of students from this American university completing their studies at the University of Nairobi are very remote and indeed unacceptable," Mr. Gicuhi said.

"It should be noted," he said, "that according to the University of Nairobi Act, 1970, the University Senate is the sole judge as to who shall be admitted and enrolled for a course of study. To our knowledge, this subject has not been raised with this body."
