The lecture, which was organized by the University of Nairobi's <u>Centre for Advanced Studies in</u> <u>Environmental Law and Policy</u> (CASELAP) touched on the Rio +20 Conference's themes on a green economy in the context of sustainable development poverty eradication and the institutional framework for sustainable development.
