These are the words echoed by Dr. Eddah Gachukia, one of Kenya's longest serving and respected educationist, during the relocation ceremony of the White Peace Pillar from Kongi's Square to the Great Court, outside Education Building, Main Campus. The Peace Pillar was planted in 1985 by delegates during the 3rd United Nations Decade Conference for Women held in Nairobi as a symbolic reminder of the need to be peaceful. The Peace Pillar was being relocated to pave way for the commencement of construction of the proposed university towers.

During the ceremony, organized by the <u>African Women's Studies Centre</u> and the <u>Department of</u> <u>Literature</u>, guests were taken through the journey that culminated into the Forum 85 in Kenya that hosted over 4,000 women from all over the world. The Conference which was held at the University of Nairobi was given the mandate to seek new ways to overcome the obstacles to achieving the decade's goals which were equality, development and peace. At that time, Dr. Gachukia was the Head of the Department of Literature and the Chairperson of the Women's forum in Nairobi.
