# DIRECTORS REPORT ON THE ACTIVITIES OF WANGARI MAATHAI INSTITUTE FROM APRIL 2010 to APRIL 2011

#### Introduction

I wish to thank the Distinguished Chair, Prof Wangari Maathai for her personnel involvement which contributed immensely to the success of most of the activities described in this report. I am also grateful to all the Board members for their support, without which the milestones achieved would not have been attained. I am particularly grateful to Wanjira Maathai, Prof Njenga Munene, Prof V. Mbaya and Karanja Njoroge for being available for consultation on day to day basis. Through the team effort the Institute has been able to achieve the following activities in the last one year.

#### Development of the strategic plan

Members you are aware of the dictum that says "You can't get lost if you don't know where you are going". The institute embarked on a strategic planning process in June last year and I will table the 2010- 2020 in this meeting. WMI endeavours to pursue the following five strategic objectives in the delivery of its mission during the first five years.

- Improved the societal values, ethics and attitudes towards the environment
- Greater effectiveness in environmental management practices

- Enhanced environmental resource management that upholds peace and improves livelihoods
- WMI becomes an icon of the best environmental practices
- Creation of new and improvement of existing policies that provide for sound environmental practices.

However, as we seek appropriate synergies between these initiatives and the Institute's priorities, we will remain responsive to powerful ideas emerging from the experience in the field, extension research, and from communities in the campus and across the country. This readiness to embrace and support initiative will always be vital to our development as an Institute devoted to comprehensive environmental excellence. It is therefore imperative that a plan such as this remains 'a work in progress' even as it is being implemented, to allow sufficient flexibility to enable us to respond effectively to emerging challenges and initiatives.

What remains now is to implement the activities as specified in the implementation matrix. We shall look into the matrix with and objective of identifying "quick wins" during this board meeting.

#### **Design Competition:**

Architectural designs competition to construct the green Campus for the Wangari Maathai Institute for Peace and Environmental Studies (WMI) was completed on 16<sup>th</sup> February 2010. The Green Campus is envisioned as a functional and inspiring hub of activities in the natural resource management area and education for sustainable development and must be particularly appealing in its esthetics and environmental considerations. The Campus is envisaged to be self sufficient in terms of lighting, energy, waste management and water requirements.

The Cape Town based firm of architect's dhk, won the competition to design the Green Campus. The winning design was unveiled by Dr Achim Steiner, Executive Director of UNEP accompanied by Dr Reuben Mutiso, Chairman of the panel of international jurors and other jury members at a successful awards ceremony held at

the national Museums of Kenya. I am grateful to Dr Idle Farah, the Director General, National Museums of Kenya for providing an exhibition area for pin up, and Louis Leakey Auditorium for the public launching ceremony.

#### Visit to USA

Wanjira Maathai and I visited Princeton University, Princeton, USA on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2010 where we held discussions with Katharine Burks Hackett and Holly P. Welles, Princeton Environmental Institute; David S. Wilcove, Woodrow Wilson School; Daniel J. Linke, University Archivist and Curator of Public Policy Papers, Seely G. Mudd Manuscript Library; and Daniel I Rubenstein, Director of African Studies. As a result of our visit Daniel Linke promised to assist in the archiving of Prof Maathai Papers. Daniel Rubenstein also made a reciprocal visit to the Institute in November 2010 in which he offered to support two students recommended by the Institute to attend a course on evolution of mammals at Mpala Research Station. Daniels and Margaret Kinniard, Executive Director, Mpala Research Station have also agreed to sponsor the two students to carry out their projects at Mpala Research Station. The two students Vindonyi Mwanyumba Hillary and Martha Ngala Chizi) are already in the field.
