Dr. Mary Njenga delivered a Seminar on Multiple Perspectives of Biomass Energy and the Role of Research and Development at Wangari Maathai Institute for Peace and Environmental Studies on 26th November 2014. Mary Njenga, is a Post-doctoral Fellow in Bioenergy at World Agroforestry Centre. She holds a PhD in Management of Agroecosystems and the Environment of the University of Nairobi, where she studied fuel briquette technologies and their implications on greenhouse gases and livelihoods in Kenya. Her doctoral work was also affiliated with the World Agroforestry Centre, the Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences, and Michigan State University. Njenga has received fellowships from African Women in Agricultural Research and Development, the Norman. E. Borlaug Leadership Enhancement in Agriculture Program, and Agropolis Fondation, as well as support from the International Development Research Centre. Dr. Mary Njenja is a visiting lecturer with the Wangari Maathai Institute for Peace and Environmental Studies at the University of Nairobi, where she contributes to programs in sustainable clean energy, the environment, and women's empowerment. She is also an Adjunct Assistant Professor in the Department of Geography at North Illinois University.
