United Nation University (UNU) which is administering Japanese Ministry of Education program to encourage Japanese graduate students to conduct field research in Africa as per Japanese government scheme to develop closer relations with Africa, send one of their students to Kenya to carry out a research.

They (UNU) made request through Prof. Okelo Odongo the director of the school of Computing and Informatics of University of Nairobi for a student from **Japan Advanced Institute of Science and Technology** by the name Mr. Hideaki Konno to conduct his research for three months as from January to April.
