1. Brief Introduction of the Department

The Department of Pharmacology and Pharmacognosy is one of the three departments within the School of Pharmacy, University of Nairobi. The Vision of the Department is to be a centre of excellence in teaching and biomedical research. The objectives of the Department are to teach Pharmacology and Pharmacognosy to undergraduate students of pharmacy; build capacity in traditional medicine and biomedical research through post-graduate training; to provide specialized clinical and laboratory services; and to carry out basic and applied medical research.

The Department has 16 members of academic staff with diverse areas of specialization. These are as follows: (3) Professors, (1) Associate Professor, (3) Senior Lecturers (5) lecturers and (4) tutorial fellows. In addition, the Department has a team of technical staff comprising of (1) Principal technologist, (1) Chief technologist, (2) Senior technologies and two technicians. Other staffs include a department secretary, (1) Junior Technologist, two animal attendants and (1) messenger. The Department has two sections i.e. Pharmacology and Pharmacognosy.
