Ideal training sites should have adequate volumes and case mixes, available and supporting faculty, residency training committees, supporting administration and availability of critical care beds. Leadership should be embedded in all curricula. A follow up meeting will be held on the 24<sup>th</sup> of March 2015 at which a draft document on role and qualifications of a program director will be presented for debate and adoption. The March meeting will also explore mentorship, training environment and resident/faculty evaluations.
