- * transfer and licensing or commercialization of IP
- * any applications for the transfer, or licensing, of the UoN's rights;
- * the amendment of IP Policy and all matters pertaining to intellectual property administration, management and dissemination;



ADVISE/EDUCATE



the innovators, inventors, breeders, creators Researchers Administrators, Industrial representatives, Society



FUNCTIONS...



- Receive disputes arising from the terms or implementation of IP policy
- * Provide guidance in setting up new companies by the UoN innovators or using UoN innovations
- * Process ALL IP types & Promote technology transfer
- * Receive all innovation, creation, invention or new plant varieties **disclosures** and process the same in a timely manner;


